

Attorney General Butterworth referred your May 24 letter to me concerning Florida Power Corporation's fuel adjustment rate increase. I certainly understand your concerns.

As you know, the Commission opened a docket to examine all aspects of the extended outage at Florida Power Corporation's Crystal River 3 Nuclear Unit. This examination included the consumer rate impact. The Commission sought input from all interested persons on the specific actions and circumstances that led to the shut-down of the unit on September 2, 1996.

The Commission held customer hearings on May 20-22 in Florida Power Corporation's service area. The Commission allowed interested persons the opportunity to offer testimony concerning the company's rates, service quality, and the current outage at Crystal River 3 Nuclear Unit.

The increases in Florida Power Corporation's fuel costs resulted from the need to purchase fossil fuel to replace more efficient generating capacity from the Crystal River Nuclear Plant. The additional costs are approximately \$12 million per month during the summer and \$10 million per month during the winter. At the February 1997 fuel cost recovery proceeding, the Commission voted to take a middle ground in allowing only a portion of these replacement fuel costs to be recovered from customers. The extreme positions were to defer recovery until after an investigation and hearings were completed, or to allow the full recovery of costs.

On June 26, 1997, the Public Service Commission approved a settlement agreement between Florida Power Corporation, the Office of the Public Counsel and all other parties who were part of the Crystal River Nuclear Outage. The settlement requires FPC to cease its collection of the increased fuel adjustment charge associated with the Crystal River Unit and refund the approximately \$16.4 million already collected. This refund will result in a one-time

credit of approximately \$5.40 on the average customer's bill of 1,000 kilowatt hours.

However, the agreement further requires that after the Crystal River Nuclear Unit is returned to service, FPC will be allowed to collect approximately \$33.8 million of the \$170 million in replacement fuel costs. This amount represents the costs attributed to replacement fuel for September, October and November, 1996, and will be collected over a 12-month period.

In addition, the agreement requires that FPC's base rates be frozen at current levels for the next four years, and the parties agree not to petition the PSC for a reduction in FPC's rates during that time. The agreement does not prevent the PSC from initiating a rate decrease docket.

The Public Service Commission is the regulatory agency that tries to maintain a balance between the utilities and consumers in Florida. It's an important balance to maintain. We are not an advocacy agency for consumers or for the utility.





I regret that I am prohibited by Florida law from commenting on the merits of dockets pending before the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission). However, I can provide you with insight on procedural matters regarding this docket.

The increases in Florida Power Corporation's fuel costs to replace generation from the nuclear unit are approximately \$12 million per month during the summer, and \$10 million per month during the winter. At the February 1997 fuel cost recovery proceeding, the Commission voted to allow a portion of these replacement fuel costs to be recovered from customers. This is the established procedure for fuel cost recovery proceedings and has been in place in Florida for many years. In addition, fuel cost recovery is a widely-accepted regulatory tool in the United States. The practice is employed by nearly all of the states which regulate utilities, by municipal electric utilities, and by the Federal Regulatory Commission. The partial recovery is subject to refund with interest depending upon the outcome of an investigation initiated by the Commission.

A hearing is scheduled for June 26 and 27, in Tallahassee, at which the parties will present evidence to support their respective positions as to the specific actions and circumstances that led to the shut-down of the unit on September 2, 1996. The parties participating in the hearing are Public Counsel, Attorney General, and Lake Dora Harbour Homeowners. On August 5, 1997, the Commission will make its final determination on the cause of the outage. If the Commission determines the Company's actions were not prudent, customers will be provided a full refund, with interest.



Dear Chairman Johnson:

I am writing to elaborate on my comments made in the recent customer service hearings in this case and on the motion to expand discovery time filed yesterday by the Lake Dora Harbour Homeowners Association, Inc. I consider these comments "procedural only" and not contrary to the ex parte provisions of Section 350.042, F.S., but I am copying all parties to this docket nonetheless.

Former Commissioners Joe Cresse and Jerry Gunter often stated that they might get reversed on the substance of their decisions, but that they were not going to give any party a basis for having them reversed on procedural grounds. It was a wise precept and one that should be observed in this case by ensuring that all parties have adequate time to prepare their cases.

By any standard, maintaining the June 26 hearing now scheduled in this case will not provide adequate time for case preparation for any party, but particularly customer intervenors. This case involves a large, highly complex piece of equipment and FPC's management of it over the course of ten years or more. The economic stake is huge at some \$160 million or more. It is going to be a highly controversial case with no room for procedural errors. Providing adequate time for discovery and other preparation is essential to an unassailable procedural record, even if some would push for a faster decision.

Some might be tempted to think a June hearing, closely following the controversy of the customer service hearings and the highly critical newspaper editorials, could pressure the Commission into a quick fuel disallowance to placate the public. I don't share that view and wouldn't want a "friendly" decision if it were based on a record

legally inadequate to pass Florida Supreme Court review. Commissioner Clark correctly noted that the Florida Supreme Court standard for sustaining a Commission disallowance based on "mismanagement" is extremely rigid. A "quick" victory for consumers will be meaningless if it is reversed a year later. It is better to try this case just once and do it right the first time.

I am confident that the Commission wants to be thorough in its handling of this case and that you "want to do it right." "Doing it right" means providing sufficient time to fully develop the record, which, in turn, necessarily requires that the current schedule be enlarged. I think five to six months, at a minimum, are required, but would suggest reference to the schedules of prior, comparable cases at the Commission, and the needs of the parties prior to making your decision.

My clients are not prepared to risk losing the entire case (16 months of replacement fuel) in exchange for seeing the recent fuel adjustment increase hurriedly eliminated. Their view is that the prudence of the initial outage (NRC compliance, etc.) requires another five or six months of preparation, while the second issue of the utility's prudent management of the outage's duration (critical path scheduling, etc.) cannot be evaluated until several months after the restart of the unit. Whether FPC should be allowed to continue to collect replacement fuel costs, and at what level, prior to a determination of prudence is an issue the Commission needs to resolve. Absent specific "interim rate" type statutory authority allowing increased fuel adjustment rates prior to a final Section 120.57, F.S. decision, the Commission should closely examine, especially in view of this case, whether it can impose such a burden on the customers. While that issue is extremely important to the public and needs to be answered, the major thrust of this letter is to urge you not to rush to judgment on the entire case on the basis of an inadequate record merely to give relief on the "interim" fuel adjustment increase.

I had also suggested that more active Commission staff participation would benefit the public interest. I still think that is the case. You, the Commissioners, sit as the "hearing officers" in this case and are quite capable of weighing the evidence, evaluating the credibility of the witnesses, and carrying out the other responsibilities necessary to your final decision. Your staff's role should be larger than just neutrally examining the evidence presented by the parties and serving you as "pre-judges" through their recommendation. Your staff has too much talent and experience to play such a limited role. If the Commission increases the time for discovery in this case, I would encourage you to direct your staff to more fully participate by stating its professional conclusions on the outage through the affirmative testimony of one or more staff witnesses. Such testimony would then be subject to cross-examination, as are the opinions of the other parties. Absent such participation, we are likely to witness the less than satisfactory process of staff trying to make its case by the placement of its "evidence" in the record during the cross-examination of the other parties' witnesses.

You have frequently been quoted that the staff was going to conduct an "independent investigation." The public was clearly disappointed when the time for staff testimony passed with nothing being offered. I believe a more pro-active role on the part of your staff, coupled with an enlargement of time to prepare, would serve to improve its public image, while enhancing the public's confidence in the Commission.

Thank you for your letter of May 19, 1997, regarding the procedure to be followed in this case and the scope of the Commission's investigation. Pursuant to Section 350.041(2)(f), Florida Statutes, I am precluded from making any public comment regarding the merits of any proceeding under Section 120.57, Florida Statutes, that is currently pending before the Commission. I can however, discuss the procedural aspects of a proceeding.

This docket is currently scheduled for a formal hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, on June 26 and 27, 1997. Florida Power Corporation (FPC) and the Office of Public Counsel have pre-filed testimony according to a schedule that was established in late February. Several requests to intervene (the Attorney General, the Florida Consumer Action Network, and the Lake Harbour Homeowner's Association) are pending. All parties to the case, as well as Commission staff, will have the opportunity to cross-examine witnesses and introduce documentary evidence, subject to the provisions of Chapter 120, Florida Statutes.

After the hearing, all parties will be afforded the opportunity to submit briefs, addressing the evidence and the applicable law. The Commission staff will then submit a written recommendation based on its analysis of the briefs and the evidence. The Commission will vote on the staff recommendation and can accept, reject or modify that recommendation based on the Commission's view of the evidence.


The Commission staff has been actively investigating this outage since late February. To date, the fifteen staff members assigned to this docket have logged approximately 2,000 hours in this review. The activities pursued by staff include: 1) Visits to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) repository library at Crystal River, as well as obtaining public information from the Internet;

2) Attending public meetings between FPC and NRC officials at the plant; 3) Conversations with NRC officials and former FPC employees; 4) Reviewing the Preliminary Report on the outage filed by the company; 5) Conducting a public workshop on the Preliminary Report; 6) Conducting discovery consisting of 44 interrogatories and 41 requests for production of documents served on the utility; and 7) Reviewing all the testimony and participating in all the depositions held to date. At this point, more than 100,000 pages of documents are in-house and under review. More discovery is anticipated.

I believe the actions being conducted by staff are quite different from what has been advertised. I assure you that the PSC is committed to investigating the nuclear outage in a manner that is fair and equitable to all parties, particularly the citizens of this state. As always, this agency welcomes questions and input from the people's elected representatives. If you would like to discuss this matter further, please feel free to contact me.

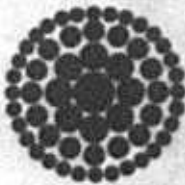
I would be interested in your reply specifically in relation to the details of this particular issue.



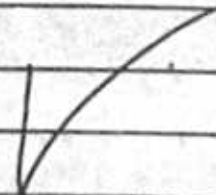

1 STATEMENT OF A. PARKS HONEYWELL

2 BEFORE THE FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

3 MEETING IN CLEARWATER, FLORIDA May 21, 1997

4 My name is A. Parks Honeywell. Since September, 1989, I have lived at 785
5 Island Way, Clearwater, Florida 34630. I have worked my entire 39-year career in the
6 nuclear power industry, both in reactor plant design and in reactor operations. I am
7 now retired. I am very concerned about the engineering and operations at Crystal
8 River³ and its potential impact to rate payers in the Florida Power Corporation service
9 area.

10 When I learned of the decision taken by the Public Service Commission on the
11 recent rate increase, I decided to familiarize myself with the specifics of the case. I
12 contacted the Commission Chairman Johnson and also Florida Legislative counsel,
13 Jack Shreve. As a result, I have taken the time to review over many days this enormous
14 filing by Florida Power consisting of a ten-inches tall stack of paper, weighing 23
15 pounds. (How a non-engineer could wade through this stuff I can only imagine.) This
16 material provides Florida Power's viewpoint of what led to the current outage, NRC
17 reports containing stinging concerns with Florida Power's operation and engineering of
18 the plant, and several pieces of written testimony by hired guns paid by the utility to
19 say that Florida Power's actions were proper and the NRC negative findings against
20 Florida Power are not relevant to the rate case. I am not pleased by what is contained in

1 this incredible filing. I will try to briefly summarize the pertinent parts.

- 2 1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission is a tough, not very flexible,
3 somewhat adversarial regulatory agency which is predisposed to make
4 nuclear power plants ever safer as the state of technical knowledge is
5 improved. After the Three Mile Island accident, the NRC instituted many
6 new requirements on existing power plants, most of which had to do with
7 maintaining emergency core cooling. This resulted in the need to back-fit
8 older plants such as Crystal River-3 with cooling system additions and
9 changes, more reliable sources of backup power to run the cooling
10 systems, and a variety of other associated requirements.
- 11 2. Florida Power opted not to make such extensive changes as most other
12 nuclear utilities did, believing it could develop short-cuts or work-around
13 fixes, such as re-rating its emergency diesel generator for greater load,
14 changing operating procedures, etc. Even with these fixes, Florida Power
15 knew it was dangerously close to limiting conditions of operations spelled
16 out in its Technical Specifications. These are the basis for its license to
17 operate. Florida Power chose not to develop more traditional fixes to the
18 problem as a contingency plan, and did not continually monitor the
19 emergency total load on the EDG, saying that it was too complex to
20 calculate until more powerful desk top computers were acquired.

- 1 3. Florida Power estimated the probability of occurrence of an accident that
2 would need all these emergency systems and concluded that it would be a
3 once in 11 billion years, a very low number. But Florida Power did not
4 have enough conviction to ask NRC to change their license to receive
5 more reasonable treatment. Perhaps this was because of what the NRC
6 said about their engineering department.
- 7 4. The Florida Power engineering department did not have adequate
8 resources (or adequate management attention to get adequate resources).
9 NRC commented to Florida Power that the engineering workload was
10 falling behind and made a chilling remark that engineering did not
11 adequately understand the design basis for the plant and "errors of
12 significance were identified in engineering work.". They further observed
13 that over five hundred outstanding requirements for engineering actions
14 were in their engineering backlog, including many 3-5 years old. It is
15 clear that an engineering staff overcome with backlog and criticized by its
16 licensing agency for failing to understand the plant was not in a position to
17 pro-actively turn its attention to avoiding limiting conditions of operation
18 of its license, much less being able to engineer contingency plans for an
19 outage in the event of exceeding those limits. Review of letters to the
20 NRC reveals that frequent managerial changes were made in the

1 engineering department, thus compounding the problem through causing
2 loss of continuity.

- 3 5. Florida Power found itself in the current outage initiated by a relatively
4 trivial breakdown, a lube oil system failure on its main turbine generator.
5 During the shutdown to fix that problem, the staff finally completed its
6 calculations on the EDG loading which revealed the EDG slightly
7 exceeded its design capacity rating for a very brief time during a
8 hypothetical accident. Despite the fact that the EDG manufacturer said the
9 generator was capable of handling this transient load for the required time,
10 the limiting condition of operation of the license was exceeded, requiring
11 the plant to remain shut down. With no basis for an argument prepared to
12 submit, Florida Power then had to: 1.) Decide what technical course of
13 action to take, 2.) engineer hardware changes, 3.) procure long lead time
14 hardware, and 4.) hire contractors to install these changes. Because they
15 had not anticipated the possibility of a major outage at this time, the first
16 three items were not done before the plant was shut down. That means
17 that perhaps three-quarters of the cost of purchasing replacement power
18 was avoidable had they had a good contingency plan and engineering
19 solutions "already in the can."

20 On the basis of the 23 pound submittal, I conclude that Florida Power shares a

1 major responsibility to the rate payers in the extended (and yet unknown) length of this
2 outage. The several days necessary to fix the turbine lube oil system is an
3 understandable and allowable cost. The balance of the outage could and should have
4 been avoided by taking a more pro-active position with the NRC, but Florida Power
5 could not do this because of its lack of engineering resources and lack of credibility
6 with the NRC. At the very least, the rate payers should not have to pay for replacement
7 power purchased during the portion of the outage now being spent with planning,
8 engineering, and procurement. A management concerned with developing contingency
9 plans and minimizing costs would have had this portion of the job already done before
10 the outage.

11 These technical issues now being faced are not new to the industry. Florida
12 Power knew that all other utilities had eventually taken this course of action. Florida
13 Power knew they were close to not getting away with their short-cut work-around
14 solutions and took no contingency steps to minimize the risks of their decisions.
15 Accordingly, I do not feel that the rate payers should be saddled with the cost of this
16 outage which could have been avoided or minimized by prudent management attention
17 to the clearly understood industry issues.

IN THE CONFINES OF NORMAL BUSINESS AMERICA, INEFFECTIVENESS IMMEDIATELY PRODUCES NEW MANAGEMENT. IN EVERY BUSINESS THAT I KNOW OF, EXCEPT FOR LARGE MONOPOLIES, IF YOUR EQUIPMENT BREAKS DOWN, OR IF IT NEEDS MAINTENANCE, OR WHATEVER - YOU, THE BUSINESSPERSON PAYS FOR THAT COST OF DOING BUSINESS. IT COMES OUT OF YOUR BOTTOM LINE. I HAVE DONE THIS FOR YEARS AS A BUSINESSMAN, AND I DARE SAY THAT I CAN PROBABLY SPEAK FOR 99% OF ANYONE IN THIS AUDIENCE WHO WAS IN BUSINESS.

IT IS TIME FOR THESE HUGE CORPORATIONS, THESE MONOPOLIES, TO OPERATE WITHIN THE SAME BUSINESS STRUCTURE AS THE REST OF CORPORATE AMERICA, BIG OR SMALL, AND I WOULD EMPHASIZE MAKING THEM DO IT LIKE THE LITTLE GUY, WHICH OF COURSE WOULD NEVER HAPPEN BUT WOULD CERTAINLY BE NICE.

We wish to let the Commission know that we oppose any increase in our electric rate by Florida Power Corp. and we request the Public Service Commission to provide the customers with a rebate on the increase that was recently approved without a thorough investigation of the matter.

The executives in charge of the Power Company have mismanaged the Crystal River Nuclear plant for many years. They have ignored the recommendations of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the recommendations of engineers from other Nuclear facilities in our country.

Mismanagement in the past and at the present time is responsible for the financial woes facing Florida Power. Therefore, management should be held responsible and the stockholders should be the ones to bear the costs associated with the outage, not the customers.

The cost of getting the Crystal River Plant back on line is climbing into the hundreds of millions of dollars. Yet the Company rewarded Chairman Jack Critchfield with a \$1.7 million pay increase and President and Chief Operating officer Korpan with a 22.6% raise to \$1.2 million, in spite of all the financial problems the company faces.

Engineering deficiencies are the responsibility of the Company's executives and workers.

Please, commissioners, protect the public from unfair rate increases. Your Commission did not conduct any independent investigation before allowing Florida Power to raise their rates recently. And Florida Power is considering another request to raise rates in the fall of this year. Any increase in rates, which are the highest in Florida already, will cause financial difficulties for millions of working families and retirees on fixed incomes. This is unfair because they are not responsible for the problems at the Crystal River plant.

Thank you for your kind attention to this very important matter.

Ladies and Gentlemen of the Commission

Good Evening

I am the Purchasing Agent for the District School Board of Pasco County; however, I am here to speak on behalf of all school districts across the Florida Power Corp. service area.

My school district has 45,000+ students and a staff of over 5,000 teachers and support personnel, and like most other Florida schools, students are now being housed in overcrowded classrooms and overcrowded portables. Most are making do with one computer where there should be ten or more; we are short on textbooks, teaching materials, technology, and just about any other resource you might care to name. And despite what you might have heard, our salaries are pale in comparison to those with like positions in the private sector.

My school district has levied the maximum tax millage allowed by law for several years and we're currently in the process of requesting that impact fees be levied on new construction in order to help with our capital needs. Our borrowing capacity is tapped out, and we've committed future revenues for quite a long duration just to build enough schools to avoid double sessions and relieve some vastly overcrowded schools in high growth communities.

We've become progressively more frugal in everything we purchase, and contrary to public opinion, there's little waste that could be converted to meeting other needs. We have for example, created an energy management committee to reduce utility costs. Since it's inception some 3 years ago, we have realized over \$2 million in avoided costs. Our electric bills today are lower than they were fiscal '92-93, despite the fact that we added 2 new elementary schools, a new middle school, about 100 portables, and added 50,000 square feet to existing facilities. The Florida Solar Energy Center has publicly stated that our program is the most aggressive in the state.

About 6 years ago, we opted to put a number of our schools on the Interruptible Rate in order to save electricity costs. Through this endeavor we've enjoyed a reduction of over \$250,000 in billing costs; however, one must remember that nothing comes without a potential risk . . . we face the real possibility every winter and summer that we may have to send children home from school because we have been interrupted and do not have power for lights or HVAC!

Over the years, Florida Power has been a good neighbor and supporter of our school system. Most recently, they provided vests for our school energy patrol teams and recognized several school teachers for their efforts in developing a thematic unit called "Envirogize." Their staff has worked hand-in-hand with us to take advantage of the DSM rebates, and generally, we are pleased with their services and corporate policy.

However, some 6 years ago, on behalf of 40+ governmental units, I stood before The Commission as an intervener in the FPC rate case when they had requested an increase of over \$100 million dollars annually. Unlike many other interveners in that case, our group recognized that FPC's earnings did need some adjustment and we supported an increase. The only real issue was "how much"? We believed then, as now, that they deserve a fair rate of return, provided plants are run efficiently.

The question before us today, however, really is not a rate of return question. It's who should pay for years of gross mismanagement at the Crystal River Nuclear Plant. There is ample evidence from the NRC that many of the plants problems were created from poor management decisions. It appears that Power Corp. must have agreed with this assessment given that they've recently changed management teams at the plant, hiring at least two renowned nuclear experts. But, even with the change of personnel, the NRC again cited them recently for failing to follow guidelines on proper security of operations manuals.

Not wanting to believe that things were as bad as the NRC indicated, you, the FPSC, ordered staff to perform another study that was supposed to take place ASAP. Given that the results of this study have not been revealed, if even conducted, must lead one to the conclusion that nothing can be added to the NRC report. Add to this, Chairman Johnson's comments that she really could not find adequate justification to allow the rate request, and voted for it anyway, leads one to wonder why we even have a public service commission. I'd rather take my chances in a competitive environment rather than have rates be imposed on a rubber stamp basis.

Adding insult to injury, a day or so following approval, Florida Progress raised its dividends to stockholders. CEO Critchfield's compensation rose by a whopping 16%, making his total earnings package worth over \$1.7 million. His salary alone would buy almost 50,000 textbooks or 1200 computers! Due in part to the recent rate increase, stockholders received a dividend of 52 cents a share, while the School Board wrestled with the question of where the money was coming from to pay the bill.

The impact of this unfair hike to the Pasco County School District exceeds \$95,000 a year; the impact to all school districts across their service area is over \$3 million with every dollar being taken from an already underfunded system.

Each one of you has an obligation to do what's fair and just to the rate payers as well as the utilities. Your failure to live up to this commitment in this case means that you value dividends and outrageous salaries over the needs of school children across Florida. It means that not only today do children have less of an opportunity than yesterday, but there's even less money to afford equal opportunity tomorrow.

On behalf of every taxpayer and student in the State, I urge you to reconsider this action and reverse your decision.

Dear Chairman Johnson:

I am writing to elaborate on my comments made in the recent customer service hearings in this case and on the motion to expand discovery time filed yesterday by the Lake Dora Harbour Homeowners Association, Inc. I consider these comments "procedural only" and not contrary to the ex parte provisions of Section 350.042, F.S., but I am copying all parties to this docket nonetheless.

Former Commissioners Joe Cresse and Jerry Gunter often stated that they might get reversed on the substance of their decisions, but that they were not going to give any party a basis for having them reversed on procedural grounds. It was a wise precept and one that should be observed in this case by ensuring that all parties have adequate time to prepare their cases.

By any standard, maintaining the June 26 hearing now scheduled in this case will not provide adequate time for case preparation for any party, but particularly customer intervenors. This case involves a large, highly complex piece of equipment and FPC's management of it over the course of ten years or more. The economic stake is huge at some \$160 million or more. It is going to be a highly controversial case with no room for procedural errors. Providing adequate time for discovery and other preparation is essential to an unassailable procedural record, even if some would push for a faster decision.

Some might be tempted to think a June hearing, closely following the controversy of the customer service hearings and the highly critical newspaper editorials, could pressure the Commission into a quick fuel disallowance to placate the public. I don't share that view and wouldn't want a "friendly" decision if it were based on a record

legally inadequate to pass Florida Supreme Court review. Commissioner Clark correctly noted that the Florida Supreme Court standard for sustaining a Commission disallowance based on "mismanagement" is extremely rigid. A "quick" victory for consumers will be meaningless if it is reversed a year later. It is better to try this case just once and do it right the first time.

I am confident that the Commission wants to be thorough in its handling of this case and that you "want to do it right." "Doing it right" means providing sufficient time to fully develop the record, which, in turn, necessarily requires that the current schedule be enlarged. I think five to six months, at a minimum, are required, but would suggest reference to the schedules of prior, comparable cases at the Commission, and the needs of the parties prior to making your decision.


My clients are not prepared to risk losing the entire case (16 months of replacement fuel) in exchange for seeing the recent fuel adjustment increase hurriedly eliminated. Their view is that the prudence of the initial outage (NRC compliance, etc.) require another five or six months of preparation, while the second issue of the utility's prudent management of the outage's duration (critical path scheduling, etc.) cannot be evaluated until several months after the restart of the unit. Whether FPC should be allowed to continue to collect replacement fuel costs, and at what level, prior to a determination of prudence is an issue the Commission needs to resolve. Absent specific "interim rate" type statutory authority allowing increased fuel adjustment rates prior to a final Section 120.57, F.S. decision, the Commission should closely examine, especially in view of this case, whether it can impose such a burden on the customers. While that issue is extremely important to the public and needs to be answered, the major thrust of this letter is to urge you not to rush to judgment on the entire case on the basis of an inadequate record merely to give relief on the "interim" fuel adjustment increase.

I had also suggested that more active Commission staff participation would benefit the public interest. I still think that is the case. You, the Commissioners, sit as the "hearing officers" in this case and are quite capable of weighing the evidence, evaluating the credibility of the witnesses, and carrying out the other responsibilities necessary to your final decision. Your staff's role should be larger than just neutrally examining the evidence presented by the parties and serving you as "pre-judges" through their recommendation. Your staff has too much talent and experience to play such a limited role. If the Commission increases the time for discovery in this case, I would encourage you to direct your staff to more fully participate by stating its professional conclusions on the outage through the affirmative testimony of one or more staff witnesses. Such testimony would then be subject to cross-examination, as are the opinions of the other parties. Absent such participation, we are likely to witness the less than satisfactory process of staff trying to make its case by the placement of its "evidence" in the record during the cross-examination of the other parties' witnesses.

You have frequently been quoted that the staff was going to conduct an "independent investigation." The public was clearly disappointed when the time for staff testimony passed with nothing being offered. I believe a more pro-active role on the part of your staff, coupled with an enlargement of time to prepare, would serve to improve its public image, while enhancing the public's confidence in the Commission.

**PSC SHOULD REVIEW/RESCIND
FPC RATEPAYER INCREASE**

The Florida Public Service Commission should reopen its approval of the request by Florida Power Corporation to pass along to its customers added costs occasioned by the outage of the Crystal River #3 nuclear power plant. The approval was initially granted, apparently, without the performance of due diligence. As a result, ratepayers are paying an addition \$2.22 per month per thousand kW-hr "fuel adjustment" from April through October 1997, plus a \$1.67 per month per thousand kW-hr direct pass-through of other costs, starting April 1. The fuel adjustment is said to change in October to an unspecified value.

Florida Power acknowledges making management changes to insure that violations of Nuclear Regulatory Commission regulations, which occurred during the period from 1994 through 1996, do not recur. In addition, the NRC is not allowing the operation of CR-3 until modifications to its emergency safeguard system are completed. Based on a continuation of Florida Power's 1996 sale of 33.5 trillion kilowatt-hours power, the above charges imposed for six months will produce \$65 million in revenue for Florida Power. This is conservative, since the company acknowledges that its retail electric power sales are growing at 2.9 percent per year.

FPC stated on May 12 that it estimates additional operations and maintenance expenditures for nuclear facilities of \$80 to \$100 million in 1997, and additional capital expenditures for CR-3 of \$40 million to \$55 million.

Florida Progress Corporation, the parent company, recently raised its dividend, as did FPL Group and TECO Energy, two other publicly-owned Florida power companies. But FPC stock yields 6.9 percent now, compared with 4.2 percent for FPL and 4.8 percent for TECO.

Publicly-held companies compensate their executives well, to reward them for good performance. However, the base salary of Florida Progress's CEO rose 14 percent this year to \$675,000 (at \$3.1 billion in sales), compared with \$660,000 for the 87 percent-larger FPL (\$5.8 billion sales), and \$525,000 for the comparable Carolina Power & Light's CEO (\$3.1 billion sales). Duke Power's CEO's salary is \$695,000, for \$5 billion in sales. Both CP&L and Duke have more nuclear generating plants than FPC does.

It is not clear that the ratepayers should be shouldering the major part of the added expense caused by CR-3 being off-line until the end of the year, when the shareholders have a dividend return nearly 44 percent higher than from TECO and 64 percent higher than FPL. The president of FPC (and new CEO, effective 1 June) received a salary of \$536,000 in 1996, up 21.8 percent from 1995. With salary, bonuses and long-term compensation payouts, the chairman of FPC received \$1.7 million and the president received \$1.2 million in 1996. The bonuses increased by 30 percent in a year when the nuclear plant was in serious trouble. It is not clear what performance these bonuses were rewarding.

A shareholder proposal to limit executive salary increases to 3 percent per year unless shareholders approve a higher rate was presented at the annual meeting on April 17. Not surprisingly, management opposed the proposal.

H.R. 687, *Income Equity Act*, was introduced in the Congress by Rep. Martin Sabo (D-MN) on Feb. 11, 1997. This bill would cap the deductibility of executive compensation at 25 times worker pay.

Dear Ms. Clark:

I am sending this letter to you, and to the Chairman and the other Commissioners, in the hope that someone will understand the significance of my encounter with Florida Power Corporation.

Last Tuesday, May 20, a Florida Power technician came on my property and destroyed my electric meter socket. He then told my wife that we would have to call an electrician to repair the damage before service could be restored. The technician was not there at our bidding; he was there because my next door neighbor had a problem with his service. The technician did not even bother notifying us that he would be shutting off our electricity.

My wife and I both talked to Florida Power representatives on the telephone, and we both got the same story: Florida Power was not responsible for the actions of its employees. We were told to hire our own electrician, pay him, then submit the invoice to Florida Power. I talked to Mr. Anderson in the claims department, and he told me that they would "probably" reimburse us. The word "probably" is important. I asked Mr. Anderson what criteria he would use to evaluate the claim: he could not, or would not, tell me.

Later the same day, I reached an area supervisor. After considerable badgering on my part, he agreed to call the electrical contractor who repaired the damage and have the invoice sent directly to Florida Power. Assuming that Florida Power pays the bill, this ends my problem, although not without a considerable expense of time and effort.

The question is this: Can Florida Power come on your property, even if you

have not called them, destroy some part of that property, and then refuse to repair the damage? If you or I or another individual did the same thing, we would be subject to criminal penalties. In fact, had I been home at the time, I would have called the Sheriff's Office and filed a criminal complaint against Florida Power, sure that I had been the victim of a scam.

And I was the victim of a scam. How many other people in Florida Power's service area have experienced the same reckless disregard for property, and then failed to understand that they could submit a claim, or had a claim denied? We have a lot of elderly people in this area, and they are used to getting fair treatment from public utilities. Florida Power is not playing fair.

Should this matter come before the Public Service Commission, and I hope it will, Florida Power will claim that meter bases are the property of the homeowner, and that they should not have to be responsible for defective equipment. In fact, up until January of this year, Florida Power furnished meter bases, free, to any homebuilder. Virtually all of the meter bases in the Florida Power service area were supplied by them, and it is far too late for them to claim that any of this equipment is substandard.

As I noted earlier, my complaint against Florida Power has been resolved. Yet I am concerned, as you should be, about others in this State who pay out their retirement checks to pay for Florida Power's mistakes. In the larger picture, is not Florida Power applying this same rule to the Crystal River plant? Any problems they cause cannot be their fault: the customers of Florida must pay!

Thank you for your consideration. If it would be helpful to file a formal complaint, please let me know the procedure. I would be happy to contribute my time and effort to end this tyranny.

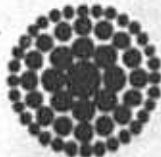

For your information, Florida Power Corporation did go to Mr. Conner's home on May 20, 1997 in response to his neighbor's complaint of voltage problems on an underground service. The serviceman found that the neutral was failing and as is our practice, in order to temporary the service until a crew could come to make permanent repairs, the serviceman attempted to connect to Mr. Conner's ground in his meter. When the serviceman pulled Mr. Conner's meter, the socket came out of the meter base.

The serviceman told him he would have to contact an electrician as Florida Power Corporation does not normally repair meter bases. Mr. Conner initially called the Customer Service Center at 11:41 a.m. asking to speak to the supervisor of the employee involved. He wanted a commitment that Florida Power Corporation would pay the electrician bill with no questions asked.

I subsequently talked to Mr. Conner about 1 o'clock and gave him the information to submit the bill to us as a claim. Again, Mr. Conner wanted 100% commitment that the entire bill would be paid sight unseen. I told him that I would need to review it.

Mr. Conner had been advised by the line foreman that the meter base repairs were now the responsibility of the customer. I had advised him that since the employee was on the site when the problem occurred, in all likelihood we would pay it.

I subsequently talked to the line foreman who called the electrician and indicated that we would pay the electrician direct.

This is in response to your May 25, 1997, e-mail regarding your complaint against Florida Power Corporation (FPC). The Commission's staff contacted FPC and confirmed that the company will pay the cost of repairing the damaged meter base. This payment will be made directly to the electrician doing the repair work.

Normally, meter base repairs are the responsibility of the customer. However, because of the circumstances surrounding this event, FPC has agreed to make payment. Additionally, we want to advise you that FPC does have right of access to your meter to conduct utility business including meter reading and maintenance.

With regard to your comment about the Crystal River Unit #3 outage, the Commission is currently investigating this matter. The Commission recently concluded a series of five customer service hearings throughout FPC's service area. In addition, the Commission is scheduled to hold a technical hearing in Tallahassee on June 26-27, 1997. The Commission's staff is scheduled to file its recommendation on July 24, 1997. The Commissioners are scheduled to vote on the matter on August 5, 1997. I will place a copy of your e-mail message in the correspondence file for this docket. 

Dear Ms. Johnson:

I am writing this letter to offer my assistance and to participate in the Commission's investigation of Florida Power Corporation's pending rate increase. I do not believe that the utility rate payers should have to shoulder responsibility for the Company's mismanagement of the Crystal River Nuclear plant. My name is David Fields and I was formerly employed as a Nuclear Shift Supervisor at the nuclear plant. I was centrally involved with, but not responsible for, activities at the plant in 1994 which subsequently resulted in a 500,000 dollar fine levied by the NRC in 1996. Since I was fired in 1995 I have dealt directly with the NRC to bring to light serious safety concerns and allegations of mismanagement. It was my allegation that the plant's emergency diesel generators were being operated in an unsafe manner which has lead to the plant being placed on the NRC's "watch list" of troubled nuclear power plants and the NRC's announcement March 13, 1997 of 14 major violations. I believe that I am uniquely qualified to participate in the Commission's investigation. I was an insider who supervised a shift of operators who had raised a safety concern which had been ignored by utility management. My records of allegations and NRC correspondence, I believe, will benefit your investigation.

During the summer of 1994, my shift raised concerns about Management's demand that the High Pressure Safety Injection system be operated with high hydrogen pressure. My operators were concerned that this critical safety system would not perform when required during a loss of coolant accident. Our concerns were not given serious consideration and were closed out in September 1994. My shift then performed an evolution which demonstrated that the plant's response did not follow the predicted limiting operating curve. We presented our conclusion in a Problem Report to Management. Our results clearly showed that the plant had been operated in an unsafe manner for over a year. Management and the NRC both focused upon my shift's activities rather than the safety significance of the results. Management never performed an adequate investigation and continued to blame me and my operators for activities 'inconsistent with good operating practice'. In May of 1995, Sr. Vice President P. M. Beard wrote a letter to the NRC placing all blame on the operators and totally ignoring the fact that the plant had been operated non-conservatively for over a year prior to our evolution and that Management had ignored our safety concern. I responded to the NRC with my own letter presenting my side of the story on May 23, 1995. After poor performance appraisals and demotions, I was fired in August of 1995. Just one week later I was given the opportunity to present my story the NRC's Office of Investigation. Five months later I presented my case to NRC Region II officials in Atlanta.

These meetings provided me the opportunity to raise serious allegations of mismanagement. The NRC recognized the significance of these allegations when they issued their Notice of Violation and 500,000 dollar fine to Florida Power Corporation in July 1996. Central to the Notice was the overall cause as a failure of Management Oversight. As far as I and my shift were concerned, the NRC concluded that 'no action was warranted'. I am presently working within U. S. Department of Labor regulations to appeal my termination.

In November 1994, the NRC reviewed the previous year's operating history and recognized a disturbing trend. FPC Management responded by creating a Management Corrective Action Plan (MCAP). This study and subsequent administrative changes were created to reassure the NRC that plant management was aware of all problems and that changes would be in place to recognize and prevent any further degradation of plant safety. Rather than accept any management responsibility, their focus was to blame groups within the plant staff. MCAP concluded that no safety systems were degraded after their exhaustive review.


During the spring of 1996, I became aware of modifications to safety systems which adversely affected the emergency diesel generator's ability to function. These modifications were made with management fully aware that Technical Specification limits would be exceeded. I presented my concerns to the NRC in the form of an Allegation. FPC also had the opportunity to identify this serious breakdown of modification procedures during the same time period. Internal safety concerns were raised at the plant concerning the diesel generators. Management again failed to recognize a valid safety concern and closed the issue. The NRC investigation validated my allegation and uncovered the fact that nearly all safety systems had been improperly modified over the years and the plant's margin of safety had been severely diminished. The NRC concluded that the plant was not safe to be started up. The subsequent investigation also concluded that the nuclear plant should be placed on the 'watch list' and all problems identified and corrected before the plant would be allowed to operate. The NRC has stated that the Management Corrective Action Plan has been a failure and that plant performance has even degraded since MCAP was created.

I have attached copies of my allegations concerning the nuclear plant since August 1995. These allegations have never been released to the public. The NRC has evaluated each claim and nearly all have been substantiated. When allegations are investigated, they are usually discussed in an official Inspection Report and the origin of the allegation is never discussed. As far as FPC management is concerned, the NRC has been tenacious and very successful in uncovering management and safety weakness' at the plant. In fact, many of the findings and violations uncovered have originated with me. The NRC does have a large investigative staff of engineers and inspectors and they have often expanded far beyond my original allegations. In the case of the diesel generators, the NRC has now determined that all of the major safety systems at the plant are degraded. I believe that my documents show that an independent investigator, the NRC, has found substantial merit in my claims. I have not included the NRC evaluation of each of my allegations and the plant Inspection Reports. I am anxious to discuss these other documents and my correspondence with the NRC with your staff. Many of the allegations are technical in nature and cannot easily be summarized in a letter.

It is not my intention to prevent start up of the nuclear plant. There are hundreds of dedicated employees who are anxious and capable of returning the plant to safe operation. I support the new management team's efforts to make substantial changes in hardware and policy. I cannot, however, support FPC's claim that they deserve an 88 million dollar rate increase. FPC has not fallen victim to circumstances and equipment failures. The decisions that plant manager's made over the past several years and their intimidation of employees who identified problems have directly resulted in the plant's shut down and increased regulatory scrutiny.

Please call or write me for any additional information. I would prefer to participate in person with your staff's investigation. I believe that the documents and correspondence that I have discussed will present a very different perspective of FPC management claims. I am available to participate at any time.

This is to acknowledge our receipt of your June 5, 1996, letter addressed to Mr. Bruno Uryc of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). In your letter concerning activities at Florida Power Corporation's Crystal River facility, you referred to the Statement of Concerns for allegation number RII-95-A-0096 and provided clarification. You also requested that we stop providing copies of correspondence between you and the NRC to the attorney, Mr. Bruce Morris. We will no longer place Mr. Morris on distribution for our correspondence with you. In addition, you provided new information which includes concerns about three more recent events that have occurred at Crystal River nuclear Plant.

Enclosure 1 to this letter is a revised Statement of Concerns for allegation number RII-95-A-0096 incorporating your comments. (Revisions were made in bold type.) With respect to new information, we have opened another allegation case number RII-96-A-0155. A separate Statement of Concerns is provided in enclosure 2 to track these concerns as we understand them. We have initiated actions to develop and examine the facts and circumstances of your concerns. Therefore, if we have misunderstood or mischaracterized your concerns as described in the enclosures, please contact me so that we can assure that they are adequately addressed prior to the completion of our review. Once we complete our review, will inform you of the results.

Enclosure 3 covers the NRC policy on identity protection of individuals who express concerns to the NRC.

(REVISED)

- A. Florida Power Corporation knowingly withheld or failed to provide complete information regarding management's failure to respond to your (and others) safety concern regarding the Make-up Tank Overpressure Limit curve.
- B. Florida Power Corporation knowingly permitted or encouraged the conduct of unreviewed, non-proceduralized tests on at least four other occasions.
- C. Florida Power Corporations' Employee Concern Program failed to resolve or evaluate safety concerns you submitted on two separate occasions.
- D. Crystal River Unit 3 supervisory and management personnel failed to resolve safety concerns about the Make-up Tank Overpressure Limit curve proactively in order to comply with Florida Power Corporation senior managements' directive concerning dissolved Hydrogen concentration. *
- E. Crystal River Unit 3 engineering staff failed to conduct an adequate review to determine if the Make-up Tank Overpressure Limit curve was correct and conservative.
- F. Florida Power Corporation inappropriately required a dissolved Hydrogen concentration based on industry information that was not applicable to the design of Crystal River Unit 3. Further, management required the plant to be operated at the specified dissolved Hydrogen concentration level although this requirement had not been properly analyzed and incorporated into plant procedures.
- G. Florida Power Corporation management failed to timely report a condition found outside the design basis of Crystal River Unit 3 within one (1) hour as required by 10 CFR 50.72.
- H. Florida Power Corporation engaged in discriminatory employment practices.
- I. Florida Power Corporation provided incomplete and inaccurate information to the NRC regarding management culpability in the Make-up tank unauthorized test.
- J. Many plant operating curves and procedures were erroneous because they had not been updated to reflect the 1981 power upgrade.
- K. Control room instrumentation is not adequate to provide operators with positive indication of Make-up Tank level during an accident sequence.

- L. Florida Power Corporation stated in a December 2, 1994, letter to the NRC that the reactor operators had been counseled by Greg Halnon subsequent to the September 5, 1994, Make-up Tank evolution, but that discussion never occurred.
- M. The plant was operated outside it's design basis for months due to management's direction that operators operate high on Curve 8. **

STATEMENT OF CONCERNS

- A. Statement made by Florida Power Corporation (FPC) manager to the NRC that "other" evolutions were necessitated by "operational reasons" is false. The ALLEGER stated that the Hydrogen regulator MUV-491 opened, by the old Curve 8, at approximately 70 inches. There was no "operational reason" to drain the make-up tank (MUT) to 55 inches. This was merely a MUT manipulation not required by plant conditions.
- B. FPC management demonstrated their inability to react to situations where procedures and equipment are not in place. An example of this had to do with January 9, 1996, main condenser tube rupture. The ALLEGER stated that rather than initiate a reactor trip and initiate Emergency Feedwater to supply clean, chloride free feedwater, the plant was shutdown and cooled down over the next 55 hours. During that time, salt water leakage was as high as 50 gallons per minute. The concern was salt water intrusion and potential steam generator tube degradation. The ALLEGER contends that FPC management made the decision to feed salt water when other alternatives were available. Furthermore, there are no valid procedures in place to manage the large amount of radioactive water leaking into the secondary system for a postulated primary tube leak or rupture.
- C. Non-conservative decision made by operators in allowing the plant to operate rather than trip the reactor. This occurred during the week of May 20, 1996, when the plant experienced transient conditions after the newly installed governor valves rotated and damaged feedback circuitry to the integrated control system. The ALLEGER stated that in responding to this event, the operators placed the control system in manual and attempted to chase the symptoms, rather than making a conservative decision to trip the reactor. The ALLEGER went on state that FPC management is not capable of transmitting a clear expectation to plant personnel and, strongly believes that employees are afraid that management will punish employee decision making in an arbitrary manner.
- D. After discovering that the Emergency Diesel Generators (EDGs) will exceed their design rating when called upon to block load during an ES (Emergency Safeguards) signal, FPC management and Engineering have made the decision to allow the design basis to be exceeded. ALLEGER contends that this acceptance places the EDGs at risk of failure. The margin of safety is reduced and according to the ALLEGER, the EDG vendor wrote a one sentence reply to the plant which said the diesel would survive a one-time, five second event. The ALLEGER questioned whether it is acceptable to expect diesel failure on its second block loading start.


