In response to your request, I am providing the following information regarding the District's policy on the reuse of reclaimed water.

The District encourages the reuse of reclaimed water for appropriate uses, since reuse helps conserve Florida's limited natural potable water resources. By reusing reclaimed water, water users can save many millions of gallons of potable ground water which can then be used for other necessary purposes such as for drinking and other household type uses. The volume of water reused is significant and amounts to approximately 101 million gallons each day in the St. Johns River Water Management District alone.

The District's policy, as codified in our rules, is to require the use of the lowest acceptable quality water available whenever such use is economically, environmentally, and technically feasible. As such, the District will require the Wekiva Golf Club, Sabal Point Country Club, Sweetwater Oaks Country Club, Lake Brantley Plant Corp, and all other users to use reclaimed water when reclaimed water becomes available so long as it is feasible as described above. The consumptive use permits for the above projects all have permit conditions that include the above requirement.
