Re: Effluent Reuse Workshop

Due to the emergency fire situation in Flagler County and recent evacuation, I cannot attend the effluent reuse workshop in Tallahassee. I would ask for the record to recognize the following:

- Florida Statute 367.0817 must be recognized by the Commission and staff in its entirety.
 No used and useful application should be applied to reuse projects
- Once 100% recovery of effluent reuse projects are recognized, the recovery in which rate
 class will need to be determined on a case by case basis. In most cases some
 apportionment between wastewater and effluent rates will be needed to ensure reuse
 acceptability as an effective cost alternative.
- A separate certificate for effluent reuse areas will eventually be needed to curtail litigation
 over service areas.
- The FPSC must define effluent reuse facilities consistent with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

In addition to the above, I would ask that the staff recognize the realities that utilities face when implementing reuse and the necessity for cost recovery. In our area and throughout Florida it is apparent that reuse has become a key component in sustaining development and customer growth Cost recovery is imperative for the viability and continued existence of all utilities.
