RE: DOCKET NO. 980733-TL - Discovery related to study on fair and reasonable rates and on relationships among costs and charges associated with certain telecommunications services provided by local exchange companies (LECs), as required by Chapter 98-277, Laws of Florida.

Issue 1: Should the Commission grant the Attorney General's Motions to Compel BellSouth, GTEFL, and Sprint to respond to its First Set of Interrogatories and Third Request for Production of Documents?

Recommendation: The Commission should grant the Attorney General's Motions, in part, and deny the motions, in part. Staff recommends that the companies should be required to respond to specific interrogatories and requests for production of documents\*as set forth in staff's September 15, 1998 memorandum.

Staff recommends that the Attorney General's Motions be denied as it applies to the remaining interrogatories and requests for production of documents.

\* POD 9 was eliminated from recommendation by staff at conference.
