ORDER APPROVING SETTLEMENT

Robert D. Egozi (Mr. Egozi) currently holds Certificate of
Public Convenience and Necessity No. 5127, issued by the Commission
on April 11, 1997, authorizing the provision of pay phone service.
The Division of Administration advised our staff by memorandum that
Mr. Egozi had not paid the 1997 regulatory assessment fees (RAFs).
Also accrued statutory penalties and interest charges for late RAFs
payments for the year 1997 have not been paid. RAFs are required
by Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-4.0161, Florida
Administrative Code.

Pursuant to Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, certificate
holders must pay a minimum annual RAF of \$50 if the certificate was
active during any portion of the calendar year. Pursuant to Rule
25-4.0161(2), Florida Administrative Code, the form and applicable
fees are due to the Florida Public Service Commission by January 30
of the subsequent year. All entities that apply for certification
receive a copy of our rules governing pay phone service. All
applicants must attest that these rules have been received and

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understood by the applicant and an affidavit must be attached to the application in order for the application to be processed. The RAF form was mailed to Mr. Egozi for the period of January 1, 1997, through December 31, 1997. Our correspondence regarding the RAFs was returned unopened to us by the United States Post Office Service stamped "returned to sender" and "unclaimed."

On February 9, 1999, Order No. PSC-99-0220-FOF-TC was issued, imposing a \$500 fine and requiring payment of the past due RAFs, along with statutory penalties and interest charges, and fine by March 9, 1999. After the order was issued, Mr. Egozi contacted our staff and advised that he wanted to keep his certificate, would pay the past due amount, and would make a settlement offer. The Division of Administration's records show that Mr. Egozi paid the past due amount. In addition, Mr. Egozi proposed to pay future regulatory assessment fees by the due date of each year and contribute \$100 to the State General Revenue Fund.

We believe that the terms of the settlement agreement represent a fair and reasonable resolution of this matter. Accordingly, we hereby accept the settlement offer. Mr. Egozi must comply with these requirements within five business days from the date this Order becomes final. The contribution will be forwarded to the Office of the Comptroller for deposit in the State General Revenue Fund pursuant to Section 364.285(1), Florida Statutes. Upon remittance of the \$100 contribution, this docket shall be closed.

Based on the foregoing, it is


ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Robert D. Egozi's settlement proposal summarized in the body of this Order is hereby approved. It is further

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
