# PREHEARING STATEMENT OF FLORIDA CABLE TELECOMMUNICATIONS ASSOCIATION

Florida Cable Telecommunications Association (FCTA), pursuant to Order No. PSC-99-0761-PCO-TP and the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) Staff's May 10, 1999 Memorandum to Interested Persons, files its Prehearing Statement and states:

### I. BASIC POSITION

The Commission should approve the Stipulation and Voluntary Number Management Measures (Stipulation) filed in this proceeding on May 27, 1999. This proceeding involves the Commission's response to notice from the North American Numbering Plan Administrator (NANPA) that several area codes in Florida are in jeopardy of exhaustion, and that Central Office (NXX) codes are underutilized. In order to address the apparent numbering resource issue raised by NANPA, the Commission set for hearing on July 7-8, 1999 the issue of requiring code holders to distribute telephone numbers consecutively, beginning with the lowest assignable number, or to consider an appropriate alternative interim mechanism for numbering administration. At the Agenda Conference on March 30, 1999, a concern was expressed that code holders were not issuing telephone numbers in a sequential manner, which, if allowed to continue, might hamper future

number pooling efforts.

The parties to this docket, joined by other major industry members, have reached a consensus

as to an appropriate interim mechanism for number resource management which obviates any need

to consider sequential numbering. The signatories to the Stipulation support the implementation of

a voluntary plan to efficiently resolve the numbering resource issues by 1000s block number pooling

until such time as a lawful arrangement for number pooling or number conservation becomes

effective. Accordingly, FCTA believes that the Stipulation, if approved, adequately resolves the

issues identified for hearing, and a hearing is unnecessary.

II. WITNESSES' TESTIMONY AND EXHIBITS

FCTA will not present any witnesses and does not plan at this time to present any exhibits.

FCTA reserves the right to later identify and sponsor such exhibits as may be required by later filed

testimony, the completion of discovery, or new issues identified at the prehearing conference.

III. ISSUES AND POSITIONS

**ISSUE ONE:** Should the Commission order on a statewide basis that the distribution of telephone

numbers be made consecutively within area codes, beginning with the lowest assignable telephone

number? If not, what alternative interim mechanism for numbering administration would be

appropriate?

**POSITION:** No. The Commission should instead adopt the Stipulation and Voluntary Number

Management Measures filed May 27, 1999, by the parties to this docket and other industry members.

**ISSUE TWO:** Should this docket be closed?

**POSITON:** This docket should be closed upon approval of the Stipulation.

IV. STIPULATION

A stipulation between the parties to this docket and other industry members was submitted

for Commission approval on May 27, 1999.
