## GTE FLORIDA INCORPORATED'S SUPPLEMENTAL PREHEARING STATEMENT

GTE Florida Incorporated (GTE) files its Supplemental Prehearing Statement in accordance with Staff's instructions at the June 16, 1999, Prehearing Conference in this matter. At that time, additional issues were identified for resolution in this docket. Here, GTE sets forth its positions on those issues, which are all legal in nature.

<u>Issue 2</u>: Does the Commission have the jurisdiction to order carriers to assign telephone numbers sequentially?

**GTE's Position**: No. Sequential number assignment is a form of NXX code administration. States cannot administer NXX codes in the absence of specific authority from the FCC, which has jurisdiction over this area. The FCC has not delegated any such jurisdiction to this Commission.

<u>Issue 3</u>: Does the Commission have jurisdiction to impose a consecutive number distribution requirement on CMRS providers?

**GTE's Position:** No. CMRS providers are specifically excluded from Commission jurisdiction by Section 364.02(12)(c) of the Florida Statutes. As noted above, the Commission has no authority to require consecutive number assignment in any event.

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<u>Issue 4</u>: Is the Commission authorized to impose consecutive number assignment requirements on all NXX code holders in Florida without adopting that requirement through formal rule making pursuant to Chapter 120, Florida Statutes?

**GTE's Position**: GTE's preliminary analysis of this issue indicates that the Commission's action contemplated in this docket will be impermissible under Chapter 120. To the extent that consecutive numbering is an industry-wide requirement, it would need to be adopted pursuant to a formal rulemaking.
