**ON BEHALF OF FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY**

Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") hereby submits the following preliminary list of issues in the above-numbered and entitled proceeding:

1. With regard to the imposition of the late payment charge on the account in question, did FPL's actions violate any aspect of its tariff or the applicable rules of the Commission?
2. Are there existing payment options and programs available to Mr. Webb through which his concerns otherwise could be addressed were he to avail himself of such options and programs?
3. Does a late payment charge appropriately place costs caused by late paying customers on those customers and not on the general body of ratepayers?
4. Should the Commission reverse its decision in Docket No. 900836-EI, Order No. 24271, in which it allowed FPL to charge a fee for late payment? If the Commission is to reverse its decision in Docket No. 900836-EI, should it therefore also reverse its decisions in other dockets in which the Commission has granted other utilities the right to charge a fee for late payment?
