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P R O C E E D I N G S

(Hearing convened at 1:30 p.m.)

COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll call this, I guess it is a status conference, to order. Would you please read the Notice.

MS. KEATING: By Notice issued June 18, 1999, this time and place have been set for a status conference in BellSouth's collocation waiver dockets. The purpose is as set forth in the Notice.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll take appearances.

MS. WHITE: Nancy White, BellSouth Telecommunications.

MR. MELSON: Rick Melson, ACI Corp.

MR. SELF: Floyd Self representing MCI WorldCom. I'd also like to enter an appearance for Norman Horton who's representing NorthPoint Communications and e.spire.

MR. REHWINKEL: Charles Rehwinkel on behalf of Sprint. I'd also like to enter an appearance for Susan Masterton.

MR. HOFFMAN: Kenneth Hoffman on behalf of Teleport Communications Group and TCG South Florida and I would also enter an appearance by John Ellis on behalf of the same two companies.

MR. PELLEGRINI: Charles Pellegrini on

1 behalf of Intermedia Communications and Covad
2 Communications. I'd like to enter an appearance for
3 Scott Sapersteen (ph.), Intermedia Communications, and
4 Christopher Goodpastor, Covad Communications.

5 **MR. DIMLICH:** David Dimlich on behalf of
6 Supra Telecommunications and Information Systems.

7 **MS. KEATING:** Beth Keating and Will Cox for
8 Commission Staff.

9 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Okay. Thank you. I
10 understand that we're here for BellSouth to give us a
11 report on its reassessment and find out where we go
12 from here.

13 **MS. WHITE:** Yes, ma'am.

14 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** All right. Ms. White.

15 **MS. WHITE:** BellSouth appreciates the
16 parties' and the Commission's patience on this matter.
17 We have completed our reassessment, and under the
18 rules of the latest FCC Order No. 99-48 concerning
19 collocation, BellSouth is able to accommodate those
20 ALECs who were denied physical collocation prior to
21 BellSouth's motion for continuance in these dockets.

22 We have assigned this space in an efficient
23 and reasonable manner. We make an offer of space in
24 those offices today contingent upon three issues.

25 One is, there is -- we have sent to the

1 ALECs a new collocation attachment that incorporates
2 the FCC's order -- the findings of the FCC's order,
3 and we would ask that the parties, if they're going to
4 move forward with collocation in these offices, either
5 sign the agreement or get with our negotiators to
6 finish negotiating out that agreement, and to place a
7 firm order for physical collocation in these offices.
8 And we would ask that that would be done within 60
9 days from today's date.

10 There are also situations in some of these
11 offices where, in order to make space, we have had to
12 relocate some of our maintenance positions. There is
13 a cost associated with that. I believe this could be
14 done as part of the negotiation of the collocation
15 attachment, but we would expect that we would prorate
16 that cost among the ALECs who are able to obtain
17 physical collocation in these offices.

18 We have brought color coded floor plans of
19 these offices with us today and we're in a position to
20 show the ALECs our estimate of where they will be
21 located in each office. Our placement is based on the
22 latest information we have received from the ALECs.
23 It is subject to change, depending on if the space
24 needs of the ALECs change between what they sent us
25 and what they end up actually putting in.

1 Let's see. What else. We have determined
2 that two of the central offices, Lake Mary and Boca
3 Teeca, will be totally exhausted after the placement
4 of these ALECs. The other offices may have a few bays
5 left, but we continue to receive applications for
6 physical collocation in these offices and it may be
7 that, while we may be able to pull those petitions for
8 waiver down, we may have to refile them very shortly.
9 And we can also talk about whether we want to pull
10 Lake Mary and Boca Teeca petitions down and refile
11 them so that it's a clean filing under the new order
12 and doesn't have the baggage of the old docket.

13 Just for information sake, I will go through
14 each of the offices and just tell you what our
15 estimate of the cost to do these relocations that we
16 have to do and the number of applicants that we have
17 that have not yet been considered because they're
18 brand new applications for space.

19 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Hang on just a minute.
20 Why do I care at this point?

21 **MS. WHITE:** Well, you may not. You may want
22 to take a break and I just wanted to -- if we need to
23 get that part on the record so everybody can hear it.
24 It shouldn't take but a couple more minutes.

25 West Palm Beach Gardens, we have three new

1 applicants that have not been considered in this floor
2 plan. To accommodate the ALECs that we have on the
3 floor plan, it's estimated to cost between \$80,000 and
4 \$100,000. We have a building addition for that office
5 that's scheduled to complete year end 2000.

6 Lake Mary, once we place these ALECs in it
7 will be exhausted for physical collocation. We have a
8 building addition planned year end 2000.

9 Port Orange, there's a -- the consolidation
10 we will have to do in that office is estimated to cost
11 around \$60,000. We have no new applicants on the --
12 for that office. We will have a few bays left after
13 these ALECs fill it and the building addition is
14 planned for June of 2001.

15 Boca Teeca, we will have no space left after
16 the -- these applications are filled, the current
17 applications are filled.

18 Palmetto central office, we have six new
19 applications in the pipeline. We estimate that it
20 will take approximately \$100,000 to consolidate some
21 of the things we have to do in order to make room for
22 the people we can make room for, and we look for
23 building addition to be completed year end 2001.

24 And last, Golden Glades, we have one
25 application in the pipeline. It will cost us between

1 \$45,000 and \$50,000 for accommodation of the ALECs
2 that we have been able to fit in now and we're hoping
3 for a building addition to be completed year end 2000.

4 And if you'd like to take a break now, I can
5 show the --

6 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** No. I think rather
7 than take a break I'm probably going to adjourn this
8 meeting and let you all handle it. I do need some
9 clarification. You said you have recessed the space
10 based on the order and you can accommodate everyone
11 who filed before the petitions for waiver. Is that
12 everybody who's intervened in this docket?

13 **MS. WHITE:** I'm sorry. Before our petition
14 for continuance, yes. Motion for continuance. Not
15 the petition for waiver. And that should include --
16 unless somebody recently intervened that I'm not aware
17 of, it should include all the intervenors to this
18 docket as well as -- if they filed an application for
19 space, as well as some parties that have filed for
20 space in these offices that are not intervenors to
21 this docket.

22 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Well, with respect to
23 Lake Mary and Boca Teeca, it will be exhausted after
24 the ones in this docket --

25 **MS. WHITE:** That's correct.

1 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** -- take their places.
2 Okay. And you're saying with respect to Lake Mary and
3 Boca Teeca -- Teeca?

4 **MS. WHITE:** Boca Teeca, uh-huh.

5 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** You will have to refile
6 for those and the other ones --

7 **MS. WHITE:** Yes. The other ones may, if we
8 have a few bays left and if someone comes in and says,
9 I need all those bays, then we would have to refile.

10 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Well, it strikes me
11 that I guess what we -- should we postpone the hearing
12 or simply cancel the hearing, cancel the docket,
13 because the represent -- in effect, you're withdrawing
14 your petition for waiver?

15 **MS. WHITE:** Yes, with the understanding that
16 for those two offices I'm going to have to refile
17 pretty close to immediately, and some of the other
18 offices, depending on the applications we've gotten
19 in, may end up being refiled next week.

20 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Well, that's fine. It
21 strikes me that they start another docket. But with
22 respect to these, you are, in effect, withdrawing your
23 petition and there is nothing further to be done.

24 **MS. WHITE:** That's correct.

25 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Is there any

1 disagreement with that?

2 **MR. MELSON:** Commissioner Clark, I don't
3 think I disagree but I'd to think about the impact of
4 the three contingencies that Ms. White mentioned; the
5 signing or negotiating a new contract.

6 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Right. I would propose
7 that I wouldn't make any -- I don't know that I have
8 to make or the Commission needs to make any ruling
9 with respect to that. If you sign the agreement, then
10 it strikes me it's -- you've reached an agreement. If
11 you're still negotiating, you reach an impass, then
12 you file with us.

13 * If they want you to file within 60 days and
14 you don't want to, that's a point of contention with
15 respect to the negotiations, as is, the cost of
16 relocating the maintenance. So I think that, if you
17 fail to reach agreement, then you file something with
18 us.

19 Ms. Barone, nice to have you join us. How
20 is the Atlanta airport?

21 **MS. BARONE:** Horrible.

22 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** I knew they were backed
23 up yesterday, but are they still backed up today?

24 **MS. BARONE:** Yes, they are. It's a miracle
25 I got on this flight.

1 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Well, we're just about
2 to conclude. The petition's been withdrawn and
3 there's nothing more to do.

4 **MR. HOFFMAN:** Everybody but Sprint.

5 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** I will give them a
6 minute to confer. Do you disagree with that,
7 Mr. Self?

8 **MR. SELF:** I had the same question that
9 Mr. Melson had, but I think I agree with what you
10 said; that the potential issues that BellSouth is
11 raising with respect to the cost, the rearrangement,
12 where exactly you're being placed --

13 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Have nothing to do with
14 this docket.

15 **MR. SELF:** Certainly not with respect to
16 whether the waiver should be granted or denied, that's
17 correct.

18 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Right.

19 **MR. SELF:** And I think you're right. If we
20 would have a dispute arising out of that --

21 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Then it's subject to
22 arbitration.

23 **MR. SELF:** It would be subject to something,
24 yes.

25 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Well, all right.

1 Mr. Hoffman or Mr. Pellegrini, Mr. Dimlich, do you
2 disagree in any way?

3 **MR. HOFFMAN:** No, I would concur,
4 Commissioner.

5 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Okay.

6 **MR. PELLEGRINI:** I'm somewhat uneasy,
7 Commissioner Clark, because there are other issues
8 that are on the table in each of these proceedings.
9 I'm somewhat uneasy about closing the dockets.

10 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** What issues are on the
11 table? If they withdraw their petition the issue of
12 whether or not they have space is no longer at issue.

13 **MR. PELLEGRINI:** That's the only issue
14 that's been resolved I think with --

15 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** What are the other
16 issues that remain on the table?

17 **MR. PELLEGRINI:** Well, there were a number
18 of other issues that related specifically to
19 collocation arrangements.

20 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Mr. Pellegrini, you're
21 going to have to drag out those issues and tell me
22 which ones remain on the table. Do you have -- do we
23 have a prehearing order?

24 **MS. KEATING:** Not with us. I think -- my
25 understanding of the issues is, is that all the issues

1 led up to resolution of the ultimate issue, which was,
2 whether or not the waiver petition should be granted.
3 So I think to the extent that if you resolve the
4 greater issue, then the other issues are resolved, at
5 least for these proceedings.

6 Now, I understand Mr. Pellegrini's concern.
7 There are some ongoing generic collocation issues, but
8 those are going to be handled, I believe, in other
9 proceedings.

10 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Well, are you going to
11 orally withdraw your petition now?

12 **MS. WHITE:** Yes. Did I hear a squeak from
13 the back? I would say yes, with the understanding
14 that we will be filing as soon as humanly possible,
15 probably refile for Lake Mary and Boca Teeca and
16 depending on what is asked for in the applications in
17 the pipeline, other -- some of the other offices may
18 soon follow.

19 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Okay. Why don't you
20 put on the next agenda that the petition for waiver
21 has been withdrawn for these offices and request that
22 we acknowledge the withdrawal.

23 **MS. KEATING:** For tomorrow or --

24 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** No, no. I'll let you
25 go to next week.

1 **MS. KEATING:** We'll certainly do that.

2 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** I don't think it's
3 material how soon you get it done.

4 **MS. KEATING:** Okay.

5 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** But I don't think it
6 should be too difficult. And just indicate that it's
7 been withdrawn by BellSouth, but they put us on notice
8 of the likelihood of having to refile for some of
9 those offices, and now the parties are in the posture
10 of having to negotiate those agreements and they may
11 be before us if those negotiations are not fruitful.

12 **MS. KEATING:** We'll certainly do that.

13 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Mr. Self.

14 **MR. SELF:** Commissioner Clark, just one
15 other comment, I guess. I know there's nothing we can
16 do about it today.

17 To the extent that BellSouth needs to refile
18 for two offices or ultimately all six or others,
19 certainly -- and you've already said -- there are
20 generic issues that are going to be raised by these
21 applications. For example, if they refile, you know,
22 for what period of time are they going to be asking
23 for waiver. Is it a permanent waiver that stays in
24 effect, you know, forever until something changes or
25 what?

1 And, I know my client is very interested in
2 the Commission proceeding with the generic proceeding
3 as quickly as possible. That may lessen the need for
4 parties to intervene in some of the individual waiver
5 requests that may be filed in the future.

6 So, my client would simply like for me to at
7 least be on the record to say that the sooner the
8 Commission can get on with the generic proceeding, it
9 may ultimately be easier for all of us.

10 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Have we scheduled a
11 generic proceeding on that?

12 **MS. KEATING:** Actually, there are two
13 dockets that have a generic proceeding as an issue in
14 them and Staff is currently working on a
15 recommendation to try to expedite the process for
16 generic issues.

17 **COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Okay. Well, then what
18 I will indicate is we will adjourn the status
19 conference, noting the withdrawal of the petition by
20 BellSouth, and hearing no objection to that
21 withdrawal, but hearing concerns with respect to the
22 generic docket and with respect to no agreement on
23 any -- the result of any negotiation or the terms that
24 you have indicated you're looking for, and we will
25 report back to the Chairman that it's been withdrawn

1 and that it will -- the acknowledgement will be on a
2 subsequent agenda.

3 Anything else? Thank you all very much and
4 thank you Monica for struggling through that traffic.

5 (Thereupon, the hearing concluded at 1:50
6 p.m.)

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
