STAFF'S PROPOSED ISSUES  
(October 26, 1999)

1. Under the terms of their July 1, 1997 interconnection agreement, is BellSouth obligated to provision unbundled network element combinations for Sprint? If so, does BellSouth's refusal to accept orders after June 23, 1999 for extended loop combinations constitute a breach of the interconnection agreement?
2. Did BellSouth adhere to the Dispute Resolution provisions of the BellSouth/Sprint interconnection agreement with respect to the disagreement between the parties about provisioning extended loop combinations? If not, was BellSouth obligated to do so, and if so, does this constitute a breach of the interconnection agreement?
3. If BellSouth has breached its interconnection agreement with Sprint, what actions should the Commission require BellSouth to take?
