Dear Mrs. Bayo:

AT&T is in the process of discontinuing a certain service from its interstate tariffs and will be filing the appropriate documents at the FCC tomorrow. FCC rules also require that AT&T provide notice of this action to state Public Service Commissions. Accordingly, pursuant to 47 CFR 63.71 of the Federal Communications Commission rules, this is to notify the Florida Public Service Commission that AT&T is applying to discontinue Digital and Analog Private Line Services, effective as of February 15, 2000. This discontinuance only affects 35 customers nationally, mostly in New York.

Attached is a copy of AT&T's Section 214 Application for Service Discontinuance for this service on behalf of its wholly-owned subsidiary, ACC National Long Distance Corp.
