

PREHEARING ORDER

I. CASE BACKGROUND

By letter dated April 22, 1998, Lockheed Martin IMS (Lockheed Martin), the administrator of the North American Numbering Plan (NANP) for the 407 area code, notified the Commission that the 407 area code will exhaust its remaining supply of telephone numbers by approximately the fourth quarter of 1999. Lockheed Martin also notified the Commission that an industry meeting was held to discuss alternative relief plans for the 407 area code. At the industry meeting, an overlay relief plan was the consensus recommendation reached by industry representatives in their effort to address the future supply of telephone numbers for the 407 area code.

Lockheed Martin has requested the Commission's approval of the industry's recommendation to implement an overlay plan for the 407 area code. This prehearing order sets out the issues to be addressed and the procedures to be followed at the hearing scheduled to address this matter.

II. PROCEDURE FOR HANDLING CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

A. Any information provided pursuant to a discovery request for which proprietary confidential business information status is requested shall be treated by the Commission and the parties as confidential. The information shall be exempt from Section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, pending a formal ruling on such

request by the Commission, or upon the return of the information to the person providing the information. If no determination of confidentiality has been made and the information has not been used in the proceeding, it shall be returned expeditiously to the person providing the information. If a determination of confidentiality has been made and the information was not entered into the record of the proceeding, it shall be returned to the person providing the information within the time periods set forth in Section 364.183(2), Florida Statutes.

B. It is the policy of the Florida Public Service Commission that all Commission hearings be open to the public at all times. The Commission also recognizes its obligation pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, to protect proprietary confidential business information from disclosure outside the proceeding.

In the event it becomes necessary to use confidential information during the hearing, the following procedures will be observed:

- 1) Any party wishing to use any proprietary confidential business information, as that term is defined in Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, shall notify the Prehearing Officer and all parties of record by the time of the Prehearing Conference, or if not known at that time, no later than seven (7) days prior to the beginning of the hearing. The notice shall include a procedure to assure that the confidential nature of the information is preserved as required by statute.
- 2) Failure of any party to comply with 1) above shall be grounds to deny the party the opportunity to present evidence which is proprietary confidential business information.
- 3) When confidential information is used in the hearing, parties must have copies for the Commissioners, necessary staff, and the Court Reporter, in envelopes clearly marked with the nature of the contents. Any party wishing to examine the confidential material that is not subject to an order granting confidentiality shall be provided a copy in the same fashion as provided to the Commissioners, subject to execution of any

appropriate protective agreement with the owner of the material.

- 4) Counsel and witnesses are cautioned to avoid verbalizing confidential information in such a way that would compromise the confidential information. Therefore, confidential information should be presented by written exhibit when reasonably possible to do so.
- 5) At the conclusion of that portion of the hearing that involves confidential information, all copies of confidential exhibits shall be returned to the proffering party. If a confidential exhibit has been admitted into evidence, the copy provided to the Court Reporter shall be retained in the Division of Records and Reporting confidential files.

Post-hearing procedures

Rule 28-106.215, Florida Administrative Code, permits the filing of post-hearing statements of issues and positions. Accordingly, post-hearing statements, including a summary of each position of no more than 50 words, set off with asterisks, shall be filed in this proceeding. If a party's position has not changed since the issuance of the prehearing order, the post-hearing statement may simply restate the prehearing position; however, if the prehearing position is longer than 50 words, it must be reduced to no more than 50 words. Further, if a party fails to file a post-hearing statement in conformance with this order, that party shall have waived all issues and may be dismissed from the proceeding.

Pursuant to Rule 28-106.215, Florida Administrative Procedure, a party's proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law, if any, statement of issues and positions, and brief, shall together total no more than 40 pages, and shall be filed at the same time. The prehearing officer may modify the page limit for good cause shown.

III. PREFILED TESTIMONY AND EXHIBITS

Testimony of all witnesses to be sponsored by the parties has been prefiled. All testimony which has been prefiled in this case

will be inserted into the record as though read after the witness has taken the stand and affirmed the correctness of the testimony and associated exhibits. All testimony remains subject to appropriate objections. Each witness will have the opportunity to orally summarize his or her testimony at the time he or she takes the stand. Upon insertion of a witness' testimony, exhibits appended thereto may be marked for identification. After all parties and Staff have had the opportunity to object and cross-examine, the exhibit may be moved into the record. All other exhibits may be similarly identified and entered into the record at the appropriate time during the hearing.

Witnesses are reminded that, on cross-examination, responses to questions calling for a simple yes or no answer shall be so answered first, after which the witness may explain his or her answer.

V. BASIC POSITIONS

NANPA: No position.

AT&T: AT&T suggests that any NPA relief must be planned and implemented in a competitively neutral manner so that no particular service provider is unduly favored or adversely affected. The impact of area code relief on customers should be kept to a minimum while promoting the development of local competition for the long term benefit of Florida consumers. AT&T suggest a geographic split best accomplishes these goals in the 407 NPA.

BMI: BMI's basic position in this proceeding is that it agrees with the industry recommendation resulting from the industry meeting held on March 31, 1998, that recommendation being for NPA relief via a single overlay favors an overlay versus a geographic split in dealing with the exhaust of Area Code 305 in South Florida.

BELL-SOUTH: BellSouth agrees with the consensus Industry Recommendation resulting from the Industry Meeting held March 31, 1998, to implement 407 NPA relief utilizing a single overlay plan. For local and EAS calls, a 10-digit dialing pattern would be mandatory with the overlay solution. All toll calls and those ECS calls subject to allowable Interexchange Carrier competition should be dialed on a 1 plus 10-digit dialing pattern. For ECS calls where Interexchange Carrier competition is not allowed, dialing requirements should be required to be the same as local and EAS calls. This dialing pattern will help ensure dialing parity among all communications users and providers and begin the transition to the dialing patterns mandated in PSC Order No. 98-96-0558-FOS-TP.

In the alternative, BellSouth would support a geographic split as set forth in Alternative #7 from the Industry Meeting.

MCI: In general, geographic splits are preferable to overlays as a means of providing area code relief. Geographic splits tend to have fewer end-user impacts and fewer negative impacts on emerging competition. If the

Commission nevertheless determines due to the unique circumstances in the 407 area code that an overlay is in the public interest, it should impose several conditions to mitigate the adverse impacts on competition. These conditions include: (1) no slippage in the current schedule for permanent local number portability; (2) requiring 10-digit dialing within and between all old and new area codes (consistent with FCC order); and (3) establishing a workshop or other appropriate process to make recommendations to the Commission for further number conservation mechanisms (e.g. Rate Center Consolidation, Unassigned Number Porting and Number Pooling) for the Orlando area, to ensure full utilization of the current numbering resource and to further extend the life of this NPA relief option.

SPRINT: Sprint agrees with the consensus Industry Recommendation resulting from the Industry Meeting held March 31, 1998, to implement 407 NPA relief utilizing a single overlay plan. For local and EAS/ECS calls, a 10-digit dialing pattern would be mandatory with the overlay solution. Toll calls should be dialed on a 1+ 10 digit dialing pattern.

VISTA: The single overlay (alternative 1) has many advantages and should be considered by the Commission along with alternatives 4 and 7.

STAFF: No basic position pending the hearing.

VI. ISSUES AND POSITIONS

ISSUE 1: Should the Commission approve the industry's consensus overlay plan for the 407 area code relief, and if not, what relief plan should the Commission approve?

POSITION:

NANPA: No position.

AT&T: While there are advantages and disadvantages of either imposing an overlay as proposed by Lockheed Martin IMS or a geographic split, AT&T suggests that the advantages associated with the split outweigh those associated with

an overlay. From a technical standpoint, AT&T will support either one. The determining factor should be what is in the best interests of the people living and working within the 407 area code.

BMI: The Commission should approve the industry's consensus overlay plan for the 407 area code relief. If the Commission chooses to select an alternative relief solution, BMI suggests that Alternative Number 7 provides the most effective relief plan that also maintains the greatest community of interest.

BELL-
SOUTH: Yes. The overlay plan is the most cost effective, most consistent and least confusing dialing arrangement, as well as being the easiest to implement and the one which will provide the longest NPA relief period for all customers. Alternatively, BellSouth supports a geographic split as set forth in Alternative #7.

MCI: The Commission should not approve the overlay plan for the 407 area code. If relief is necessary, the Commission should approve a geographic split. If the Commission nevertheless determines, due to the unique circumstances in the 407 area code that an overlay is in the public interest, it should impose the following conditions to mitigate the adverse impacts on competition: (1) no slippage in the current schedule for permanent local number portability; (2) requiring 10-digit dialing within and between all old and new area codes (consistent with FCC order); and (3) establishing a workshop or other appropriate process to make recommendations to the Commission for further number conservation mechanisms (e.g. Rate Center Consolidation, Unassigned Number Porting and Number Pooling) for the Orlando area, to ensure full utilization of the current numbering resource and to further extend the life of this NPA relief option.

SPRINT: Yes. The overlay plan in this particular case is a rational solution which will provide the most long term benefits and make it easier to add future area codes which will clearly be needed in this high growth area.

VISTA: The single overlay (alternative 1) has many advantages and should be considered by the Commission along with alternatives 4 and 7.

STAFF: No position pending the Hearing.

ISSUE 2: What should the dialing pattern be for the following types of calls? a. Local b. Toll c. EAS d. ECS

POSITION:

NANPA: No position.

AT&T: If the Commission approves an overlay, 10-digit dialing should be required within and between the new and old area codes for all types of calls. In addition, toll calls should be made on a 1+10 digit basis. If the Commission approves a geographic split, 10-digit dialing should be required between the new and old area dialing codes for all types of calls. In addition, toll calls should be made on a 1+10-digit basis. Local, ECS and EAS calls within an area code may be on a seven-digit basis.

BELL-

SOUTH: A 10-digit dialing pattern is mandatory for local and EAS calls with the overlay solution, and should also apply to ECS calls where interexchange carrier competition is not allowed. A 1+ 10-digit dialing pattern should apply to all tolls calls and those ECS calls subject to allowable interexchange carrier competition.

BMI: If the Commission approves the industry consensus overlay, 10 digit dialing will be mandatory for local, EAS and ECS where interexchange carrier competition is not allowed, and 1+10 digit dialing for toll and ECS where interexchange carrier competition is allowed. If Alternative Number 7 is implemented, seven digit dialing patterns will be maintained within area codes.

MCI: If the Commission approves an overlay, 10 digit dialing should be required within and between the new and old area codes for all types of calls. In addition, toll and ECS calls should be made on a 1+ 10-digit basis.

If the Commission approves a geographic split, 10 digit dialing should be required between the new and old area codes for all types of calls. In addition, toll and ECS calls should be made on a 1+ 10-digit basis. Local and EAS calls within an area code may be on a seven digit basis.

SPRINT: A 10-digit dialing pattern is mandatory for local and EAS/ECS calls with the overlay solution. Toll calls should be dialed on a 1+10-digit dialing pattern.

VISTA: The dialing patterns for these types of calls depends on the relief plan adopted. Under either alternative 4 or 7, a significant number of EAS/ECS calls that are now seven digit dialed will require ten digit dialing.

STAFF: No position pending the Hearing.




Bell South has announced that plans are being made to create a new area-calling zone for the area now included within Area Code-407. Two proposals are being considered: 1) an "overlay" plan which would create a situation where adjacent neighbors might have different area codes; 2) a plan which would divide the present area "407" geographically so as to form a new area code for one section while retaining the "407" prefix for the other area. Of the two choices, I far prefer the geographic split.

The first alternate will, most likely, require a caller to dial three additional numbers to call people who may, in fact, be just next door. I find that to be very objectionable, as it will affect virtually every call I make for years to come.

A geographic split may force me to add an area code to some calls, but that will be of a minor consequence compared to the alternate. In addition, the trauma of such a change will be a one-time event where the other will be ongoing forever. I believe I can get used to a geographic split; I may never get used to the overlay plan.

My vote is to implement the geographic split method.



As far back as 1995 I was in correspondence with AT&T - when they still had some input into assigning Area Codes.

I suggested that they follow UPS in using the US Post Office Zip Codes to preface their numbers.

The advantage is obvious, in that people calling a number will now^{the} the time zone involved. For instance 714 is Los Angeles, and 717 is Pittsburgh. If I call 714 from 717 at 7 o'clock in the morning, it is only 4 am in L.A., and the receiver of the call may not be happy.

My thinking has been updated.

With the vast proliferation of communication devices, 4 digits may not be enough; we might need 5 digits to preface a local telephone number. That could work out to be an ADVANTAGE. We could use the entire Zip code, and each phone could be programmed so that one's Zip code was automatically his area code. There could be not limit to the number of codes, and they would NEVER have to be changed. That would also have the advantage of leaving 1-800 and 1-888 for the toll-free numbers.

I hope you will give this - or any variation of it that you think out - your consideration.

Further to our correspondence of last year, I want to say that I was somewhat dismayed to see the recent proliferation of area codes, which have sprouted out.

As per the attached cut from our local newspaper, you can see that I am not the only one who is unhappy about it.

However, in some cases it is the increase of area codes, and I believe - as I indicated before - that they have to increase but it would be good if they could reflect geographical location when they do increase

It seems to me that there may be a solution, i.e.

Put all area codes into a computer, and all zip codes into the computer to line up with it. Where there is a free area code, the zip code should be assigned to that area.

Where they overlap the transition to matching them geographically can be done on a gradual basis.

=====

There may be a different long-range approach. That is, eliminate the preceding "1" digit and make the area code into a 4 digit code.

That is: My present number is: 1 (407) 423 0305; if made into a geographical code, instead of being 1 (328) 423 0305, it could be made into (3280) 423 0305.


That would give you greater flexibility, because instead of limiting one of the digits to a single "1," it would give you 8 additional digits to fit into the area code.

I think that this logical solution may be to the long run interest of AT&T, because eventually phones, FAXes, computers, and E-mail will probably be coordinated.

While keeping Area Code 407 in Brevard County might be the ideal solution for us, we should make it clear to the PSC that an overlay area code is not the second best solution for us.

We need to let the PSC know that if considering the other counties involved, they cannot give us permanently area code 407, that it would be more practical and cheaper for us to make a one time change to a new area code than to get an overlay area code.

My parents live in DuPage County, IL (the western suburbs of Chicago). In the last ten years they have had 3 area codes. Initially they had the same area code as Chicago (312). Then they were assigned a new area code (608), then as that filled up, an overlay was created with Area Code 620 being assigned to new cell phones and faxes. Then regular phones in DuPage County were changed to Area Code 620.

I would much rather deal with a one time change to all Brevard County phones than deal with an overlay area code, even if it means changing:



407 Area Code Relief

Florida's growing population, coupled with the increasing use of cellular phones, facsimile machines and computer modems are creating a record demand for telephone numbers.

The region of Florida currently served by the 407 area code is projected to exhaust its supply of 7.92 million telephone numbers in late 1999.

The PSC will conduct a second series of hearings in the region served by the 407 area code in September. The September hearings are a follow-up to hearings conducted in August and are intended to offer consumers additional opportunities to familiarize themselves with existing plans and to provide a forum for expressing opinions on those plans.

Representatives of the telephone companies that will be affected by the change met March 31, 1998 in Orlando to discuss a number of options proposed by the North American Numbering Plan Administrator. The industry consensus was for a plan involving an "overlay."

In this context, an overlay describes a plan by which existing customers will include the area code when dialing all calls within the current 407 area code boundaries. As telephone numbers in the existing 407 area code are used up, new customers would receive 10-digit numbers requiring the use of a new area code.

According to this plan, the Commission would designate a "permissive dialing period." During the permissive dialing period, consumers would have the choice of using seven-digit or 10-digit dialing. Once the permissive dialing period ends, 10-digit dialing would be mandatory.

The Commission is not bound by the industry consensus and may accept, reject or modify any plan or any schedules for change, based on testimony from affected parties or consumers. When the hearings are concluded, the Commission's staff will make a recommendation - currently scheduled for November 19, 1998 - and the issue will be brought before the full Commission for a decision, which is currently scheduled for December 1, 1998.

The Commission strongly encourages individuals affected by the area code change to attend public hearings and express their opinions. Comments can also be addressed to the Commission in writing, by telephone or by e-mail to the addresses listed in this report.



Julia L. Johnson






ALTERNATIVE 1
SINGLE OVERLAY




ALTERNATIVE 2

407 AREA CODE RELIEF




ALTERNATIVE 3
SINGLE SPLIT




ALTERNATIVE 4




ALTERNATIVE 5
SINGLE SPLIT




ALTERNATIVE 6

407 AREA CODE RELIEF




ALTERNATIVE 7
SINGLE SPLIT




ALTERNATIVE 8

As promised, here is more information on the area code relief plan for the 407 area code.

As you know, the Public Service Commission conducted several public hearings for customers in the Orlando and Brevard County areas regarding the overlay plan for the 407 area code proposed by the telephone industry. Upon review of the record and the recommendation of our staff, the Commission voted on December 1, 1998, to adopt an alternative plan whereby Brevard County would receive a new area code, and the new area code also would overlay the existing 407 area code in Orange, Seminole, and Osceola Counties. (See enclosed Order No. PSC-98-1761-FOF-TL, issued December 29, 1998). The Commission recognized that this would mean two area codes for a single geographic area, and that this overlaid area would require ten-digit dialing for local telephone calls, as required by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). Nevertheless, the Commission felt that this plan would keep the strongest communities of interest intact and provide the longest lives for the old and new area codes.

As the Commission's order indicates, the alternative chosen -- the split boundary extension overlay plan -- was very similar to the industry's consensus overlay plan. In selecting this plan, the Commission reasoned that customers in Brevard County would be able to keep their telephone numbers by splitting Brevard County off into a separate new area. Moreover, the chosen plan allows Brevard customers to maintain 7-digit dialing for local calls. The plan also does not significantly shorten the life of the Orlando overlay. The projected exhaust date for the industry's proposed overlay plan was 2005, while the Orlando overlay selected by the Commission will exhaust in 2004.

As for implementation of the split boundary extension overlay plan, a permissive dialing period will begin on April 1, 1999. During that period, customers in both the overlaid area and the Brevard County area will be able to use either their existing or new telephone number and dialing pattern. On December 1, 1999, Brevard County customers will be required to use their new area

code and telephone number, and customers in the overlaid area will be required to dial the full ten digits of their area code and telephone number for local calls.

Since our approval of the plan described above, there have been several additional developments. On December 15, 1998, the Commission approved an allocation plan for numbers in the new area code. Numbers will be allocated in such a way that customers in the Brevard County area will have a significantly longer life with their use of the new area code. (See enclosed Order No. PSC-99-0056-FOF-TL, issued January 6, 1999.) Under this allocation, the projected lives for the Brevard County area and the overlaid area are 8 and 4.1 years, respectively.

On December 22, 1998, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. (BellSouth) filed a motion (see attached copy) for modification of the implementation schedule for the relief plan. BellSouth has requested that implementation of the overlay plan begin on April 1, 1999, with a mandatory date of November 29, 1999. For the Brevard County area, BellSouth wishes to begin implementation on October 11, 1999, with a mandatory date of October 8, 2000. The Commission is scheduled to vote on this motion at its February 16, 1999, Commission meeting.

At the present time, the Commission has not been notified as to the specific area code that will be assigned by the North American Numbering Plan Administration (NANPA). NANPA is the federal body, under the oversight of the FCC, that has the duty of assigning new area codes. The Commission has requested assignment of the area code "321" in recognition of the Kennedy Space Center and the Space Coast. The Commission is awaiting a decision from the NANPA.

In summary, as the enclosed orders indicate, the Commission examined numerous options for relief of the 407 area code. None of the options explored offered a perfect solution. The option chosen by the Commission appeared to best balance the various interests.

I recently read in the Orlando Sentinel that the telephone company will be starting voluntary 10 digit dialing in your own area code in the near future and as of December 31, 1999, mandatory 10 digit dialing will be instituted. The paper explained that the reason for this is that there are many new numbers and there are not enough numbers available in necessitating 10 digit dialing.

First of all, (1) I think that this is extremely inconvenient to the citizens of Florida. (2) Dialing in your car would be more difficult and more dangerous. In addition, there is multiple automatic dialing devices that would need to be changed, some of which cannot take 10 digits and would be unusable.


Finally, I find it hard to understand how requiring 10 digit dialing would accommodate more telephone numbers because the 10 digit dialing would encompass the same number of possible combinations of phone numbers in that area code. Thus, the number of numbers of area code 407 cannot change whether you add 10 digits to it or let it remain at 7 digits.

I urge the Public Service Commission to rescind this order. I am also going to appeal to the legislature and the Governor of the State of Florida because I think they will agree that this is an extremely unpopular decision.

Another alternative would to be add more area codes. There are possibly 999 area codes. I do not know whether they all have been used but I strongly suspect that there are probably several hundred area codes that still can be used in the country.

I am strongly urging the Public Service Commission to withdraw its decision to overlay the 407 Area Code. The North American Numbering and Planning Commission estimates that an overlay would only provide an additional five years of relief to the current 407 Area Code. Essentially, this means that by 2004 or even earlier, with the rapid expansion of telecommunication services and the wasteful tactics currently being implemented by Local Exchange Carriers would result in three area codes in Orlando by 2004. This is grossly unnecessary and clearly presents recklessness on behalf of the Public Service Commission. I ask the Public Service Commission to withdraw the request for an overlay, which had recently been done in Los Angeles, where the recent overlay of the 310 area code has been rescinded until further public comment could be gathered. I ask the Commission to rather consider a split which would benefit both the 407 and 561 area codes, both of which require relief. I am asking the commission to implement the 321 Area Code as a split, which should consist entirely of Brevard, Indian River, Martin, and Saint Lucie Counties. After closely examining this plan I was overwhelmingly surprised and amazed about how little impact such a split would have on residents residing in these areas. It would first of all remove the overlay from the 407 Area Code for the time being, until further options could be explored. Very few prefixes would be affected in a split which would essentially create the 321 Area Code. I would ask the commission to take all duplicated and automatically reassign them in a fair manner. I have reviewed the prefixes in Brevard County and noticed that very few prefixes would have to be changed to avoid interfering with exchanges in current service in the 561 Area Code. I would ask the commission to implement this split sooner, as early as September, and make a mandatory six month transition period, in which during that

time period the area code covering the region could be used as well as prefixes that would require change, and then after that six month period a mandatory dialing period should begin and all new assigned prefixes should also become mandatory. Please carefully consider this proposal because it does prove to be the most reasonable solution for these two area codes.

I would support an overlay for Broward County as well as Palm Beach County, should an overlay become warranted in the near future. I am a little confused regarding the 941 Area Code split. Essentially, it will provide very little relief and will require the 941 Area Code to split once again in approximately two years. I think that the commission should consider reassigning Osceola County to this split, in order to lessen the burden on the 407 Area Code as well as add a little more substantial merit to an area code, where 70% of the population falls within Polk County. By adding Osceola County, this would reduce to 60%. This would create an area code that provides greater relief, not only for the affected communities and their residents, but for the state as a whole. Celebration, Lake Buena Vista and Reedy Creek exchanges would maintain the 407 Area Code. Also all exchanges in Montverde should be reassigned to the 352 Area Code. This is a solution which has been accepted in the past, including in Dixon, CA and Livonia, MI. Both cities have a much greater population, than the small town of Montverde.

I have outlined to the commission several solutions which cover relief procedures for four area codes (407, 561, 941, and 954). Should the commission enact upon these suggestions it should benefit the state with greater relief for everyone as a whole, in essence, lessening the amount of time before relief should be mandated in these areas in the near future.
