BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc., ("BellSouth") pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, hereby files this Request for Confidential Classification, and states the following:

- 1. On November 22, 2000, AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc (AT&T) filed its Third Request for Production of Documents to BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. (BellSouth). On December 21, 2000, BellSouth filed its responses, some of which contain proprietary, confidential information. At that same time, BellSouth filed a Notice of Intent to Request Confidential Classification for that material.
- 2. BellSouth hereby files this Request for Confidential Classification of information responsive to Request for Production of Documents Item Nos. 21, 22 and 24, because the information contained in these documents include confidential business information. Attachment "A" to BellSouth's Request for Confidential Classification contains the specific justification for the request for confidential classification along with a listing of the locations where the information designated by BellSouth as confidential is located within the documents in question.

- 3. Attachment "B" to BellSouth's Request for Confidential Classification contains two copies of the documents with the confidential information redacted.
- 4. Attachment "C" to BellSouth's Request for Confidential Classification is a sealed envelope containing one complete copy of the documents with the portions that are confidential and proprietary highlighted.
- 5. The information contained in BellSouth's response to AT&T's request includes confidential business information that is considered proprietary to BellSouth. Therefore, such information should continue to be classified as confidential business information pursuant to Section 364.24 and Section 364.183(3)(e), Florida Statutes. Accordingly, it should be held exempt from the public disclosure requirements of Section 119.07, Florida Statutes.
- 6. BellSouth has treated and intends to continue to treat the information for which confidential classification is sought as private, and this information has not been generally disclosed.

Explanation of Proprietary Information

- 1. The information requested contains BellSouth intellectual property in the form of a Requirements Document. The system described in the document was designed for internal BellSouth use with its own retail customers, and contains system design and programming requirements. Disclosure to the public would allow competitors (ALECs) or third-party vendors to develop similar systems, taking advantage of BellSouth's investment for design and development, without any form of compensation to BellSouth.
 - It may be appropriate for BellSouth in the future to make available to ALECs, access to the system capabilities described in the document. In such a case, BellSouth would provide at that time a separate User's Document for ALEC use. Until that decision is made, however, BellSouth is entitled to proprietary treatment of this internal systems requirements document.
- 2. The information requested contains BellSouth intellectual property in several forms. The overall AIN SCR solution has been submitted to the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) as something that may be granted a patent. Until the patent has been granted or denied, BellSouth is entitled to protect its interest by have the material treated as proprietary. The billing and provisioning methods and procedures address by the information have been developed by BellSouth for internal use, and should be considered trade secrets. Disclosure to the public of either of these forms of intellectual property would diminish the value of the intellectual property, and would allow competitors (ALECs) or third-party vendors to develop similar systems, taking advantage of BellSouth's investment for design and development, without any form of compensation to BellSouth.

BellSouth may, in the future, make available to ALECs access to the system capabilities described in the document, but in such instance BellSouth would provide separate interface specifications and usage documents for the ALEC's use. Until that decision is made, however, BellSouth is entitled to proprietary treatment of this information that has been developed for BellSouth's own internal use.
