IN RES JOINT PETITION FOR DETERMINATION OF NEED FOR PROPOSED STANTON ENERGY CENTER COMBINED CYCLE UNIT A BY ORLANDO UTILITIES COMMISSION; KISSIMMEE UTILITY AUTHORITY, FLORIDA MUNICIPAL POWER AGENCY, AND SOUTHERN COMPANY-FLORIDA, LLC.

ENOTICE is hereby given that the Florida Public Service Commission will hold a hearing in the above docket at the time and place listed below.

9:30 a.m., Monday, April 23, 2001 4075 Esplanade Way Room 148 - Betty Easley Conference Center Tallahassee Florida

Tuesday, April 24, 2001, has also been reserved for continuation of the hearing, if necessary. All persons who wish to be heard are urged to be present at the beginning of the hearing on April 23, 2001. The starting time of the second day's session will be announced at the conclusion of the first day's session. The hearing may be adjourned early if all testimony is concluded.

PURPOSE AND PROCEDURE

The purpose of this hearing will be for the Commission to take final action to determine the need, pursuant to Section 403.519, Florida Statutes, for the electrical power plant and related facilities proposed by Orlando Utilities Commission, Kissimmee Utility Authority, Florida Municipal Power Agency, and Southern Company-Florida, LLC., ("joint petitioners") for construction in Grange County, Florida. This proceeding shall allow the joint petitioners to present evidence and testimony in support of their petition for a determination of need for the proposed plant and related facilities; to permit any intervenors to present testimony and exhibits concerning this matter; to permit members of the public who are not parties to the need determination proceeding the opportunity to present testimony concerning this matter; and for such other purposes as the Commission may deem appropriate. All witnesses shall be subject to cross-examination at the condusion of their testimony.

The proceedings will be governed by the provisions of Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, Section 403.519, Florida Statutes, and Chapters 25-22 and 25-106, Florida Administrative Code.

Under Section 403.519, the Commission is the sale forum for the determination of need for the electrical power plant and associated facilities. In making its determination, the Commission must take into account the need for electric system reliability and integrity, the need for adequate electricity at a reasonable cost, and whether the proposed plant is the most cost-effective alternative available. In addition, the Commission must expressly consider the conservation measures taken by or reasonably available to the applicants which might mitigate the need for the proposed plant and may consider other matters within its jurisdiction which it deems relevant. The Commission's determination of need for the Orange County facility shall create a presumption of public need and necessity and shall serve as the Commission's report required by Subsection 403.507(2)(a)(2), Florida Statutes. An order entered by the Commission pursuant to this hearing shall constitute final agency action.

Only issues relating to the need for the power plant and related facilities will be heard at the April 23-24,2001, hearing. Separate public hearings will be held before the Division of Administrative Hearings at a later date to consider environmental and other impacts of the proposed plant and associated facilities.

Members of the public who are not parties to the need determination proceeding will have an opportunity to present testimony regarding the need for the proposed plant and associated facilities. All members of the public who wish to offer testimony should be present at the beginning of the hearing, 9:30 a.m., Monday, April 23, 2001. All witnesses will be sworn in and will be subject to cross-examination at the conclusion of their testimony.

Anyone wishing to become a party to the need determination proceeding should file an appropriate petition pursuant to Rule 25-22.039, Florida Administrative Code, with the Director of the Commission's Division of Records and Reporting at the address listed above. Copies of the petition should be sent by mail to all parties. Those wishing to intervene in these proceedings, unless appearing on their own behalf, must be represented by an attorney or other person who can be determined to be a qualified representative pursuant to Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, and Rule 28-106.106, Florida Administrative Code. Petitions for leave to intervene must be filed at least five (5) days before the final hearing, must conform with Rule 28-106.201(2), Florida Administrative Code, and must include allegations sufficient to demonstrate that the intervenor is entitled to participate in 'the proceeding as a matter of constitutional or statutory right or pursuant to Commission rule, or that the substantial interests of the intervenor are subject to determination or will be affected through the hearing.

GENERAL LOCATION AND PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed electrical power plant is estimated to produce 633 MW (nominal) of net generating capacity. The proposed plant is to be located at the Curtis H. Stanton Energy Center in eastern Orange County, Florida, approximately 4 3/4 miles south of Highway 50 and one mile north of the Bee Line Expressway. The proposed unit consists of two combustion turbine generators, two heat recovery steam generators, a steam turbine generator, cooling lower, water and wastewater treatment facilities, fuel oil and water storage tanks, and other related facilities. The proposed plant is estimated to commence commercial operation by October 1, 2003.
