#### Florida Digital Network, Inc.'s List of Issues

In accordance with the Florida Public Service Commission's March 30, 2001, Notice of Issues Identification Conference in the captioned docket, Florida Digital Network, Inc., ("FDN") hereby submits its list of issues as follows. Though not required, FDN has included herein preliminary positions for some of these issues:

#### Issue No. 1

Is it consistent with the public interest, convenience and necessity for BellSouth to receive the authorization requested?

#### FDN Position:

No. BellSouth engages in a pattern and practice of anti-competitive behaviors including, but not limited to, (1) predatory "promotional" pricing targeted at CLEC customers identified through use of customer proprietary network information and (2) the failure to provide CLECs service at parity with the service BellSouth provides itself. Moreover, if UNE prices for voice and data services are set at levels too close to the rates BellSouth charges for retail residential service, there will never be competition in the residential market in Florida, so awarding BellSouth the authorization requested here will only serve to perpetuate BellSouth's monopoly in the residential market. Nor is it in the public interest for BellSouth to be awarded the authorization requested while BellSouth impedes

## Issue No. 2

Does BellSouth provide or generally offer interconnection in accordance with the requirements of sections 251(c)(2) and 252(d)(1) of the Act?

#### FDN Position:

No.

#### Issue No. 3

Does BellSouth provide or generally offer nondiscriminatory access to network elements in accordance with sections 251(c)(3) and 252(d)(1) of the Act?

#### FDN Position:

No. BellSouth does not provide or offer service at parity with what it provides itself. Move orders are a prime example of this. BellSouth can move one of its own customers from one location to another in 3 business days, but BellSouth does not even come close to three days' service on CLEC customer move orders. BellSouth's systems do not lift local service preferred carrier freezes even where the customer has followed the FCC requirements for lifting the freeze; this precludes customers from migrating to CLEC service when and how desired. Further, there is no "just and reasonable rate" for network elements if UNE prices for voice and data services are set at levels too close to the rates BellSouth charges for retail residential service, thereby foreclosing local competition.

## Issue No. 4

Because BellSouth does not permit CLECs to resell BellSouth-provided xDSL service to end-users that receive CLEC voice service, does BellSouth fail to make telecommunications services available for resale in accordance with sections 251(c)(4) and 252(d)(3) of the Act?

#### FDN Position:

Yes.

In addition, FDN hereby adopts and incorporates herein the lists of issues submitted by the other competitive local exchange carriers that are parties to this docket.
