Dear Ms. Daniel:

Please consider this letter a supplement to my March 30, 2001 letter answering questions raised in your February 12, 2001 letter to me.

The unanswered questions pertain to paragraph 6 (water meters) and paragraph 7 (water and wastewater tariffs) and will be answered in the order presented:

6. <u>Water Meters</u>.

6.A. What was the cost to originally install meters at Forest Lake Estates (the mobile home park)?

Answer: The cost to install meters was not separately broken out in the books and records but was included as part of the overall cost of the facility.

6.B. When was the installation of the meters completed?

Answer: It is our understanding that the meters were installed in phases with the meters being completed in 2001.

6.C. What, if anything, were the residents at Forest Lake Estates (the mobile home park) charged for the meter installations?

Lutz, Webb, Bobo & Eastman is a part of Lutz, Webb & Bobo, P.A. DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE

Answer: It is our belief that the residents of Forest Lake Estates were not charged separately for meter installations.

6.D. Since Forest Lake Estates is fully metered, why weren't usage rates implemented before the sale of the mobile home park to the resident owned cooperative in June of 1999?

Answer: It is believed that at least from December, 1997, the residents were charged a flat rate for utility services as part of their lease arrangement with the owner of the mobile home park and, under such arrangement, usage rates were not applicable. As Mr. Viau has passed away, we can only surmise that the park intended at some point in the future to file with the Public Service Commission for a certificate of authority and to implement usage rates. The mobile home park was sold before such action was taken.

6.E. Is there a master meter to Forest Lake R.V. Resort (R.V. Park)? If so, please provide the meter size.

Answer: The meter size is 6".

6.F. What is Labrador's current plan, if any, for meter installation for the lots at Forest Lake R.V. Resort (the "R.V. Park")?

Answer: No current plan, although this will be reviewed as part of the staff assisted rate case.

7. Water and Wastewater Tariffs.

7.A. Cost allocation. Please provide a description as to how the allocation for combined water and wastewater services for mobile home lots and R.V. lots was determined.

Answer: In the absence of Mr. Viau, we were unable to determine the exact methodology that went into the allocation, but we believe that it is based on the disparity in usage as well as market conditions. I enclose an income statement prepared by Regulatory Consultants, Inc. showing the allocation between water and wastewater services. (Please note that the income statement total revenue figures reflects 100% occupancy and 100% payment.) We believe that the costs for the provision of water and sewer service in the attached income statement prepared by Regulatory Consultants, Inc. is substantially correct. The income statement and supporting schedule shows in detail how the allocation for water and wastewater service can be justified.

7.B. Rate differentiation.

Answer: According to the attached meter readings for the 21 months between July 1999 to March 1, 2001, 84,841,000 gallons were pumped from the main meter for the park (including both mobile home and R.V. sections). The average monthly flow from the R.V. master meter indicates that the flow for the 9 months from July 9, 2000 to April 2, 2001 was 1,616,000, for an average monthly flow of 179,555 gallons $(1,616,000 \div 9 \text{ months})$. Taking the 4,040,047 gallons per month $(84,841,000 \div 21 \text{ months})$ used by the entire project and subtracting out the 179,555 gallons average monthly R.V. usage, we are left with a monthly mobile home park usage of 3,860,492 gallons per month. These usage figures show that the mobile home lots use substantially greater water and wastewater than the R.V. lots, justifying the higher per lot charge.

7.C. Other Tariff Corrections.

Answer: We will forward the corrected tariffs to the PSC next week.

8. Flat Rates. As an update, I have been in contact with Troy Rendell of the PSC and have obtained from him required forms for the filing of a staff assisted rate case. The form has been forwarded to our consultant at Regulatory Consultants, Inc. and we will be working together to file this application for a staff assisted rate case at the earliest possible date.

I believe this answers the questions raised as to water meters and wastewater tariffs. If other information is required, please advise.
