



Dear Terry;

The purchaser has reviewed the aged receivables received by your recent facelmile transmission and has additional questions. The Ambrosia and Babcock accounts (which together represent nearly all of the over 90-day balance) are current Park residents; what efforts, if any, has Florida Water Services instituted to collect those accounts? The Transmell and Hypes accounts are listed as closed; why are they included when the purchaser would have no ability to pursue the amounts dua?

The purchaser believes that a closing effective June 1, 2001, is imperative. Given that the assets being acquired do not include the business, billing, or malling address for FWS, it again seems more prudent to simply notify all residents, during the month of April, that billings for services received prior to June 1 are to be paid to FWS, and billings for services received on or after June 1 are to be paid to the purchaser. That approach remains our preference and seems imminently reasonable.

If FWS wants the purchaser to take over receivables, then again, as I stated most recently in my letter of March 6, we need to know what amount (percentage) it expects to receive. We also need the information requested above to make an informed judgment about the likelihood of collecting those receivables that FWS has allowed to reach substantial size and ago.
