This letter is in response to our recent telephone conversation regarding the Eagle Ridge and Cross Creek wastewater systems. Below is a brief discussion of your three issues.

Should the depreciated cost of the service lines and laterals be deducted from the original cost finding in the March 29, 2001 Original Cost Study?

Yes. Attached is a letter from Mr. Seidman that contains the revised net depreciated cost of the Cross Creek system. The Original Cost Study will not be re-issued.

When did Utilities, Inc. of Eagle Ridge begin providing reuse and at what rate?

The reuse system was in service prior to Utilities, Inc.'s ownership. The reuse effluent is provided to the golf course at no cost.

Should Utilities, Inc. of Eagle Ridge be required to file a reuse tariff showing a zero rate?

Yes.

Dear Carl:

On March 28, I transmitted to you, copies of the final report: ORIGINAL COST STUDY - CROSS CREEK WASTEWATER COLLECTION SYSTEM - ASSETS NOT INCLUDED IN PSC AUDIT. In that report, I included the value for service lines and laterals serving single family homes. Since that time I have been made aware of an amendment to the Asset Purchase Agreement that specifically excludes all service lines and service laterals from the purchase. The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the effect of that amendment on the original cost of the assets purchased.

In my report, the cost of service lines and laterals is shown, in summary, in Table 2 as the line item identified as Account 363, Services to Customers. The cost of service lines and laterals is shown in detail in Tables 3, 4 and 5 as Service Connection Assemblies under Account 363. The trended original cost, accumulated depreciation and depreciated cost of Account 363 need to be removed to reflect the cost of the utility collection system without service lines and laterals.

The revised cost of the collection system, without service lines and laterals, is:
