



Item No. (1)

This information shows the CSA negotiated electric rate for the CISR customer. Disclosure of this information to a competitor would be detrimental to the CISR customer. This would also have a chilling effect on Tampa Electric's ability to negotiate CSAs with other future at-risk customers. As such this information is entitled to confidential protection under Section 366.093, Florida Statutes.

Item No. (2)

This CISR information shows the revenues from another CISR customer. A competitor of the customer could use this information to "back into" the negotiated CSA rate, to the detriment of the CISR customer. This would also have a chilling effect on Tampa Electric's ability to negotiate CSAs with other future at-risk customers. As such this information is entitled to confidential protection under Section 366.093, Florida Statutes.

Item No. (3)

This information shows the escalation rate of the CISR customer's negotiated CSA rate. Disclosure of this information to a competitor would be detrimental to the CISR customer. This would also have a chilling effect on Tampa Electric's ability to negotiate CSAs with other future at-risk customers. As such this information is entitled to confidential protection under Section 366.093, Florida Statutes.
