SECTION 63.71 APPLICATION

BroadBand Office Communications, Inc. ("BBOC"), hereby requests authority, pursuant to Section 214 (a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, and Section 63.71 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, to discontinue the provision of interstate common carrier services within the United States.

BBOC is a non-dominant provider of interstate common carrier telecommunications services. BBOC operates pursuant to the Federal Communications Commission's ("Commission's") blanket authority under Section 63.01 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.01.

BBOC provides the following interstate services: outbound long distance (1+) service; inbound toll-free number service; travel service; directory assistance service; audio conferencing; operator services; dedicated leased line; and DSL service.

(2) Brief description of the dates and methods of notice to all affected customers:

On May 9, 2001, the parent company of BBOC, BroadBand Office, Inc. ("BBO"), filed for protection under Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code in the U.S. District Court of Delaware.¹ On May 10, 2001, BBO sent a notice to all customers in the United States indicating that it had filed bankruptcy and intended to discontinue service to all customers.² On June 21, 2001, BBO sent a second notice to all customers indicating that all services will be discontinued.

(3) Whether the carrier is considered dominant or non-dominant with respect to the discontinued service:

Applicant is considered non-dominant.

(4) BBOC certifies that all of the information contained in this application is accurate.


