SECTION 63.71 APPLICATION

Opus Correctional, Inc. d/b/a LocTel ("Opus" or "Applicant") hereby requests authority pursuant to Section 214(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act"), 47 U.S.C. § 214(a), and Section 63.71 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, to discontinue the provision of U.S. domestic telecommunications services in the states of Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Washington, and West Virginia.

By way of background, Opus made a necessary business decision to discontinue providing telecommunications service in the states listed herein. Opus does not have any customers in any state, so notice will not be provided to any customers. Opus has been assigned to an attorney for the benefit of creditors.

Applicant provides the following information in support of this Application pursuant to Section 63.71 of the Commission's Rules.

I. SECTION 63.71(a) INFORMATION

(1) Name and address of carrier:

Opus Correctional, Inc. d/b/a LocTel 119 Herbert Street Framingham, MA 01702

(2) Date of planned service discontinuance, reduction or impairment:

Opus' customer contracts expired, and were not renewed by any customer, prior to September 4, 2000 (see dates listed below for each state). Opus has not served any customers nor solicited new customers since that time.

(3) **Points of geographic areas affected:**

The areas affected are all locations served by Opus in the states of Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Washington, and West Virginia.

(4) Brief description of type of service affected:

Opus seeks authority to discontinue its authority to provide U.S. domestic interstate services in the states of Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Washington, and West Virginia.

II. NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Opus does not currently have any customers in the states in which it is discontinuing its

authority to provide telecommunications service. Therefore, Opus will not notify any customers.

Opus certifies that concurrent with the filing of this Application, Opus is submitting a copy of the Application to the public utility commissions and governors of the states listed above and to the Special Assistant for Telecommunications for the Secretary of Defense as required by Section 63.71(a) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a). (*See* attached Certificate of Service.)

III. REGULATORY STATUS

Opus is regulated as a non-dominant carrier with respect to each domestic interstate telecommunications service that it seeks authority to discontinue.

IV. CONCLUSION

Opus hereby states that this termination of service is reasonable, necessary and not unduly disruptive to the present or future public convenience and necessity. Opus does not currently serve any customers, therefore, the public will not be unduly harmed by Opus' withdrawal. Moreover, the public has access to other telecommunications carriers that have the ability to provide these customers with comparable telecommunications services at competitive prices.

For the foregoing reasons, Opus respectfully requests, pursuant to Section 214(a) of the Act, 47 U.S.C. § 214(a), and Section 63.71 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, that the Commission approve its Section 63.71 Application to discontinue the provision of U.S. domestic interstate telecommunications service.
