PETITION OF TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY

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Tampa Electric Company ("Tampa Electric" or "company"), hereby petitions the Commission for approval of the company's proposals concerning fuel and purchased power factors, capacity cost factors, generating performance incentive factors, and the projected wholesale sales incentive benchmark set forth herein, and in support thereof, says:

Fuel and Purchased Power Factors

1. Tampa Electric projects a fuel and purchased power net true-up amount for the period January 1, 2001 through December 31, 2001 will be an under-recovery of \$88,672,735. (See Exhibit No. ____ (JDJ-3), Document No. 2, Schedule E1-C).

2. The company's projected expenditures for the period January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002, when adjusted for the proposed GPIF reward and true-up under-recovery amount and spread over projected kilowatt-hour sales for the period January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002, produce a fuel and purchased power factor for the new period of 3.301 cents per kWh before application of the factors which adjust for variations in line losses. (See Exhibit No. __ (JDJ-3), Document No. 2, Schedule E1-E).

3. The company's projected benchmark level for calendar year 2002 for gains on non-separated wholesale energy sales eligible for the shareholder incentive as set forth by Order

DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE 1 1 8 0 9 SEP 20 5 FPSC-CONMISSION CLERK No. PSC-00-1744-PAA-EI, in Docket No. 991779 is \$2,283,019, as provided in the direct testimony of Tampa Electric witness J. Denise Jordan.

Capacity Cost Factor

4. Tampa Electric estimates that its net true-up amount applicable for the period January 1, 2001 through December 31, 2001 will be an under-recovery of \$5,560,103, as shown in Exhibit No. (JDJ-3), Document No. 1, page 2 of 3.

5. The company's projected expenditures for the period January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002, when adjusted for the true-up under-recovery amount and spread over projected kilowatt-hour sales for the new period January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002 produce a capacity cost recovery factor for the period of 0.296 cents per kWh before applying the 12 CP and 1/13 allocation methodology. This will produce the capacity cost recovery factors by rate schedule as set forth in Exhibit No. ____ (JDJ-3), Document No. 1, page 3 of 3.

<u>GPIF</u>

6. Tampa Electric has calculated that it is subject to a GPIF reward of \$1,095,745 (adjusted to include a regulatory assessment fee of 1/12 of 1%) for performance experienced during the period January 1, 2000 through December 31, 2000.

7. The company is also proposing GPIF targets and ranges for the period January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002 with such proposed targets and ranges being detailed in the testimony and exhibits of Tampa Electric witness George A. Keslowsky filed herewith.

Other Issues

8. The testimony of Tampa Electric's witnesses also addresses certain generic and Tampa Electric specific issues identified in Attachment A to the Commission's Second Order Revising Order Establishing Procedures, issued September 11, 2001. WHEREFORE, Tampa Electric Company requests that its proposals relative to fuel and purchased power cost recovery, capacity cost recovery and GPIF be approved as they relate to prior period true-up calculations and projected cost recovery charges, and that the Commission approve the company's projected wholesale sales incentive benchmark.
