ISSUE 1: Should AT&T's Motion to Investigate BellSouth's Conduct in the OSS Testing (Motion) be granted?

RECOMMENDATION: No. Staff believes that AT&T's Motion to Investigate BellSouth's Conduct in the OSS Testing should be denied. Staff has investigated AT&T's allegation that BellSouth's preferential treatment of certain LSRs had an adverse impact on the Florida OSS test. Staff has concluded that the impact on the Florida test is nonexistent. In addition, staff believes that BellSouth is clearly required to notify ALECs of ALEC-

affecting changes relating to LENS, EDI, TAG, TAFI, ECFA and CSOTS. However, none of these systems have been retired. Therefore, staff believes that there is no reason for concern that the results of the Florida OSS test may lack integrity or be tainted.
