Dear Patti:

There is a small wastewater only system in Bonita Springs which holds Public Service Commission Certificate 281-S and known as "Bonita Country Club Utilities, Inc." We represent Bonita Springs Utilities ("BSU"), which is a large, not-for-profit cooperative water and wastewater utility, which generates in excess of \$20 million per annum in revenues and which provides service within its approximate 50 square mile franchise area. Bonita Country Club Utilities, Inc. serves a singular community, and is surrounded on all sides by BSU.

In conformance with the policy of the State of Florida, the Comprehensive Plan of Lee County, and the obligations imposed on it pursuant to the Franchise Agreement by and between Lee County and our client, BSU has, for the past 11 years, been in the process of eliminating as many as possible of the package-type wastewater plants within its franchise area, and converting the customers served thereby to the central system owned and operated by BSU. In excess of 50 such package plants have been taken off line in the last decade. Eventually, no doubt, the small package wastewater plant serving the Bonita Country Club community and owned by Bonita Country Club Utilities, Inc. will similarly be taken off line.

Our client has been advised that the assets of Bonita Country Club Utilities, Inc. may be in the process of being sold. In that event, a transfer application would, of legal necessity, be filed with your Commission.
