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FLORIDA POWER CORPORATION'S RESPONSE TO THE FLORIDA INDUSTRIAL POWER USERS GROUP'S SECOND REQUEST FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS TO FLORIDA POWER CORPORATION

Pursuant to § 350.0611(1), Fla. Stat. (2000), Fla. Admin. Code R. 28-106.206, and Fla. R. Civ. P.1.350, Florida Power Corporation ("FPC") responds to The Florida Industrial Power Users Group's ("FIPUG") Second Request for Production of documents subject to the previously filed general and specific objections and states as follows:

DOCUMENTS REQUESTED

33. Referring to Schedule A-5, page 3 of 5, provide detailed calculations and workpapers supporting the development of each of the proposed interruptible service demand and energy charges.

There are no additional calculations or workpapers other than those contained in the MFR's Section E - Rate Schedules. FPC will produce a table that provides the sequence and references the appropriate MFR schedule for developing the proposed interruptible service base rate charges.

Provide all supporting workpapers for the calculation of the break-even point, in terms of hours of operation, between the installation of incremental peaking vs. baseload generation capacity on the Company's system, based on the Company's forecast of capital and operating costs for such units.

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FPC will produce documents responsive to this request.

35. Provide workpapers supporting the Company's allocation of credits associated with non-firm service in its proposed cost of service study.

As stated in the answer to Question 31 of FIPUG Second Set of Interrogatories, the Company does not recover the costs for credits associated with non-firm service in base rates, and therefore no related costs are included in the proposed cost of service study. The Company does seek recovery of these type credits through the Energy Conservation Cost Recovery (ECCR) clause. Allocations of the cost of credits to rate classes for purposes of calculating the ECCR charges are provided in Schedule E-17 Supplement, Schedule F, on pages 196, 198, and 200 of the MFR volume containing Section E-Rate Schedules, filed on November 15, 2001.
