2	CHAIRMAN JABER: Good morning.
3	MS. HELTON: Good morning.
4	CHAIRMAN JABER: Let's go ahead and get started.
5	Ms. Helton, there is a notice to be read.
6	MS. HELTON: Pursuant to notice issued by the
7	Commission on January the 25th, 2002, the hearing for Docket
8	Number 000824-EI was called for this time and place. The
9	purpose of the hearing is more fully set out in the notice.
10	CHAIRMAN JABER: Let's take appearances. Mr. Beck,
11	are you the first person?
12	MR. BECK: Jack Shreve and Charlie Beck, Office of
13	the Public Counsel, appearing on behalf of Florida citizens.
14	MR. McGEE: James McGee, appearing on behalf of
15	Florida Power Corporation.
16	MR. TWOMEY: Mike Twomey on behalf of Bud Hansen and

22	CHAIRMAN JABER: Before we get to Staff, are there
23	any other parties that need to make appearances? Okay. Staff?
24	MS. HELTON: Mary Anne Helton, Bob Elias, Rosanne
25	Gervasi, Adrienne Vining and Jennifer Brubaker on behalf of the

Florida Public Service Commission. 1 2 CHAIRMAN JABER: Thank you. Ms. Helton, I understand 3 there are, there is a preliminary matter that we must take up first this morning. 4 5 MS. HELTON: That's correct. This morning the 6 parties filed a Joint Motion To Postpone Scheduled Hearings. 7 It's my understanding that late yesterday afternoon they reached a settlement of the, of the case in spirit and they 8 9 need time to put that to writing. 10 CHAIRMAN JABER: Okay. Let's see. Mr. Shreve, do you want to sort of summarize the motion and bring us 11 12 up-to-date? MR. SHREVE: Basically that's it. We'd just like to 13 have the hearing postponed. And I would want to mention that 14 we don't have all the parties on because we didn't realize 15 everybody was going, didn't think everybody would be able to be 16 17 here. I didn't understand that Mr. Twomey was going to be 18 here, and it's my understanding that he agrees with this motion 19 20 MR. TWOMEY: Yes. 21 MR. SHREVE: -- and would have signed on, if we'd 22

known he was going to be here.

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Beyond that, we'd just like the time to go ahead and put everything in writing.

·CHAIRMAN JABER: All right. But your representation

1 is all the parties agree with the motion to postpone the 2 hearing? 3 MR. SHREVE: Yes. That's correct. 4 CHAIRMAN JABER: Commissioners, what's your pleasure? 5 I could take up a motion from one of you right now and we could 6 vote on this. 7 MS. HELTON: Chairman Jaber, before y'all vote --8 CHAIRMAN JABER: Yes. 9 MS. HELTON: -- maybe, there's two things maybe we should talk about. One is the date by which we should expect 10 11 to see a written settlement, and the other is if, on the off 12 chance, hopefully a very small percentage, that this does not work out, would there be a waiver of the 12-month clock? 13 CHAIRMAN JABER: When does the 12-month period 14 expire, Ms. Helton? 15 MS. HELTON: It's June, June 18th. 16 17 COMMISSIONER JABER: Okay. And basically what you're saying is if the Commission doesn't resolve ultimately the case 18 by June 18th, we'll need a waiver of the 12 months; right? 19 20 MS. HELTON: That's correct. 21 CHAIRMAN JABER: Florida Power Corporation, do you understand what Staff is bringing to your attention? 22 23 MR. McGEE: Exactly. Yes. I talked to Mr., to Bob 24 Elias, and he explained that to me and we're certainly willing 25 to cooperate on that.

CHAIRMAN JABER: And, Ms. Helton, with respect to when the settlement will be put to writing, Mr. Shreve, Power Corp, do you have any idea of when a written settlement will be filed?

MR. SHREVE: Well, we're going to do that just as soon as we can. We plan to work on it right away this week.

CHAIRMAN JABER: I'd just ask that you keep our Staff posted.

MR. SHREVE: Be glad to. Certainly.

CHAIRMAN JABER: And obviously the prehearing officer in the case through Staff.

Questions, Commissioners?

commissioner DEASON: No, Madam Chairman. Just let me say that I think this is a very, very positive step. I know that we have, the Commission has encouraged the parties to try to reach a settlement, if possible, realizing that in some cases it can be and in some cases it cannot. But apparently it's obvious that a lot of hard work and effort have been put into this and we anxiously await to see the final product. And, of course, we will reserve judgment on that until we see it. But given that all the parties agree that this hearing needs to be delayed or hopefully eliminated altogether, I think that we should grant the motion and give the parties sufficient time to put the stipulation into writing and have it filed with the Commission.

MR. McWHIRTER: Madam Chairman, I think it would be helpful if you would give us a date certain. We've got hearing dates scheduled for this proceeding. There are three days this week and two days next week. I would suggest to you that you give us a time when you want to see the written agreement. And then if you don't get it by then, we go forward with the hearings that are scheduled for next Wednesday.

CHAIRMAN JABER: Now, Mr. McWhirter, I understand why you would ask that. Obviously there's, there is something to be said about certainty. But I think it's premature to put that sort of restriction on all of you.

I'm going to give you the flexibility to work out the terms of the settlement and count on your professionalism to bring this back to us as soon as possible. If we believe it's taken longer than reasonable, the prehearing officer is quite capable of issuing an order subsequent to the vote today. But I think it's premature today.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Well, Madam Chairman, I was -- before Mr. McWhirter brought it up, I was going to, I was going to offer up if it wouldn't be prudent to at least set a preliminary date.

And here's my concerns. Schedules being what they are, logistics being what they are, I think we, we've got a critical mass here that we shouldn't, that we shouldn't let up on. And I'm really, I'm concerned about letting go next week's

dates too easily. And, and it seems that in order to keep, in order to keep all the effort moving, we can go ahead and, I'd be willing to give 'til Friday as a preliminary date to have something in writing back to the Commission. And, as you said, the prehearing officer can, can also take over that flexibility. I mean, if it needs to be extended on a day-to-day basis or an extra couple of days or so on, but I don't know that I'm too comfortable giving up next week's dates. And, again, not strong feelings, but certainly just a minor --

CHAIRMAN JABER: Obviously -- right. I mean, obviously I've got a feeling for how the calendar looks, so I don't share your concern about giving up those dates. I know that my wonderful office -- JoAnn has thought through what dates are available and there are dates available. We can work through those issues.

But let me do this. Let me ask the parties, how much time do you think you need? Is Friday an unreasonable deadline?

MR. HABERMEYER: Madam Chair, Florida Power Corporation, Bill Habermeyer. I would say that we're certainly willing to work will all dispatch toward a date of Friday.

MR. SHREVE: I think that's true. I think all the parties plan to expedite this. We want to get it in writing as quickly as we can so that we know we have an understanding.

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And, of course, beyond -- once we get that. I think then at that point we'll wait for your approval of it and you'll let us know when you want to take that up.

I don't see any problems with us being able to -- I mean, if we were to not be able to put it in writing, we're going to know guickly whether we can or not. I don't see any problems at all. And I think we all want to expedite it. We're going ahead and work on it right away.

CHAIRMAN JABER: Okay. All right. Well, let's, Commissioners, in your motion -- and actually I think I heard Commissioner Deason make a motion. Why don't we add also Friday as the date, close of business, to file the settlement.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: And I guess --

MR. SHREVE: Commissioner, if I could, there may, and this would not be a party for us -- I think it might be better if we didn't have the date set by the Commission to file it because I think Florida Power has some things that they, a concern they have with notice given to the FCC. And I think we have already discussed that and are trying to work around that. I think if we could represent you by the end of, to you by the end of the week that we have it in writing and then, then I don't think the timing is a problem.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Well. Madam Chairman --

CHAIRMAN JABER: That goes to my point. That brings us right back where we started. I'm not concerned about the

time frame.

wanted to do was to try and create some or lend some kind of guidance. I mean, my concern is over losing, over losing dates that we already have set up and losing preparation time and having to restart that whole thing in the event that the settlement can't be reduced to writing within a reasonable time. It's not my intent to put a hard and fast date on when, when they have to have a filing, but certainly to let everybody, I guess, let everybody be thinking about coming up with a yea or nay, whether this is going to happen or not. And I guess in the interest of not losing all the momentum that we have now, you know, for a hearing, I hope that it doesn't get to that and, given every representation that's been made here, that may well be the case. But we certainly --

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Let me, let me ask this question. Can we just leave it open with the understanding that we're continuing this hearing until the 27th unless we have a stipulation in writing? And if we do get one filed in writing, well, then the hearing for the 27th and 28th would also, would be, would be eliminated. Is that, would that meet your concerns that we don't give up those two days next week?

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yeah. That seems to be a more moderate way of saying, you know, make use of the time that you have. I mean, we, in a way we're fortunate to have a split

hearing, have split hearing dates.

CHAIRMAN JABER: Commissioners, I can -- you know, I can tell you that I'm not going to give up those dates. So it's not like the dates are going anywhere. It's not that I don't understand your concern. I guess I don't, I'm not fully appreciating it. But it's not like those dates are going to go away.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: I think it's more kind of just notice at this point, recognizing that those dates have been set and by granting this motion we're not eliminating that and everybody is still on notice that unless a written stipulation is filed, we will convene on, at 9:30 on the 27th and go forward with a hearing.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: I think that seems -- that takes care of our concern.

MR. SHREVE: And we, we, of course, will keep -- if we find out for some reason that we can't reduce it to writing, that we have something we haven't agreed on, we'll notify you and the Staff immediately. And even though we put it in writing and have to time the date that we actually file it, we'll keep you apprised of when we have it in writing and try and also go ahead and give the Staff some advanced notice and heads-up, as we have done in the past, so that they'll be a little better prepared.

I really don't see any problem, and I think what

you're saying we can work around without any trouble at all and we'll keep y'all apprised of that.

CHAIRMAN JABER: Okay. Sounds good.

MR. SHREVE: If I could, I would like to say one thing. It's been good working with Mr. Habermeyer, Vinnie Dolan and Jim McGee, and it has been a long, one of the longest in trying to put together a settlement on this. And we're very pleased, I think both sides are pleased with what we have. And I would also like to mention that all the parties have been very cooperative. John McWhirter really did well, Mike Twomey, Ron LaFace, Tom Cloud. It's just been a good partnership in working everything out. We appreciate the Commission's indulgence at this time and we think we have a good product.

CHAIRMAN JABER: Thank you, Mr. Shreve.

MR. HABERMEYER: And in response, Madam Chair, I would say that on our side we certainly also are pleased with the encouragement that you have given us to move to this settlement, I think that's been a key factor in how we've proceeded, and also the cooperative extension on the part of all the parties to this particular matter.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Well, Madam Chairman, let me say that I also would like to recognize, as we're recognizing folks, our Staff. I think they have been an element in this process to facilitate and I want to know that their work has not gone unnoticed as well.

MR. SHREVE: As a matter of fact, I'd like to mention one other thing, too, as long as we're at it.

The Commission opened this docket. This wasn't one that anyone else brought someone in. So because you opened the docket, we proceeded and worked through the case. I think all the information has been provided and reviewed as you wanted. You wanted to go over the information, called for the docket to be opened. We've reviewed it, gone through it, and I think you deserve the credit for that because we wouldn't be at this point had you not opened the docket and working with the Staff.

And I would also like to thank Charlie Beck, Earl
Poucher and Don Hale of my office because they have been
putting this case together and allowed me to go ahead and work
on it. They deserve most of the credit from us.

But we appreciate you bringing the docket open and giving us all an opportunity to work on it.

CHAIRMAN JABER: Thank you. There's been a motion. I need a second.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Second.

CHAIRMAN JABER: Motion and a second to accept, to actually grant the motion to postpone the scheduled hearing with the informal understanding that if it doesn't work out and settlement isn't reached, we'll pick up the hearing on March 27th.

All those in favor, say aye. Opposed, nay.

(Simultaneous affirmative vote.)

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settlement.

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CHAIRMAN JABER: This is approved unanimously.

Now it's my turn to say things to the parties and Staff and to my colleagues. Good settlements are in the public interest, and I'm expecting to see a good settlement because I know the individual parties and the people that have participated and I wouldn't expect anything less than a good

I hope it works out; not for you all necessarily, but for the citizens of the State of Florida. The fact is settlements that are good benefit the consumer at the end of the day because we spare them from costly litigation. So you are to be commended.

But my colleagues are to be commended, too. The fact is we did send a strong message, and I'm very proud of that message, and it's one that we sent in a unified fashion. And it doesn't get better than that.

Staff, you never let us down. You are absolutely brilliant in your facilitation and your data gathering. You need to keep up the good work and you need to know that we're behind you in your efforts.

Good day. Hope to see you not on March 27th but on a later day where we ultimately decide the settlement. Thanks.
