125-6.0345Safety Standards for Construction of New2Transmission and Distribution Facilities.

In compliance with Chapter 366.04(6)(b) F.S., 1991, the (1)3 Commission adopts and incorporates by reference the 2002 1997 4 edition of the National Electrical Safety Code (ANSI C-2), 5 published August 1, 2001 August 1, 1996, as the applicable safety 6 standards for transmission and distribution facilities subject to 7 the Commission's safety jurisdiction. Each public electric 8 utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric system 9 10 shall comply with the standards in these provisions. Standards contained in the 2002 1997 edition shall be applicable to new 11 construction for which a work order number is assigned on or after 12 the effective date of this rule. 13

Each public electric utility, rural electric cooperative (2)14 and municipal electric utility shall report all completed electric 15 work orders, whether completed by the utility or one of its 16 contractors, at the end of each quarter of the year. The report 17 shall be filed with the Director of the Commission's Division of 18 Auditing and Safety Electric and Gas no later than the 30th working 19 day after the last day of the reporting quarter, and shall contain, 20 at a minimum, the following information for each work order: 21

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(a) work order number/project/job;

- (c) estimated cost in dollars, rounded to nearest thousand.

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In its guarterly report, each utility shall identify all 1 (4)distribution facilities subject transmission and to the 2 Commission's safety jurisdiction, and shall certify to the 3 Commission that they meet or exceed the applicable standards. 4 Compliance inspections by the Commission shall be made on a random 5 6 basis or as appropriate.

7 (5) As soon as practicable, but by the end of the next 8 business day after it learns of the occurrence, each public 9 utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric utility 10 shall (without admitting liability) report to the Commission any 11 accident occurring in connection with any part of its transmission 12 or distribution facilities which:

(a) Involves death or injury requiring hospitalization ofnonutility persons; or

(b) Is significant from a safety standpoint in the judgment
of the utility even though it is not required by (a).

(6) Each public utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric utility shall (without admitting liability) report each accident or malfunction, occurring in connection with any part of its transmission or distribution facilities, to the Commission within 30 days after it learns of the occurrence, provided the accident or malfunction:

(a) Involves damage to the property of others in an amount in
excess of \$5000; or

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(b) Causes significant damage in the judgment of the utility

SUMMARY: The amendment changes the 1997 edition of the National Electrical Safety Code to the 2002 Edition. STATEMENT OF FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES JUSTIFYING RULE

Rule 25-6.0345 lists the 1997 edition of the NESC as the electric safety standard for the State

of Florida. In order to meet the requirements of Chapter 366.04(6)(b), F.S., the 2002 edition of the

NESC must be reviewed and adopted in Rule 25-6.0345.

STATEMENT ON FEDERAL STANDARDS

There is no federal standard on the same subject.
