#### CASE BACKGROUND

 April 24, 2000 - Orion Telecommunications Corp. d/b/a Orion Telecommunications Corp. of New York (Orion) submitted an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (certificate) to the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission). Docket No. 000477-TI was opened to address the issue.

• August 9, 2000 - Orion requested that its application in Docket No. 000477-TI be withdrawn without prejudice and staff closed the docket.

- July 9, 2001, through August 21, 2001 Staff investigated a complaint from a Florida consumer regarding prepaid calling services offered by Orion through the "Florida Supreme". prepaid phone card and determined that Orion was providing prepaid calling services within Florida.
- August 22, 2001 Staff opened Docket No. 011140-TI to initiate a show cause proceeding against Orion for providing prepaid calling services without a certificate.
- November 06, 2001 The Commission issued Order No. PSC-01-2181-SC-TI in Docket No. 011140-TI, in which Orion was ordered to show cause why it should not be fined \$25,000 for its apparent violation of Rule 25-24.910, Florida Administrative Code.
- November 07, 2001, through December 07, 2001 Staff and counsel for Orion negotiated a settlement to resolve the show cause proceeding.
- December 17, 2001 The Commission received Orion's proposed settlement offer (Attachment A), dated December 13, 2001.
- December 19, 2001 Orion submitted an application for a certificate to provide interexchange telecommunications company (IXC) services and staff opened Docket No. 011661-TI.
- May 9, 2002 Orion submitted a copy of its certificate of reinstatement (Attachment B) from the Florida Secretary of State.

The Commission is vested with jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Sections 364.285, 364.33, 364.335, and 364.337, Florida Statutes. Accordingly, staff believes the following recommendations are appropriate.

#### DISCUSSION OF ISSUES

ISSUE 1: Should the Commission accept Orion Telecommunications Corp. d/b/a Orion Telecommunications Corp. of New York's settlement proposal, dated December 13, 2001, including a voluntary payment of \$20,000, to resolve the show cause proceeding in Docket No. 011440-TI for the apparent violation of Rule 25-24.910, Florida Administrative Code, Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity Required?

The Commission should RECOMMENDATION: Yes. accept Telecommunications Corp. d/b/a Orion Telecommunications Corp. of New York's settlement proposal, dated December 13, 2001, including a voluntary payment of \$20,000, which was submitted with its settlement proposal, to resolve the show cause proceeding in Docket No. 011440-TI for the apparent violation of Rule 25-24.910, Florida Administrative Code, Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity Required. The Commission should forward the voluntary payment to the Office of the Comptroller for deposit in the State General Revenue Fund pursuant to Section 364.285(1), Florida Statutes. (Buys, W. Knight)

STAFF ANALYSIS: On December 17, 2001, the Commission received Orion's settlement proposal to resolve the show cause proceeding in Docket No. 011140-TI. In its settlement offer, Orion has proposed to do the following:

- File to obtain a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in the week of December 17, 2001.
- Represent that the "Florida Supreme" brand cards will be fully compliant with the rules and regulations of the Commission upon the Commission's approval of Orion's application for a Certificate.
- Make a voluntary payment to the General Revenue Fund in the amount of \$20,000.

Orion filed its application for a certificate on December 19, 2001, in Docket No. 011661-TI, which is addressed in Issue 2. Orion has represented that the "Florida Supreme" brand prepaid phone cards will be in compliance with the Commission's rules upon the Commission's approval of Orion's application for a certificate.

Orion submitted a check in the amount of \$20,000 with its settlement proposal.

Orion has completed two of the actions it proposed to resolve the apparent violation of Rule 25-24.910, Florida Administrative Code. Orion represents that cards sold after the Commission approves its application for certification will be fully compliant with the Commission's rules and regulations. If the Commission grants Orion a certificate, Orion's "Florida Supreme" branded prepaid phone cards should then be in compliance.

Based on the aforementioned, staff recommends that the Commission should accept Orion Telecommunications Corp. d/b/a Orion Telecommunications Corp. of New York's settlement proposal, dated December 13, 2001, including a voluntary payment of \$20,000, which was submitted with its settlement proposal, to resolve the show cause proceeding in Docket No. 011440-TI for the apparent violation of Rule 25-24.910, Florida Administrative Code, Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity Required. The Commission should forward the voluntary payment to the Office of the Comptroller for deposit in the State General Revenue Fund pursuant to Section 364.285(1), Florida Statutes.

<u>ISSUE 2</u>: Should the Commission grant Orion Telecommunications Corp. d/b/a Orion Telecommunications Corp. of New York a certificate to provide interexchange telecommunications services within the State of Florida in Docket No. 011661-TI?

RECOMMENDATION: Yes. The Commission should grant Orion Telecommunications Corp. d/b/a Orion Telecommunications Corp. of New York,

Florida Public Service Commission Certificate No. 8042,

to provide IXC services within the State of Florida in Docket No. 011661-TI. (J. Elliott, T. Williams)

<u>STAFF ANALYSIS</u>: Orion's application for a certificate to provide interexchange telecommunications services (Docket No. 011661-TI) is part of its proposed settlement offer to resolve the show cause proceeding in Docket No. 011140-TI.

Orion submitted its application to provide IXC telecommunications services on December 19, 2001. In its application, Orion satisfactorily met all of the Commission's requirements for certification. In addition, Orion signed an affidavit attesting to the fact that it has the technical, financial, and managerial qualifications to provide intrastate telecommunications services in Florida, as required in Section 364.337 (3), Florida Statutes.

Accordingly, staff recommends that Orion Telecommunications Corp. d/b/a Orion Telecommunications Corp. of New York should be granted a certificate to provide interexchange telecommunications services within the State of Florida in Docket No. 011661-TI.

ISSUE 3: Should Docket Nos. 011661-TI and 011140-TI be closed?

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Docket No. 011661-TI should be closed upon issuance of a Consummating Order unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the Commission's decision files a protest within 21 days of the issuance of the Proposed Agency Action Order.

Docket No. 011140-TI should be closed upon issuance of a Consummating Order unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the Commission's decision files a protest within 21 days of the issuance of the Proposed Agency Action Order. If the Commission denies staff's recommendation in Issue 1, Docket No. 011140-TI should remain open pending resolution of the show cause proceeding.

If the Commission denies staff's recommendation in Issue 1, Docket No. 011140-TI should remain open pending resolution of the show cause proceeding.

A protest in one docket should not prevent the action in a separate docket from becoming final.
