RE: Docket No. 020394-TC - Bankruptcy cancellation by Florida Public Service Commission of PATS Certificate No. 5012 issued to Crescent Public Communications, Inc., effective 4/30/02.

ISSUE 1: Should the Commission grant Crescent Public Communications, Inc.'s request for cancellation of its Pay Telephone Certificate No. 5012 due to bankruptcy?

RECOMMENDATION: Yes. The Commission should grant the company a bankruptcy cancellation of its Pay Telephone Certificate No. 5012 with an effective date of April 30, 2002. In addition, the Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services will be notified that the 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002 RAFs, including statutory penalty and interest charges for the years 1998, 1999, 2000, and 2001, should not be sent to the Comptroller's Office for collection, but that permission for the Commission to write off the uncollectible amount should be requested. If the certificate is cancelled in accordance with the Commission's Order from this recommendation, the company should be required to immediately cease and desist providing pay telephone service in Florida.
