Dear Mr. Reith:

The Regulatory Assessment Fee (RAF) is due by January 30<sup>th</sup> of each year for the preceding calendar year. For certificate holders, the RAF is owed even if a telecommunications company may not have started operations or had any revenues. If payment is made after the due date, then statutory penalty and interest charges are applicable.

Our records show the 2001 RAF return notice was mailed December 12, 2001, and a delinquent notice was mailed February 20, 2002. As of this date, our records do not show receipt of the RAF return or payment. A copy of the 2001 RAF return form is attached.

If full payment, including penalty and interest charges, along with the RAF return form, are not received by May 15, 2002, it is my intention to establish a docket and recommend that the Commission fine your company \$500 or cancel your certificate. Please note that once a docket has been established, **just paying the delinquent RAF amount will not prevent your certificate from being cancelled.**

If you wish to cancel your certificate voluntarily and leave in good standing with the Commission, your company should pay the past due amount in full, complete the 2001 RAF return form, either pay the 2002 RAF or provide a date certain it will be paid, and comply with the requirements of Rule 25-24.820, Florida Administrative Code, copy attached. Any unpaid RAFs, including penalty and interest charges, are turned over to the Comptroller's Office for collection if the Commission cancels a company's certificate on its own motion (involuntary cancellations).

**25-24.820 Revocation of a Certificate.**

One of the random audits we pulled for the 2000 RAF was for 2<sup>nd</sup> Century Communications, Inc. (TX262) The company reported intrastate revenues of \$110,601.03 and paid regulatory assessment fees of \$165.90. The staff auditor attempted to contact the company and was directed by a recorded message to call another phone number. At that phone number was a recorded message that "2<sup>nd</sup> Century has discontinued operations as of June 30<sup>th</sup> and is in the process of liquidating its assets through a bankruptcy filing." The message further directed callers to another extension. The auditor never reached a live person at this number nor at any other numbers listed on the company's website. Attached to this memo is a summary memo from the auditor as well as a print out of the company website and two news articles regarding the company closing and the auction of the company's assets. I am forwarding these items for your information.

On July 17, 2001, an attempt was made to contact company liaison of 2nd Century Communications, for the purpose of performing a review of the 2000 revenues, resulting from Alternative Local Exchange service, used to compute the Regulatory Assessment Fee.

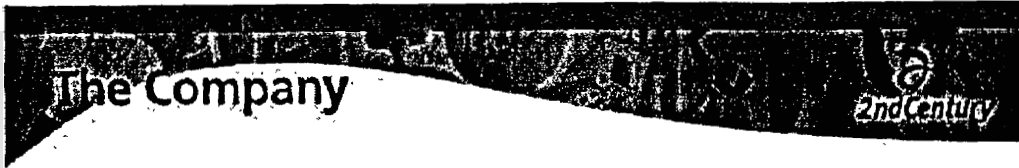
A recording on the telephone number provided (813-935-8866) directed callers to another telephone number - (813-901-1901). A message at the new number informed callers that: "2nd Century has discontinued operations as of June 30th and is in the process of liquidating its assets through a bankruptcy filing. If you have any questions you may dial extension 1612 at this time."

I dialed extension 1612 on three separate occasions but always received the message that 'no one was available to take the call'.

A visit to 2nd Century's web site revealed no current information for 2001 (See Attachment 1). I dialed all telephone numbers for all locations and sales offices but only received busy signals. (See Attachment 2). I have included some information from the web site regarding developments at the company in 2000. (See Attachments 3 and 4).

It appears that the review of the RAF filing for 2nd Century is a moot issue at this point. If you wish for any further investigations into this matter, please let me know.

Two weeks after warning employees that the end was near, 2nd Century Communications Inc. shut its doors Tuesday, putting 121 people out of work.

Eighty-seven employees in Tampa and 34 in four other cities were given pink slips by the telecom company. 2nd Century, which was started in Tampa in 1998 and relocated its headquarters to suburban Washington a year ago, offered local, long-distance and Internet access to businesses. A handful of workers will be retained to maintain services temporarily while customers find new carriers.

Once a fast-rising local success story, 2nd Century ran out of cash after burning through \$175-million in less than three years. While the job losses are just the latest fallout of the economic slowdown, 2nd Century's local workers were better off than the average Tampa Bay area employee: The average salary at the Tampa network operations center was \$65,000 a year.

"It's going to be very difficult for those people to find comparable jobs in this area," said 2nd Century founder Oscar Williams, who left the company in August 1999. "These are highly trained technical people with good skills, and economically, Tampa needs these jobs. But the market is not here."

Williams and three former colleagues at Intermedia Communications Inc. started 2nd Century in 1998 with the idea of replicating Intermedia's infrastructure and service at a lower cost. But Williams and Mike Viren, a co-founder, said major investors pushed the company to move into multiple markets before making a profit in any of them.

"We wanted to grow the company slowly, using revenues gained in one market to open another," said Viren, who left 2nd Century in early 2000. "But the investors said the way to please Wall Street was by having a big base, even though you have a fragile infrastructure. All they were doing was growing the footprint; they were barely able to provide even the basic service."

Last summer, 2nd Century was in 28 markets with 500 employees. In September, the company ran out of money. Sales couldn't match investors' ambition: 2nd Century never had more than 300 customers nationwide.

Joe Tedino, spokesman for the company now based in Rockville, Md., said workers would receive severance pay of up to 12 weeks' earnings.

"The decision to close was very painful to make," he said. "Like many companies, we were faced with trying to raise additional capital, and we were unable to do that."

Viren, who now runs a venture capital company with Williams in Tampa, said he was sorry to see his disastrous predictions come true.

"The four founders still own about one-eighth of the company," he said. "But this is an awful way to say I told you so."

## Auction of 2nd Century Assets

Tampa, FL, June 1, 2001 (The Digest) - To Jim Stapleton, 2nd Century Communications was a furniture salesman's dream.

In just two years, the fast-growing Internet and telephone services company bought nearly \$2-million in high-end chairs and cubicles from him. When company executives met weekly to decide which state to expand into next, he was always there, Krispy Kreme doughnuts in tow.

That, of course, was before the tech bubble burst. At an auction of some of 2nd Century's assets Thursday, Stapleton was reduced to buttonholing buyers and offering to have their used cubicles broken down, shipped and reassembled for a price. He said the failed telecom company still owes Herman Miller Inc. over \$300,000, including his commissions.

"We're not going to see a penny," he grumbled.

About 500 people turned out to pick through the remains of 2nd Century, a one-time local success story that burned through \$175-million of investors' money and won't live to see its third birthday. It was a local version of the clearance sales that have become a near ritual among the dot-coms and tech start-ups of Silicon Valley.

Included in the crowd at 2nd Century's soon-to-be abandoned offices on Woodland Corporate Boulevard were a mix of serious bidders, rubber-neckers, eBay devotees curious about auctions, and flea market fans hoping to find gold where others saw dust.


Al Trujillo, a ponytailed electrician and the vice president of Tamco Electric Inc., and a burly co-worker barrelled through 2nd Century's tony offices in search of what he called "the president's desk."

"When you start bidding against somebody," Trujillo said, "you stare 'em down. Bullets."

Jason Fowler, a 22-year-old student and Visa employee accompanied by his grandmother, hoped to buy a chair, monitor and maybe computer for his home. As an eBay addict, a live auction was an intriguing, if bewildering, new idea. "You really want to see with your hands and your eyes," he said.

Mike and Donna Stoever, who own Mike's Garage in Tampa, hoped to buy equipment that would let customers watch their mechanics live on the Internet. "I just want to spend between 20 percent and 30 percent on the dollar," said Mike, a regular bidder at federal auctions. "Then if I decide I don't want it, I can recoup my money."

Chris Dawes is one of about half a dozen ex-2nd Century employees at the



auction. Some are there mostly to reminisce. But Dawes' new employer, Comworxx, needs infrastructure, and Dawes -- who was responsible for the purchase of nearly all the equipment here and knows what it cost -- is determined to buy it.

Shortly after 10 a.m., the first item being auctioned goes up for sale, and it's not exactly an eye-popper: a Sharp microwave, presumably from 2nd Century's employee kitchen. It sells for \$70.

The auction proceeds in classic onehundred-bidda-doihearone-twentyfive-bidda fashion. Auctioneer Chris Rasmus stands on a file cabinet to be seen above the cubicles, throwing in a joke here or there to enliven the bidding on more than 1,000 chairs, cubicles, laptops, phones, servers, refrigerators, even artwork.

Offering an eight-person speakerphone, he says, "You don't have to use it. Just put it on the table, it looks cool." There are some bargains. Dawes lands a telephone system suitable for a medium-sized office for \$4,500. Co-worker Jim Frissell confides they paid one-third of the list price.

But others find the bidding too rich. Stapleton, the furniture salesman, is dumbfounded to hear that two dozen Herman Miller chairs went for \$300 apiece, about the same price 2nd Century paid for them. Trujillo, the electrician, points out that three printers that sold for \$1,200 apiece are discontinued items and available retail for about \$1,000.

"You can buy 'em cheaper and with a warranty," said Stoever, shaking his head.

Before long, many of those who came just to see the spectacle or had hoped to buy a laptop for \$50 begin heading for the door. "About 60 percent of the people here can't play," said Sherman Bryan, a freelance photographer for an Orlando music magazine. "This is for the big boys."

Bidder Jim Tackenberg, who owns Distinctive Kitchen Appliances of Tampa, can't help thinking about the former 2nd Century employees whose possessions they're fingering.

"They were trying to run a business. They thought they had one," he said. "Bada bing, bada boom."
