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APPLICATION FOR AUTHORITY TO DISCONTINUE SERVICE

Sphera Optical Networks N.A., Inc. ("Sphera" or "Company"), through its undersigned counsel, hereby requests authority to discontinue telecommunications services pursuant to §63.71 of the Rules of the Federal Communications Commission (hereinafter, "FCC" or "Commission") and 47 U.S.C. § 214(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act"). On February 11, 2002, the Company filed for protection under Chapter 11 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code. On May 2, 2002, the U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey ("Bankruptcy Court") approved the immediate transfer of the majority of Sphera's assets and all customer contracts to OnFiber Carrier Services, Inc. ("OnFiber"). As a result, Sphera has no customers at this time and its discontinuance of service will not be unduly disruptive to the present or future public convenience and necessity.

I. Information Pursuant to Section 63.71

Pursuant to Section 63.71 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, Sphera offers the following information:

A. Name and address of carriers

Sphera Optical Networks N.A., Inc. 245 Park Avenue, 24th Floor New York, New York 10167

B. Date of planned service discontinuance

Sphera's customers were transferred to OnFiber as explained above. None of the customers were end user subscribers of local, intraLATA toll or long distance services. Rather, the affected customers were telecommunications service providers or Internet Service Providers.

C. Points of geographic areas of service affected

The areas affected are all locations previously served by Sphera in the states of California, District of Columbia, Florida, Illinois, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Texas, Virginia, and Washington.

D. Brief description of the type of service affected

Sphera provided broadband connectivity services primarily to other carriers and Internet Service Providers over fiber optic networks in major metropolitan areas.

E. Brief description of the dates and methods of notice to all affected customers

Sphera does not have any customers and, therefore, the Company did not provide notice.

F. Non-dominance of the carrier with respect to the service to be discontinued

Sphera is non-dominant with respect to the telecommunications services that it proposes to discontinue.

G. Service

In accordance with Sections 63.71 and 63.90(d) and (e) of the Commission's Rules, Sphera is mailing a copy of this application to the Governor and state utility commission of each of the affected jurisdictions, and to the Special Assistant for

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Telecommunications for the Secretary of Defense, concurrently with the filing of this Application.

II. Conclusion

Sphera hereby states that this termination of service is reasonable, necessary and not unduly disruptive to the present or future public convenience and necessity. Sphera does not currently serve any customers; therefore, the public will not be unduly harmed by Sphera's withdrawal. Moreover, other carriers and ISPs have access to other telecommunications carriers that have the ability to provide these customers with comparable telecommunications services at competitive prices.

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For the foregoing reasons, Sphera respectfully requests, pursuant to Section 214(a) of the Act, 47 U.S.C. § 214(a), and Section 63.71 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, that the Commission approve its Section 63.71 Application to discontinue the provision of U.S. domestic telecommunications services.
