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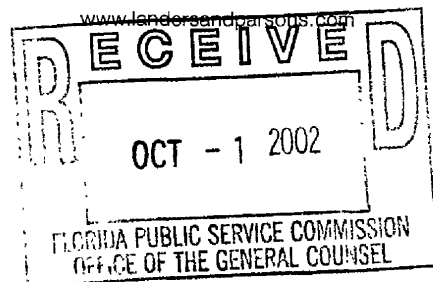

As we discussed this afternoon, with respect to the above-styled dockets, this letter will confirm that Indiantown Gas Company waives its rights (a) to have the Commission act on the Company's petition for approval of the Company's proposed New Tariff within 60 days following the filing of the petition and the Company's New Tariff, (b) to receive within 60 days a written statement of good cause for the Commission's withholding its consent to the implementation of the Company's New Tariff, as would otherwise be required by Section 366.06(3), Florida Statutes, commonly referred to as the "file-and-suspend" law, or (c) to have the Commission act on the petition for approval of the New Tariff within five months as contemplated by Section 366.06(4), Florida Statutes.
