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MS. ECHTERNACT: No, Commissioner. I don't believe there are any preliminary matters related to the prehearing order at this time.

COMMISSIONER PALECKI: Would it be, would it be appropriate to excuse the parties as well as their witnesses from attending the hearing, providing that no other Commissioners have questions on this docket?

MS. ECHTERNACT: Yes. As we have stated in Section VI of the draft prehearing order at the bottom of Page 5, we have requested that witnesses be excused if no other Commissioners have questions for these witnesses.

COMMISSIONER PALECKI: All right. At this time in the 03 docket we'll go ahead and go through the prehearing order. Instead of going through page by page, I'd like to go through one section at a time or actually several sections. Let's go through I through V. Are there any changes, corrections or modifications to those five sections?

Let's move on, hearing no changes to those.

Section VI, the order of witnesses and issues to be addressed.

Any corrections to VI?

Sections VII and VIII on positions of the parties, are there any corrections to any of the issues?

Well, staff, you've done an excellent job on this draft prehearing order.

We'll move on. Exhibits. Section VIV. 1 2 Hearing no changes or corrections, we move on to 3 Section X, proposed stipulations. It's my understanding all of 4 the issues are proposed as stipulated. 5 MS. ECHTERNACT: Yes. That's correct between staff 6 and the companies. I'd like to point out that OPC has taken no 7 position at this time on all of the issues. 8 COMMISSIONER PALECKI: All right. 9 MR. MELSON: Mr. Chairman? 10 COMMISSIONER PALECKI: Yes. Mr. Melson. 11 MR. MELSON: On Issue 5 I notice that there are a couple of different wordings for the language on effective 12 13 date, and I guess I wasn't sure which one was, was the proposed 14 stipulation. City Gas has some different language from staff, but 15 is willing to take the staff's language, if that is intended to 16 17 be the proposed stipulation. COMMISSIONER PALECKI: Staff, was it your impression 18 19 that it was the staff's language or had you even discussed that 20 with Peoples? 21 MS. ECHTERNACT: It was our intent that it was the 22 staff's language, although the wording may have been slightly 23 different by the parties. 24 COMMISSIONER PALECKI: Well, does Peoples Gas have any objection to going with the language as stated in staff's 25

position? 1 2 MR. COSTA: No. sir. 3 COMMISSIONER PALECKI: I'm trying to figure out what the difference -- I guess there is a difference in language 4 that could be interpreted. But hearing that Peoples Gas has no 5 objection, the stipulation will be as set forth on Page 15 of 6 the prehearing order under the staff's position. 7 Are there any pending confidentiality matters? 8 MS. ECHTERNACT: No. there are not. 9 10 COMMISSIONER PALECKI: And with regard to rulings, I've already excused St. Joe and Indiantown from the prehearing 11 12 and hearing in this docket. Is there anything else, any other matters that need 13 14 to be discussed? 15 Hearing none, we will adjourn the prehearing 16 conference in Docket Number 020003.
