RE: Docket No. 030590-TL, BellSouth Telecommunications Inc. (BellSouth) Petition for Expedited Review of a Growth Code Denials by NeuStar for the West Palm Beach Exchange (Riviera Beach, Royal Palm, Lake Worth and Green Acres).

CRB RLT

On July 2, 2003, BellSouth filed a petition requesting that the Commission overturn NeuStar's decision to deny numbering resources in the following switches: Riviera Beach (WPBHFLRB84E), Royal Palm Beach (WPBHFLRPDS0), Lake Worth (WPBHFLLEDS0) and Green Acres (WPBHFLGADS0), all located in the West Palm Beach exchange. Specifically, BellSouth requested a block containing one thousand numbers to provide one hundred consecutive numbers to a customer served by the Riviera Beach switch. Also, a block containing one thousand numbers was requested to provide two hundred consecutive numbers for a customer served by the Lake Worth switch, along with a request for six one-thousand blocks to increase the months to exhaust of the switch to six months. The requests for Green Acres and Royal Palm Beach switches were for a one thousand block and nine one thousand blocks respectively, to increase the months to exhaust of the switches to six months. In accordance with Commission Order PSC-01-1973-PCO-TL (Docket No. 010782-TL) which approved an expedited process for code denials, we have examined the BellSouth petition, along with the confidential supplemental information, and have determined the following:

- 1) The carrier has demonstrated that it has a specific customer in need of immediate numbering resources;
2) The carrier has shown that it will be unable to provide services to the potential customer because of NeuStar's denial of numbering resources; and
3) The potential customers cannot obtain service from the provider of its choice because the carrier does not have numbers available to fulfill the customers' needs.

Since the three required criteria of Order PSC-01-1973-PCO-TL have been met, please prepare an administrative Proposed Agency Action (PAA) Order to be issued within seven business days of this memorandum (July 24, 2003) as outlined in the expedited code denial process order. NeuStar should be directed to provide BellSouth the following numbering resources to meet its customer's needs: Riviera Beach switch - one block to provide 100 consecutive numbers; Lake Worth - one block to provide 200 consecutive numbers and six blocks to increase the months to exhaust to six months; Green Acres switch - one block to increase the months to exhaust of the switch to six months; and Royal Palm Beach - nine blocks, to increase the months to exhaust of the switch to six months. Please be sure that in the order, NeuStar is directed to provide the numbers, not NANPA. If you have any questions, please call Shevie Brown at 413-6638.
