MANAGERIAL AND TECHNICAL CAPABILITY

Philip V Patete, Ph.D. President

Philip Patete is a veteran of the telecommunications industry and has been a successful entrepreneur for the past 17 years. He served as the Chief Technical Officer for Volaris Online and its CLEC subsidiary ALEC, Inc. before purchasing ALEC, Inc. in 2002. In 1995, Dr. Patete founded an ISP in Ohio and then a CLEC in 1998. Both of these companies were sold in 1999 to Voyager.net, a large, public ISP. Dr. Patete joined Voyager.net as the Director of CLEC Services and initiated the sale of Voyager.net to Corecomm (COMM), a New York-based CLEC, in 2000. After the sale, Philip joined Volaris Online/ALEC as their Chief Technical Officer and has been primarily responsible for managing all network and CLEC operations for the company. Due to the dismantling of Volaris, Philip has taken this opportunity to purchase the ALEC, Inc. subsidiary in order to continue to provide competitive telecommunications service to ALEC's customers.

In addition to his telecommunications background, Dr. Patete has taught college level Chemistry and Computer courses. He also holds a Bachelor of Science in Microbiology/Virology and a Ph.D. in Biochemistry from the University of Akron.

Mark Hayes Vice President of CLEC Operations

Mark Hayes has served as Director of CLEC Engineering for Volaris Online/ALEC, Inc. since 1999. Mark has been responsible for the Competitive Local Exchange Carrier (CLEC) department. During his tenure, the CLEC grew from an initial SuperPOP based in Lexington, Kentucky to an eight state regional telecom network focused in the Southeast. Mark was instrumental in developing the "SuperPOP" architecture that today provides data, voice, DSL, Long Distance and Special Access Services on one ubiquitous network.

Prior to joining Volaris Online/ALEC, Mark served 5 years as a Senior Technician and later Operations Manager for one of the nations first alternative local exchange carriers, American Communications Services. With operations in Lexington and Louisville, Kentucky, Mark designed, installed and maintained a Sonet fiber and CLASS 5 Switch Network that encompassed both Metropolitan Service Areas.
