COMES NOW, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and files its Request for Specified Confidential Classification.

- 1. On February 24, 2004, BellSouth filed its response to Staff's Fourth Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 48-81) and Fourth Request for Production of Documents (Nos. 38-39). On this same day, BellSouth filed a Notice of Intent pertaining to the attachments to responses to Interrogatory Nos. 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 69, 72 and 73 which contain confidential information that is proprietary to BellSouth.
- 2. BellSouth hereby files this Request for Specified Confidential Classification because the information contained in the attachments to BellSouth's responses to Interrogatory Nos. 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 69, 72 and 73 contain confidential information that is proprietary to BellSouth, in particular, customer specific information. A more specific description of this information is contained in Attachment A.
- 3. Public disclosure of this information would cause competitive harm to BellSouth and provide competitors with an unfair advantage in future negotiations. The information discussed in Request for Specified Confidential Classification is valuable and BellSouth strives

Therefore, such information should be classified as confidential business information and customer proprietary information pursuant to Section 364.24 and Section 364.183, *Florida Statutes*. Accordingly, it should be held exempt from the public disclosure requirements of Section 119.07, Florida Statutes.

- 4. Attachment A to BellSouth's Request for Confidential Classification contains an explanation of the proprietary information along with a list that identifies the location of the information designated by BellSouth as confidential.
- 5. Attachment B to BellSouth's Request for Confidential Classification is redacted copies of the documents containing the confidential information.
