2. On August 8, 2002, FPL filed with the Commission its Request for Confidential Classification of certain materials obtained during the Audit. FPL's initial filing consists of the Request for Confidential Classification and Exhibits A through D. On September 25, 2002, after discussions with the Commission staff, FPL filed a Revised Exhibit C to replace the Exhibit C filed on August 8, 2002. FPL adopts and incorporates by reference its August 8, 2002 request, including Exhibits A, B, C and D as well as the Revised Exhibit C filed on September 25, 2002.

3. By Order No. PSC-02-1450-CFO-EI dated October 21, 2002, the Commission granted FPL's request.

4. The period of confidential treatment granted by the Commission will soon expire. All highlighted information that was the subject of FPL's August 8, 2002 Request warrants continued treatment as proprietary and confidential business information with the meaning of section 366.093. Attached as Exhibit C hereto is a table containing a line-by-line and page-by-page identification of the information for which continued confidential treatment is sought, and, with regard to each document or portion thereof, reference to the specific statutory basis or bases for the claim of confidentiality and to the affidavits in support of the requested classification. Exhibit C is sometimes referred to hereinafter as the "Revised Justification Table."

5. Included herewith and made a part hereof is Exhibit D. Exhibit D consists of the Affidavits of Robert Onsgard and Rosemary Morley, which Affidavits shall

supplement the Exhibit D previously filed August 8, 2002.

6. FPL submits that such information is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of section 366.093(3). Pursuant to section 366.093, such materials are entitled to confidential treatment and are exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

7. The statutory bases for FPL's assertion of confidentiality with regard to each document or portion thereof are set forth in the Revised Justification Table under the column titled "FLORIDA STATUTE 366.093(3) Subsection." The letters (a) through (f) refer to subsections of section 366.093(3), as applicable. Support for FPL's First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification of the referenced material is provided through the Affidavits of Robert Onsgard and Rosemary Morley. The Revised Justification Table identifies the basis for FPL's assertion of confidentiality with regard to each document or portion thereof.

8. FPL submits that all of the highlighted information in Exhibit A continues to be proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of section 366.093(3). The information for which FPL seeks continued confidential classification consists of customer-specific account information. FPL considers such information to be confidential proprietary business information of the customer within the meaning of section 366.093(3)(e) and does not disclose such information to third parties unless

required by law or unless the customer consents to the disclosure. The Commission in the past has found customer-specific information to be proprietary confidential business information.¹ Finally, the highlighted information also contains internal audit controls or reports or information relating to same. Such information is entitled to protection under section 366.093(3)(b). Support for FPL's request is provided through the Affidavits included as Exhibit D. The statutory bases for FPL's assertion of confidentiality with regard to each document or portion thereof are set forth in the Revised Justification Table.

9. The material for which FPL seeks continued confidential classification is intended to be and is treated by FPL as private and has not been disclosed. Nothing has changed since the issuance of Order No. PSC-02-1450-CFO-EI to render the information stale or public such that continued confidential treatment would not be appropriate.

10. Accordingly, FPL requests that the information identified in the Revised Justification Table and highlighted in Exhibit A to the August 8, 2002 Request for Confidential Classification and referenced in Order No. PSC-02-1450-CFO-EI be accorded



confidential classification for an additional eighteen month period. FPL further requests that the information be returned to FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and affidavits included herewith or incorporated herein by reference, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification be granted.


AFFIDAVIT OF ROBERT ONGSARD

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Robert Onsgard, who, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:



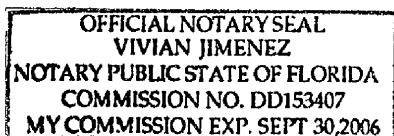


2. I have reviewed Exhibits A and B of FPL's Request for Confidential Classification of Materials Provided Pursuant to Audit No. 02-032-4-1 filed on August 8, 2002 ("FPL's Request for Confidential Classification"). I have also reviewed Exhibit C (the Revised Justification Table) to FPL's First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification Granted by Order No. PSC-02-1450-CFO-EI of Certain Materials Obtained Pursuant to Audit No. 02-032-4-1. With respect to Exhibit C, I have reviewed the documents and information for which I am listed as Affiant and which are included in Exhibit A to FPL's Request for Confidential Classification. With respect to Exhibit C, I have reviewed the documents and information for which I am listed as Affiant which are included in Exhibit A to FPL's Request for Confidential Classification. Such documents or materials that I have reviewed and which, in whole or in part, are asserted by FPL to be proprietary confidential business information, contain or constitute customer-specific account information. Indeed, FPL has a corporate policy not to disclose customer specific information. This policy includes, but is not limited to: customer names, addresses, telephone numbers, account numbers, rates, billing determinants (kW and kWh usage), conservation savings in kW, kWh and bills. FPL treats such information as confidential and does not disclose it, except as required by law, to entities or persons other than the customer without the permission of the customer.

3. FPL's policy is premised upon customers' right to privacy and the potential that the disclosure of customer specific information may harm some customers' competitive interests or disclose their trade secrets. FPL's customers have affirmed to FPL their interest in having this information maintained confidential. For many of these customers, electric usage is an important part of their production or operating costs. Thus, the disclosure of rate or contract information, as well as consumption levels or patterns, could provide competitors with commercially sensitive information that would afford such competitors an unfair advantage. For others, non-disclosure of the information is simply a matter of privacy. While it may be that the disclosure of such information may be more sensitive for some customers than for others, FPL has not sought to make a case-by-case determination as to the level of sensitivity or potential harm with respect to disclosing a particular customer's information; rather, in deference to its customers, as a matter of policy, and in the interest of customer privacy, FPL has not disclosed to third parties specific rate and contract information for customers unless required by law or unless the customer consents to such disclosure. This policy is important from both a practical and theoretical standpoint. Customers want the assurance that their


information is protected to the same extent as any other customer's. Also, practically speaking, it would be a difficult and perhaps impossible task to make a case-by-case determination as to what level of protection each customer's data may merit.

4. FPL has maintained the confidentiality of these documents and materials. The documents or materials continue to be proprietary confidential business information and should be accorded confidential classification by the Commission for an additional eighteen months.
