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FLORIDA WATER SERVICES CORPORATION'S MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION AND CLARIFICATION OF ORDER NO. PSC-04-0532-AS-WS

Florida Water Services Corporation ("Florida Water"), by and through its undersigned counsel, and pursuant to Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code, hereby requests the Florida Public Service Commission ("Commission") to reconsider and clarify Order No. PSC-04-0532-AS-WS ("Order") by correcting what appears to be a scrivener's error on page 5 of the Order. In support of this Motion, Florida Water states as follows:

- 1. The purpose of a motion for reconsideration is to bring to the Commission's attention a point which it overlooked or failed to consider in rendering an initial order. <u>Diamond Cab Company of Miami v. King</u>, 146 So.2d 889, 891 (Fla. 1962); <u>Pingree v. Quaintance</u>, 394 So.2d 161 (Fla. 1st DCA 1981).
- 2. The Order approves a Settlement Agreement, as amended, between Florida Water and Sanlando Utilities Corporation ("Sanlando"). The Settlement Agreement, as amended, resolves overlapping territorial issues between Florida Water and Sanlando and provides for:

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- (a) the deletion of certain territory under Florida Water's water and wastewater certificates for Seminole County;
- (b) the addition and deletion of certain territory for Sanlando's water certificate for Seminole County; and
- (c) the deletion of certain territory from Sanlando's wastewater certificate for Seminole County.
- 2. Under the Settlement Agreement that had been negotiated between Florida Water and Sanlando, prior to the amendment, Sanlando was to delete certain other wastewater territory that was reflected in Exhibit "A" to the Settlement Agreement. After concerns were raised by Staff with that particular provision, Florida Water and Sanlando negotiated and executed the Amendment to the Agreement which deleted Exhibit "A" to the Agreement in its entirety. See Attachment A to Order at page 7 of 8. With the deletion of Exhibit "A" to the Settlement Agreement, the Agreement, as amended, no longer calls for Sanlando to delete that specific wastewater territory described in Exhibit "A".
 - 3. In the Order, at page 5, paragraph 3, the Commission states as follows:

The November 4, 2003 Amendment to Sanlando's Amendment Application states that Sanlando has been providing water service to customers in the proposed extension area and will continue to do so without any changes in connections, interruption, or curtailment of service. The area to be added in Sanlando's territory is in part the same for which Florida Water seeks deletion. Although there are currently no active wastewater customers in the area to be deleted (the customers currently use septic systems), FWSC will be responsible for providing wastewater service to any of those customers who may, in the future, request wastewater service.

Order, at page 5 (emphasis supplied).

Amendment to the Settlement Agreement and appears to be a scrivener's error. The area referenced in that passage of the Order has not been deleted from Sanlando's certificated wastewater territory

The highlighted portion of the Order at page 5 quoted above is inconsistent with the

in Seminole County and it is not part of Florida Water's certificated wastewater territory in Seminole

County. Florida Water has no wastewater facilities in that area and it is not part of Florida Water's

certificate territory under the Settlement Agreement, as amended, approved by the Order. Florida

Water believes that the highlighted passage above from the Order was inadvertently included in the

Order and should be removed from the Order to clarify that Florida Water is not responsible for

providing wastewater service in an area that is not part of Florida Water's certificated territory.

5. The undersigned counsel for Florida Water has conferred with counsel for Sanlando

and is authorized to represent that Sanlando concurs with the relief requested in this Motion.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, Florida Water respectfully requests that the Commission enter an Order on Reconsideration clarifying and correcting the Order by deleting the

last sentence in the third paragraph on page 5 from the Order.
