CITIZENS' RESPONSE TO THE MOTIONS OF BELLSOUTH AND SPRINT FOR OFFICIAL RECOGNITION OF ORDERS

The Citizens of Florida (Citizens) file this response to the motions filed by BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. (BellSouth) and Sprint-Florida, Incorporated (Sprint) on June 10, 2004, for official recognition of orders.

BellSouth offers no explanation why it waited until the date for filing briefs to ask for official recognition of an order issued on February 26, 2004, by the North Carolina Public Utilities Commission. Had BellSouth requested official recognition earlier, all parties -- not just BellSouth -- could have addressed the order in their briefs.

Citizens do not object the official recognition of the orders set forth in the motions filed yesterday by BellSouth and Sprint. Citizens would point out, however, that these orders provide no basis for the Commission to grant a surcharge on customers' rates in the cases pending before this Commission. The orders of the North Carolina Public Utilities Commission do not reflect any issue about their authority under North Carolina law to order surcharges on customer rates. Florida law, on the other hand, does not provide the Florida Commission general authority to order the surcharges set forth in this Commission's proposed agency action orders. The fact that one other state in the country has ordered surcharges to pay for state number pooling trials does not mean

hat Florida Commission has the same authority. Moreover, the North Carolina orders do not reflect any consideration of other rate increases the companies may have implemented there. In Florida, price cap authorized rate increases implemented by BellSouth and Sprint have exceeded number pooling costs by a factor of almost 100. There is no reason for the Commission to grant the companies a one-time surcharge when the companies have already implemented increases far exceeding the number pooling costs. Without meeting the exception to the price cap restrictions contained in Florida law¹, the Commission may not grant the surcharges contained in the Commission's proposed agency action orders.
