<u>Issue 2</u>: Should the Commission approve Progress Energy Florida's Demand-Side Management Plan, including approval for cost recovery?

<u>Recommendation</u>: Yes. The programs contained in PEF's DSM Plan meet the policy objectives of Rule 25-17.001, Florida Administrative Code, and FEECA. The programs are cost-effective and are expected to allow PEF to meet its Commission-prescribed conservation goals.

APPROVED

<u>Issue 3</u>: Should Progress Energy Florida be required to submit detailed program participation standards? <u>Recommendation</u>: Yes. PEF should file program participation standards within 30 days of the issuance of the Consummating Order in this docket. Consistent with past Commission practice, staff should be allowed to administratively approve the program participation standards if they conform to the description of the programs contained in PEF's DSM Plan.



<u>Issue 4</u>: Should this docket be closed?

<u>Recommendation</u>: Yes. If no person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed agency action files a protest within 21 days of the issuance of the order, this docket should be closed upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.
