**BELLSOUTH TELECOMMUNICATIONS, INC.'S  
REQUEST FOR SPECIFIED CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION**

COMES NOW, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and files its Request for Specified Confidential Classification.

1. On August 16, 2004, BellSouth filed its Responses to the Florida Public Service Commission's ("Commission") Request related to the status of local competition in Florida. BellSouth's Response to the Commission's Request, Item No. 1, Tables 1 and 2, produced on a proprietary CD-ROM, contains information that is proprietary to BellSouth.

2. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.06(3)(a), BellSouth hereby files this Request for Specified Confidential Classification because the information contained on the CD-ROMs in BellSouth's Response to the Commission's Request, Item No. 1, Tables 1 and 2, include proprietary data relating to confidential business information utilized by BellSouth to conduct business. A more specific description of this information is contained in Attachment A. Additionally, the disclosure of this information would cause competitive harm to BellSouth and provide competitors with an unfair advantage. Therefore, such information should be classified as confidential, customer proprietary information pursuant to Section 364.24 and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes. Accordingly, it should be held exempt from the public disclosure requirements of Section 119.07, Florida Statutes.
