for Confidentiality of Document No. 04155-04

On April 1, 2004, Gulf Power Company (Gulf) filed its request for confidential classification for Document No. 04155-04. This document is Gulf's Risk Management Plan.

Gulf contends its Risk Management Plan for Fuel Procurement contains proprietary and commercially sensitive information regarding Gulf which if disclosed to the general public would cause irreparable harm to Gulf. On this basis, confidential classification is requested pursuant to section 366.093(3)(a) and (e), Florida Statutes. Specifically, the Risk Management Plan for Fuel Procurement contains, in a single resource, detailed information about Gulf's fuel procurement for the near term and into the future, Gulf Power and other members of the market in which it competes for fuel, fuel transportation and fuel storage consider this type of information to be trade secret and competitively sensitive. This information discusses how Gulf manages its fuel procurement with specific details regarding its fuel needs, market position and trends it sees in those markets in which it addresses its fuel needs. In addition, the strategy employed by Gulf or on its behalf in the procurement of fuel is discussed in detail. Similar information is not made public by other market participants which would give these other market participants an advantage over Gulf in the fuel markets. This would result in a detriment to Gulf's ratepayers as it would prevent Gulf from managing its fuel procurement in a manner that secures the best price and terms for its customers' fuel needs.

	Gulf has requested that the entire 77 page document be confidential. However, the
	appendixes have been included twice making pages 55-76 redundant. Staff has reviewed this
	document and believes there are areas of the plan for which confidentiality should not be
MP	granted. We recommend that Gulf's confidentiality request be approved with the following exceptions. Confidentially should be denied for the portions of the document as detailed below.

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Pages 20 - 22 - Risk Management Policy Pages 23, 24 – SCGEM Risk Management Policy Pages 46, 47, 51, 52, 53, 54, 77

The Information on Pages 1, 2, 11, 13 and 17 is too general and broad to be considered confidential. Additionally, information therein regarding Gulf's generating plants is readily available to the public. The graph on page 18 is available through NYMEX.

Pages 20-22 provide an overview of the structure of Gulf's risk management activities. While objectives and guidelines are included, nothing is revealed regarding Gulf's fuel needs, market position or fuel procurement strategy. This information is neither trade secret nor competively sensitive. Pages 23 and 24 contain the title page and table of contents for the Risk Management Policy neither of which can be called confidential. Pages 46 and 47, 51-54 and page 77 contain a glossary as well as an organizational chart and listing of authorized individuals regarding the risk management activities. These pages provide general information which is not competively sensitive.

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
