

Dear Mr. Bates:

This letter is in response to your April 11, 2003, response to staff's audit. Typically staff does not respond to informational type letters in writing, like this one. Rather, staff incorporates the utility's objections, requests, and points of view into staff's recommendation. However, your April 11, 2003, letter requested a response in writing from staff as well as responses from staff on prior correspondence. We will first address your April 11, 2003, letter.

We will limit our response to those items of which you object to. The first item you objected to was Audit Exception No. 1, which states that the utility did not maintain transitional General Ledgers. You argue that these records exist but were not available to the auditors during the audit investigation. If these records were not provided to our auditors, then the auditors can not verify that they exist or are accurate. Pursuant to Rule 25-30.450, Florida Administrative Code, it is the utility's burden of proof to support its books and records. However, the auditor did not recommend any adjustments relative to this exception.

The second item you objected to was Audit Exception No. 4 regarding the utility's booking of CIAC. The auditors could not verify CIAC due to a lack of records. Your letter argues that the documentation does exist. Again, the auditors cannot verify this information if the documents are not presented to them. The auditors deferred the analysis to the analyst in Tallahassee. At this time we believe that the CIAC collected is materially accurate. However, a final determination will be made after the customer meeting.

The third item noted was Audit Exception No. 7 which the auditor could not verify \$6,509.73 of salaries expense. Your letter states that this was payroll taxes and should have been reclassified. Staff has recalculated payroll taxes based on the recommended salaries for this utility. Both the recommended salaries and adjusted payroll taxes will be discussed in the staff report and recommendation.

The fourth item objected to was Audit Exception No. 9, regarding the treatment of legal and

professional cost associated with the transfer. The utility believes that this cost should be capitalized and amortized over a 3 to 4 year period. The utility also believes that this expense was required. Staff has responded to this prior in a letter to Mr. Deterding dated March 10, 2003, (see attached letter).

The fifth item objected to was Audit Exception No. 12, regarding copies of the insurance policies the utility booked expenses for. Staff also requires copies of insurance policies under the new ownership. Staff will not recommend expenses of this type without verifying that the current owner has policies for the utility. Staff will likely recommend that copies of insurance policies be a condition of the rate increase.

You also objected to several of the Audit Disclosures. The disclosures are informational type items that the auditor has not made an adjustment for but believes should be investigated further. Staff has looked into each of these disclosures. Adjustments related to these disclosures, if any, will be addressed in the staff report.

Regarding all the prior letters received by staff, we have incorporated your request into our staff report, as well as addressing rate case expense by letter as discussed above. We have incorporated the growth projections provided by the utility (March, 11, 2003, letter) into our calculation of service availability charges. Regarding your recent letter addressing used and useful, we are looking into adjusting the calculation based on restricting factors. Our preliminary opinion on this issue will be contained in the staff report.

We did not respond to your letters previously since we incorporate the utility's request and positions into our staff report. The preliminary staff report would either agree with the utility's position or disagree with the utility's position and provide an explanation. The utility would then have an opportunity to respond to staff after reviewing the staff report. Any additional arguments from the utility would be incorporated into the recommendation. The utility would then have another opportunity to make its case at the agenda, if disagreements still exist. If you have any other questions please contact Mr. Ryan Fitch 850-413-6928 and Mr. Tony Sargent 850-413-6968 for accounting matters and Mr. Ted Davis 850-413-6966 for engineering matters.

Service Management Systems, Inc., (SMS or utility) is a Class C water and wastewater utility operating in Brevard County, providing service to approximately 269 customers. On December 11, 2002, SMS filed an application for a staff assisted rate case (SARC).

The area served by the utility is located in southeastern Brevard County, approximately 13 miles south of Melbourne Beach along U.S. Highway A1A. The current case is being processed under the PSC's "Proposed Agency Action" (PAA) procedures. Under the PAA process, the case will not be set for a formal hearing unless a timely protest to the Commission's proposed action is filed.

The utility's records have been audited for compliance with Commission rules and a staff engineer has conducted an investigation of the utility's facilities. In addition, the utility's operational expenses have been reviewed.

On Wednesday, June 18, staff of the PSC will hold a customer meeting to give consumers of SMS, Inc. an opportunity to place into the record of the proceeding specific concerns regarding the utility's quality of service and the utility's responsiveness to service quality issues.

PSC staff has proposed increases for water and wastewater services, based on its review of the utility's records. Under the staff's recommendation, the average monthly bill for a water customer would increase by \$4.06, from \$31.48 to \$35.54. The monthly charge for wastewater would increase by \$4.32, from \$27.75 to \$32.07.

These rates are for informational purposes only and are intended to facilitate discussion at the customer meeting. A final recommendation on rates, which may include information from the customer meeting, will be prepared by PSC staff and filed and available for review on July 24, 2003. The Commission is scheduled to consider staff's recommendation at its August 5, 2003, agenda conference.

This letter is in response to your letter dated June 19, 2003. We would like to take this opportunity to address the eight questions you outlined in your letter. Your first question asks which areas are serviced by Service Management Systems (SMS) by a flat rate, what is the current and proposed flat rate, size of the area, and what facilities are included. Currently only the master homeowner's association (ACSA) is charged a \$661.35 monthly flat rate for service. This flat rate was approved in Order No. PSC-03-0115-TRF-WS, issued January 21, 2003, in Docket No. 021087-WS. This rate was designed to cover an unmetered non-potable irrigation area of approximately 7.86 acres of landscaped entry way and development frontage on U.S. Route 1. This rate was determined by comparing the existing metered irrigation by individual homeowner's associations and applying those gallons to the unmetered irrigation area. Once an estimate for usage was determined, that usage figure was multiplied by the existing non-potable gallonage charge of \$0.56 per thousand gallons. In our preliminary report we are recommending that the unmetered irrigation be metered, and that the flat rate be discontinued. We have included the estimated usage for the common areas as part of our preliminary irrigation rate of \$0.67 per thousand gallons.

Your second question asks how St. Andrew's Village is billed for irrigation in comparison to the other homes, condos, and duplexes in the service area. St. Andrew's is billed by way of a master meter for irrigation service. This is the way the majority of residential irrigation is billed. There are approximately 21 customers who were individual metered for irrigation, all of which reside on Hammock Shore Drive. The remaining irrigation customers are all master metered and are billed through their respective homeowner's associations.

Your third question asks about the imputation of revenues for the common area irrigation. As discussed above, the Commission approved a \$661.35 flat rate for unmetered non-potable irrigation

of approximately 7.86 acres of landscaped entry way and development frontage on U.S. Route 1. We imputed the \$661.35 per month because this is the amount the utility would have been able to collect during a full test year. For the purposes of our preliminary staff report, we designed a gallonage charge for all irrigation customers. We included the estimated gallons from the unmetered common areas that were used to determine the \$661.35 flat rate. We are currently reviewing that estimate with the information we have received in this case.

Your fourth question asks how the golf course is metered and billed, including the size of the area, and current and proposed monthly charges. The golf course has several meters for irrigation, including a meter for irrigation surrounding the club house. The course itself is by far the largest non-potable irrigation user. Based on the information we have, approximately 51% of the total non-potable irrigation is used by the golf course. The gallonage rate for the golf course is the same as the gallonage rate for all non-potable customers. And since the golf course uses approximately half of the non-potable revenues.

Because the golf course is such a large user, other customers benefit by a lower overall irrigation rate. This is because there are more gallons to spread the cost of the non-potable system over. For example if the golf course did not receive service from SMS, the total non-potable gallons would be 51% less and the irrigation rates would be approximately double what they are today. The golf course irrigation percentage above is an estimate. We currently have aggregate gallon information from our auditors. We have requested more detailed information from our auditors so that we can show a detailed allocation of revenues from the golf course. As we discussed at the customer meeting, we will send you a copy of that calculation as soon as it is completed.

Your fifth question asks to compare St. Andrews metered rates, facilities, acreage, and average monthly charges with Aquarina. The preliminary recommended rate for irrigation would be the same for all irrigation customers including Aquarina. As discussed above we are using estimated gallons for the common areas determined in Order No. PSC-03-0115-TRF-WS, issued January 21, 2003, in Docket No. 021087-WS. We are currently reviewing that methodology to determine if there are any material differences that may have occurred since that order. For comparison purposes, we have estimated that the common areas use approximately 1,181 kgal per month. As discussed above we are awaiting detailed billing information from our auditors; however, we do have detailed billing information for November. In November, St. Andrews used approximately 780 kgal (this is similar to the information provided in your letter). A rate comparison at the old rates would be \$661.35 for Aquarina and \$436.80 for St. Andrews, preliminary rates \$791.27 for Aquarina and \$522.60 for St. Andrews.

Your sixth and seventh question ask if the above comparison suggests that the \$661.35 rate be increased or decreased and how would this affect St. Andrews. As discussed above, the flat rate was determined by estimating usage based on a comparison of other irrigation users in the service area. We are reevaluating that estimate to see if it has materially changed since Order No. PSC-03-0115-TRF-WS. If we believe that the average gallons used by the common area should be higher, then the gallonage rate would be lower (more gallons to divide by). If we believe that the average

gallons used by the common area should be lower, then the gallonage rate would be higher (less gallons to divide by).

Your eighth question asks what would be the rate impact if the customers are successful in having the utility rerout its service lines due to an illegal hook up. The Commission sets rates based on investments and expenses that are prudent and reasonable. Correction of an illegal hookup would likely be considered imprudent and unreasonable. Under this assumption only the reasonable cost (the cost that the utility would have incurred had it made a legal connection) would be passed on through rates and or charges.

Hopefully we were able to answer your questions. Please keep in mind that the responses in this letter are based on our preliminary analysis and that we are still gathering information in this case. Also we will send you a copy of a detailed revenue breakdown from the golf course as soon as we receive the information from our auditors. We have also included a copy of Order No. PSC-03-0115-TRF-WS, which sets the existing flat rate. We have obtained the golf course information that you have requested. According to our analysis of the billing register, the golf course consumed 106,436,200 gallons of nonpotable water during the 2002 test year. The total metered non-potable water consumed and billed during the test year was 146,179,620. The golf course used approximately 73% of the total metered non-potable water sold during the 2002 test year. This amount does not include the unmetered common area irrigation.

Our analysis of revenues as of the date of this letter shows total test year non-potable revenues of \$89,797 (which includes the flat rate for common areas). Of this amount, \$59.604 or 66% of the total test year non-potable revenues can be attributed to the golf course.

You also asked us to provide you with the area of the golf course so that you could compare irrigation with St. Andrews. We have estimated that the golf course lies on approximately 72 acres of area for which irrigation is necessary (adjustments were made to remove lakes and other water hazards).

Hopefully this information will assist in addressing your concerns. As previously discussed, our recommendation will contain a breakdown of revenues from the golf course for informational purposes. Also, we are reevaluating the basis on which the non-potable flat rate was constructed such that an estimate for unmetered usage can be accounted for in rates.

At the customer meeting held the afternoon of June 18, 2003, in the above-noted docket, you indicated that you thought Service Management Systems, Inc. (utility), had improperly placed its lines on your property outside of any easement. You further indicated that the utility indicated to you that it had some kind of general easement to place the lines where it did, but that it never provided any documentation.

In a complaint, Complaint # 00930, involving a similar situation, staff counsel wrote:

The PSC does not have the authority to determine whether or not Breeze Hill Utilities has a proper utility easement or prescriptive rights to your property. The determination of property rights is a judicial function within the jurisdiction of the Circuit Court, pursuant to the Florida Constitution, Article V, Section 5(b).

This letter represents an informal opinion and is non-binding on the Commission. If you disagree with this opinion, you can request an informal conference, pursuant to Rule 25-22.032(8). Florida Administrative Code. The request must be in writing and filed with the Commission's Division of Consumer Affairs within thirty (30) days from the date of this letter.

- 1. Provide written proof in the form of a recorded easement showing your true authority with regard to St. Andrew's Village. (Be advised - A written reply with assertions alone will not do.)
- 2. In the absence of legally written proof please provide a plan to remove the offending hook-ups from St. Andrew's Property within 30 days.
- 3. Take no future action to trespass on St. Andrew's Property. To service properties within our association boundaries, you must recognize that it will require both proper written request/notice to our association, and proper written consent from our Home Owner's Association.
