- 1. A bar date for the assertion of post-petition claims assertable as administrative expenses under 11 U.S.C. § 503 is hereby established for 30 calendar days after StarNet gives notice by United States Mail to all known entities transacting business with the Debtor in Possession or who have made known to StarNet actual or potential post-petition claim.
- 2. Such notice shall be sent by February 4, 2005, and a certificate of service filed promptly, thereafter with this Court.

- 3. The foregoing bar date does not apply to professionals seeking compensation under 11 U.S.C. § 327 who are subject to review and allowance of fees under 11 U.S.C. § 330.
- 4. Parties failing to assert claims within the bar date set may have their claims disallowed, subordinated or otherwise prejudiced.
 - 5. The Court reserves jurisdiction to construe and enforce this order.
