DEBTORS' MOTION TO EXTEND EXCLUSIVITY PERIOD

COME NOW, EPICUS COMMUNICATIONS GROUP, INC. and EPICUS, INC., the Debtors-in-Possession ("Debtors"), by and through undersigned counsel, and move the Court for the entry of an Order extending the exclusive period within which only the Debtor may propose a Plan, and within which only the Debtor may solicit acceptances to his Plan, and in support thereof states as follows:

1. On October 25, 2004, the Debtors initiated separate voluntary petitions under Chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United States Code in this Court.
2. The Debtors have been operating their affairs and managing their business as a Debtors-in-possession pursuant to the authority of 11 U.S.C. §§1107 and 1108.

3. Pursuant to § 1121 of the Bankruptcy Code, only the Debtor may propose a Plan within the first 120 days following the entry of the Order for Relief. The Debtors' exclusivity period is due to expire on February 22, 2005.

4. Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 1121(d), the Court, after notice and hearing, may increase

the 120 day period within which only the Debtor may file a Plan and the 180 day period within which only the Debtor may solicit acceptances to the Plan.

5. The Debtors' are in the process of negotiating a consensual Plan with various creditor bodies. The Plan is being negotiated contemplates a cash infusion from one creditor body. The Debtors are telecommunications carriers and collect revenues from end users in all States throughout the United States, and are responsible for paying various taxes to those states. The deadline for governmental agencies to file claims is April 25, 2005 and the Debtors would request that the Court extend exclusivity until such time as all governmental agencies have had an opportunity to file a claim so that the Debtors and creditors are fully aware of all claims asserted against the estate and in a position to make an informed analysis as to the feasibility of any proposed plan. Accordingly, the Debtors respectfully submit that an extension of the exclusive period of sixty- five (65) days is appropriate.

6. The Debtors respectfully submits that the granting of this extension will not prejudice the rights of any creditor or any party in interest and submits that this motion is made in good faith and not for the purposes of delay. No previous extensions have been requested.

WHEREFORE, the Debtors respectfully request the entry of an Order extending the time within which only the Debtors may file a Plan and the time within which only the Debtors may solicit acceptances of the Plan, by sixty-five (65) days to April 30, 2005, as well as granting any other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.


