<u>Recommendation</u>: Yes. Prima facie evidence of meter tampering noted in FPL's reports demonstrates that meter tampering occurred. Therefore, the customer of record, Mr. Rodriguez, should be held responsible for a reasonable amount of backbilling.

<u>Issue 2</u>: Is FPL's calculation of the backbilled amount of \$8,376.61, which includes investigative charges of \$261.03, reasonable?

<u>Recommendation</u>: Yes. The backbilled amount of \$8,376.61 is a reasonable approximation of the unbilled energy plus investigative costs. The customer should be encouraged to contact FPL immediately to make payment arrangements for this amount in order to have his service restored.

Issue 3: Should this docket be closed?
