Mergers

The telecommunications marketplace continues to experience many financial challenges, some of which are related to an oversupply of facilities. Level 3 does anticipate a certain amount of consolidation in the industry to continue to address the oversupply of the facilities.

b. What effects do you believe these mergers (if approved) will have on local competition in Florida?

Eliminating MCI and AT&T from markets hampered by a lack of competitive alternatives and high prices increases the risk of anti-competitive conduct and above-market pricing by the dominant provider. In order to ensure effective competition, Level 3 believes that divestiture of in-region overlapping network assets is required in order to preserve existing competitive balance

c. Has your local competition strategy changed as a result of the merger announcements? If so, please explain how.

No. Although Level 3 is concerned that the increased control over the lastmile facilities may threaten the ability of competitive providers to offer their services. Over-the-top VoIP providers for example may be squeezed out by the monopoly facilities based providers.

d. How will these mergers (if approved) affect your local competition strategy in Florida?

Level 3 will continue to advocate for a regulatory regime that allows for a robust competitive marketplace.

12. Have you experienced any significant barriers in entering Florida's local exchange markets? Please list and describe any major obstacles or barriers encountered that you believe may be impeding the growth of local competition in the state, along with any suggestions as to how to remove such obstacles.

The single largest barrier that can be erected to prevent effective competition in Florida is the refusal by an Incumbent LEC to interconnect its network on fair, reasonable and nondiscriminatory terms. Because the majority of ILECs continue to enjoy an effective monopoly of the telecommunications market and the facilities that reach the majority of the market, they continue to be able to wield monopoly power in interconnection negotiations and arbitrations. Without regulatory oversight that enforces the ability to exchange traffic on fair, reasonable and nondiscriminatory terms, competitors are at a distinct and perhaps insurmountable disadvantage. If competitive providers cannot offer the ability to reach consumers on the PSTN in an economically rational fashion, their

service offerings will flounder.
