US LEC of Florida Inc. ("US LEC") and the Southeastern Competitive Carriers Association ("SECCA") generally support the response of the Competitive Carriers of the Southeast (CompSouth) to BellSouth's Motion for Summary Final Order or Declaratory Ruling and Cross-Motion for Summary Final Order or Declaratory Ruling filed July 22, 2005 ("Response").

US LEC and SECCA do not object to the withdrawal of the issues delineated in the Response;<sup>1</sup> however, the Commission should be aware that numerous issues, including Issue 6, are the subject of a motion for reconsideration filed by a number of CLECs, including US LEC, in *the Matter of Unbundled Access to Network Elements/Review of Section 251 Unbundling Obligations of Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers*, WC Docket No. 04-313/CC Docket No. 01-338 (the "TRRO Docket"). There is also a pending forbearance petition filed in the TRRO Docket, and the FCC is seeking comments on the petition no later than September 12, 2005.
