2	CHAIRMAN BAEZ: At this point we will call the
3	technical hearing to order.
4	Counsel, will you read the notice.
5	MS. BRUBAKER: Pursuant to notice, this time and
6	place has been set for the purpose of conducting a technical
7	hearing in Docket 050078-EI. The purpose of the hearing is set
8	forth more fully in the notice.
9	Chairman, if I may ask, in order to allow staff
10	adequate facility to microphones, since I understand a lot
11	questions will be asked of staff, if we could set up as we did
12	similarly in the FPL hearing where staff has access to the bank
13	of microphones to my left, I suppose, and we will leave some
14	areas available for the parties to speak.
15	CHAIRMAN BAEZ: And what I want to do is let's go
16	through the steps of taking appearances of everyone.
17	MS. BRUBAKER: My apologies. Certainly.
18	CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Let's get the joint stipulation
19	motion before us properly with comments from the parties, and
20	then we are going to take two brief seconds because then we
21	will have moved on my understanding, we will have moved on
22	to another phase in our consideration, and that is when we can
23	get you all sitting down where you need to be in order to
24	answer questions from the staff. So at this point we will take
25	appearances, once again.

1	Mr. Glenn.	
2	MR. GLENN: Alex Glenn on behalf of Progress Energy	
3	Florida. And with me is Michael Walls, John Burnett, and	
4	Dianne Triplett with the law firm of Carlton Fields.	
5	MR. KISE: Christopher Kise, Solicitor General, on	
6	behalf of Attorney General Charlie Crist.	
7	MR. SHREVE: Jack Shreve on behalf of Attorney	
8	General Charlie Crist.	
9	MR. McLEAN: Harold McLean, Public Counsel, on behalf	
10	of the Citizens of the State of Florida. With me this morning,	
11	Joe McGlothlin and Patty Christensen.	
12	MR. WRIGHT: Robert Scheffel Wright appearing on	
13	behalf of the Florida Retail Federation.	
14	MR. BUSHEE: James Bushee on behalf of White Springs.

22	intervenors and parties? Is there anyone else that needs to	
23	enter an appearance?

Felicia Banks, and Marlene Stern on behalf of the Commission. CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Thank you.

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Ms. Brubaker, do we have any preliminary matters at this point?

5 There is a preliminary matter with MS. BRUBAKER: regard to prefiled testimony and prefiled exhibits, testimony 6 and exhibits. There is a staff composite exhibit, and there 7 are MFRs. Similar to the FPL hearing that was held recently, I 8 9 would request that those items be identified for the record and 10 moved into the record provided, of course, there is no objection. I would also point out the comprehensive exhibit 11 list that has been distributed to the parties prior and also 12 13 provided to the Commissioners.

14 My recommendation is that the exhibits listed there 15 be numbered as listed. And the MFRs are not explicitly 16 mentioned on this list, but they would follow the numbering of 17 the list would be my recommendation.

18 CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Very well. Is there any objection to 19 Staff Counsel's suggestion?

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MR. GLENN: No objection.

CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Mr. Glenn, thank you. Then, without objection, let the record show that the exhibit provided by Staff titled "Comprehensive Exhibit List" will be numbered Exhibit 1. Without objection, it will be moved into the record. And as contained in Exhibit 1, all other stipulated

1 exhibits and also testimony exhibits contained therein numbered sequentially 2 through 221 will also be admitted into the 2 record. And the exhibits comprising the minimum filing 3 requirements as provided by the petitioner will also similarly 4 5 be moved into the record without objection and numbered 6 sequentially thereafter. (Exhibits 1 through 221 marked for identification and 7 8 admitted into the record.) (Exhibit 222 marked for identification and admitted 9 into the record.) 10 MS. BRUBAKER: And, also, just for clarification, the 11 12 prefiled direct and rebuttal testimony of all parties and staff. 13 CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Without objection, the prefiled and 14 direct testimony filed in the case will also be moved into the 15 16 record as though read. Does that take care of everything? MS. BRUBAKER: It does. 17 18 CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Okay. And I will trust staff to 19 properly number the MFR exhibits sequentially as we have instructed. Okay. Very well. 20 (REPORTER NOTE: For the convenience of the record, 21 22 the prefiled testimony was inserted after the statements of the 23 parties.) 24 CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Now, we can hear from the parties. 25 Mr. Glenn, would you like to --

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MR. GLENN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

I wanted to first recognize all of the parties and 2 their efforts in coming to this settlement. It was, as I'm 3 sure you know, a lot of long hours. In particular, I would 4 5 like to thank the Attorney General, and Chris Kise and Jack 6 Shreve, in particular, for their yeoman work in really, as I'm 7 sure you're going to hear, herding cats. It was a long drawn-out process, but one that I think ultimately reached a 8 conclusion that benefits all parties, the company as well as 9 our customers. 10

I also wanted to thank Mr. McLean. Harold McLean did an outstanding job representing the Citizens of the State of Florida and in getting this settlement to a reasonable conclusion. And I also want to thank the other intervenors who worked in such a professional manner throughout the process. I think this is a good settlement, and we would ask that the Commission approve it.

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Thank you.

19 CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Mr. Glenn, thank you.

20 Mr. Kise.

21 MR. KISE: Mr. Chairman, I'm happy to be here and to 22 let you know that the cats have, in fact, been herded. And 23 we're very pleased with this agreement. On behalf of the 24 Attorney General, I really would like to thank Jack Shreve, 25 Harold McLean, Schef Wright, Jim Bushee, Alan Jenkins, John

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McWhirter, even though he is not here, Tim Perry. It was a 1 difficult process and would not have been possible without the 2 cooperation of Vinnie Dolan and Paul Lewis and Alex Glenn at 3 Progress who were willing to work very long hours. 4 5 We are pleased to present this to you and request, 6 respectfully, that you approve this agreement, which we believe 7 is in the interest of the people of Florida. CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Thank you, Mr. Kise. 8 Mr. Shreve, any words? 9 10 MR. SHREVE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 11 I would like to echo everything that Mr. Kise has 12 said and all of the parties. It was a tough negotiation, but I 13 think it has come out and will be a big benefit to the people 14 of the state of Florida. 15 In addition to thanking all the parties, I would like 16 to say that this could not have been possible without the case 17 that Harold McLean, the Office of the Public Counsel, put on. It has been a pleasure. 18 19 Thank you. 20 Mr. McLean. 21 CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Thank you, Mr. Shreve. 22 Mr. McLean. 23 MR. McLEAN: Mr. Chairman, I would like to put a 24 salute to each name that has been mentioned, especially Charlie 25 Crist and his man, Chris Kise. There were many times when we

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would have been dead in the water but for the personal skills, 1 charisma of our Solicitor General. And he kept the ball 2 rolling when it otherwise might have fallen in a hole, or 3 something like that. And thanks to the Florida Legislature for 4 giving me the resources to be able to put on a quality case 5 that gave strength to the intervenor's side, and eventually 6 7 lead to what I believe is a win/win situation. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 8 CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Thank you, Mr. McLean. 9 Mr. Wright. 10 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Like everybody MR. WRIGHT: 11 else, I would urge you to approve this settlement. It fairly 12 balances the interest of the utility and the customers and it 13 is in the public interest. It's a good deal. I also would 14like to especially thank the folks at Progress; Alex, Vinnie, 15 16 Mike Walls, the rest of the attorneys, and Javier Portuondo, 17 who probably worked as hard as anybody in this whole process. 18 And, likewise, the Attorney General, Attorney General Crist himself for his personal involvement, and Chris Kise and Jack 19 20 Shreve. And as everybody else has said, without them the wheels probably would have fallen off the train and things 21 would have gotten messed up. 22

Likewise, I would like to thank Harold and the Florida Legislature, as he did, for the very excellent case that he put together, without which I think our side would have

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1	been hard pressed to get as good a settlement as we did, the
2	rest of the intervenors, and your Staff, and you all. Thank
3	you. Please approve the settlement.
4	CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Thank you, Mr. Wright.
5	Mr. Bushee.
6	MR. BUSHEE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I would also
7	echo the sentiments that you have already heard about the hard
8	work by all the parties. I would commend the Attorney
9	General's Office, Progress, as well as all of the intervenors.
10	There was a lot of hard work and professionalism that resulted
11	in what is a fair and reasonable settlement, and I urge the
12	Commission to approve it.
13	CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Thank you, sir.
14	Mr. Jenkins.
15	MR. JENKINS: The Commercial customers, like everyone
16	else, appreciate rate stability. It gives them an opportunity
17	to plan their operations and their budgets for years to come.
18	And that is an important fact in planning new buildings and
19	continuing to grow one of the faster growing segments of the
20	Florida economy, and we would urge your approval of the
21	settlement. Thank you.
22	CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Mr. Perry.
23	MR. PERRY: I would like to echo the comments of
24	those before me and recognize the hard work of both the company
25	and the intervenors in this case to work towards the settlement

which we think is a very fair and good one. We would ask that you approve the settlement. Thank you.

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CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Mr. Twomey.

MR. TWOMEY: Mr. Chairman, Commissioners, good 4 The settlement wouldn't have been possible if the 5 morning. intervenors had not prepared well for hearing, as is typically 6 the case in any negotiations. I think chief amongst the 7 intervenors, the Office of Public Counsel, Harold McLean and 8 9 his fine staff, deserve special note in terms of their preparedness to go to hearing and push the company to settle. 10 As those have said, the Attorney General's office did yeomen's 11 We probably wouldn't have a settlement without their 12 work. participation and leadership. The company was reasonable, I 13 think, at every turn, and they deserve to be recognized as 14 well. As the others have said, the settlement, we believe, is 15 not only good for the customers, it's good for the utility as 16 well, and AARP would urge you to accept it. 17

18 CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Thank you. Someone was leaning19 forward. Mr. Kise, you were?

20 MR. KISE: I didn't see Mr. Twomey down there, and I 21 didn't want my silence in thanking him to be taken as anything 22 other than a mistake on my part. I also would like to thank 23 Mr. Twomey because during the course of the negotiations there 24 were certain bouts of tenacity which really helped propel the 25 process forward. So I want to thank him, as well. I just

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didn't see him down there.

CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Well, it is good you said that,
because here I was confirming all sorts of suspicions as to Mr.
Twomey's participation in this. But, nevermind.

MR. McLEAN: Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Mr. McLean.

MR. McLEAN: 7 I, too, am extremely remiss in failing 8 to mention Joe McGlothlin, Patty Christensen, Earl Poucher, and 9 Tricia Merchant and our excellent support staff over at Public 10 Counsel who worked tirelessly for many hours, including 11 weekends, to put this case together, upon which the intervenors 12 were able to rely. So my special thanks goes out to my own 13 staff who worked somewhat out of the public eye and very 14 tirelessly. Thank you.

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CHAIRMAN BAEZ: Thank you, Mr. McLean.

16 At this point what I would like to do is we are going 17 to go ahead and move in, I know that the Commissioners may have 18 some questions and certainly staff has prepared some 19 clarifications and some comments, along with a recommendation 20 to this. So I want to thank you all for your comments. Thank 21 you all for your hard work at this point. And if you would 22 kindly take a back seat now to the stars of the show for today, anyway, and let's let our staff get in here so we can have some 23 questions answered. Thank you all, gentlemen. 24
