COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: I'd like to call this prehearing conference to order. We're going to start with Docket 01, fuel and purchased power cost recovery clause and generating performance incentive factor. Could I have the notice read, please.

MS. BROWN: By notice issued September 28th, 2005, this time and place was set for a prehearing conference in the following dockets: 050001-EI, fuel and purchased power; 050002-EG, energy conservation cost recovery; 050003-GU, purchased gas adjustment; 050004-GU, natural gas conservation; and 050007-EI, environmental cost recovery clause. The purpose of the prehearing conference is set out in the notice.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Thank you. Let's take appearances. As I stated, we're on Docket 01. Staff, we're taking appearances for 01. Are we taking appearances for all, from all parties to all of today's dockets? Well, my question is this, are we just taking it for 01 or are we taking appearances for all the dockets?

MS. BROWN: I would suggest we take appearances for all the dockets at this time; just go down the list and everyone could say what dockets they're involved in.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Good. What I'm going to do is ask -- I'll start with the company and the representative that I have listed on the script here. We'll

start with Progress Energy, Gary Perko.

MR. PERKO: Good morning, Commissioner. Gary Perko on behalf of Progress Energy Florida in Dockets 050001, 050002 and 050007.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Thank you. Florida Power & Light, John Butler and Wade Litchfield.

MR. BUTLER: Good morning. Yes. This is John
Butler, and I would enter an appearance also. Excuse me. I'm
appearing in Dockets 01 and 07. I'd enter an appearance for
Wade Litchfield in Dockets 01, 02 and 07 and Natalie Smith in
Docket 02; is that correct? Yes. Docket 02. Thank you.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Thank you. Gulf Power,
Jeff Stone.

MR. STONE: Commissioner, I'm Jeffrey A. Stone, and I'm entering an appearance on behalf of myself and Russell Badders and Steven Griffin, and we'll be representing Gulf Power Company in the 0001 docket, the 0002 docket and the 0007 docket.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Thank you. Tampa Electric Company, Mr. Jim Beasley and Lee Willis.

MR. BEASLEY: Yes, Commissioner. James D. Beasley appearing with Lee L. Willis, and we're representing Tampa Electric in the 01, 02 and 07 dockets.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Thank you. Florida Public
Utilities Company, Doc Horton.

8	and we are appearing in Dockets 01, 02 and 07.
9	COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Thank you. Office of Public
10	Counsel, Patty Christensen and Joe McGlothlin.
11	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Patty Christensen on behalf of the
12	Office of Public Counsel. Appearing with me also is Joe

7	MS. BROWN: Commissioner, I'm Martha Carter Brown			
8	appearing on behalf of the Commission in the 02, 03 and			
9	04 dockets. And I'd like to enter an appearance for Katherine			
10	Fleming in the 03 docket.			
11	Also, I think there are some gas companies who need			
12	to make an appearance in those dockets as well.			
13	COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Who did we miss? Wher			
14	are the gas companies? I'm sorry. Would you state your name			
15	and the dockets that you're appearing in. I'm sorry.			
16	MR. WATSON: That's all right. I'm Ansley Watson,			
17	Jr., of MacFarlane, Ferguson & McMullen, and also entering an			
18	appearance for Matthew R. Costa of TECO Energy in the 03 and			
19	04 dockets.			
20	COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Thank you.			
21	MR. RANGE: Thomas Range making an appearance for			
22	myself and on behalf of Bill Bryant, and we're representing			
23	Florida City Gas in the 03 and 04 dockets.			
24	COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Did I overlook anyone			
25	else?			

1	MR. SCHIEFELBEIN: Pardon me, Commissioner. Over				
2	here. Good morning. I'm Wayne Schiefelbein, Rose, Sundstrom &				
3	Bentley, appearing on behalf of Chesapeake Utilities				
4	Corporation, thank you, in the 04 docket only.				
5	MAJOR PAULSON: Good morning, Commissioner. Major				
6	Craig Paulson representing the Federal Executive Agencies in				
7	Docket 01. And I'd also like to enter an appearance for				
8	Lieutenant Colonel Karen White in the same docket. Thank you.				
9	COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Thank you. Staff.				
10	MS. BROWN: Commissioner, at this time perhaps I				
11	should remind everyone that St. Joe Natural Gas Company has				
12	been excused from making an appearance at this prehearing				
13	conference and in the hearing for the 03 and 04 dockets. You				
14	issued a letter to that effect last week.				
15	COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Yes, I sure did.				
16	Are there any other preliminary matters to be				
17	addressed?				
18	MS. BROWN: I'm not aware of any.				
19	Commissioner, we suggest that you take these dockets				
20	in reverse order; take the least complex docket first and then				
21	follow through to 01 at the end. So that would be 03, 04,				
22	02 and 07 and then 01.				
23	COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Just a minute. Give me				
24	that order again, please. 02?				

MS. BROWN: 03, 04, 02.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Wait just a minute. 03, one; 1 2 04; two? MS. BROWN: Yes. 02, three; 07, four; and 01, five. 3 COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Okay. Let's begin with 4 Okay. We're now on Docket 03, and this docket deals with 5 the purchased gas adjustment. Are there any preliminary 6 matters by any of the parties? None? 7 Let's proceed through the draft prehearing order. 8 there are any questions, clarifications or changes, please let 9 me know at the appropriate time. 10 Let's start with Sections I through IV. 11 MS. BROWN: Commissioner Bradley, if I might just 12 interrupt for a second. 13 COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Yes, ma'am. 14 MS. BROWN: It appears to us that this docket is 15 stipulated. There are no outstanding issues. I just wanted to 16 point that out to everyone. We all agree on the numbers, and 17 it should be easy at the hearing. 18 COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Okay. Well, well, 19 let's just go down through section -- go through this, this 20 issue, docketed matter section by section and we'll, we 21 understand very clearly that it has been stipulated. But just 22 for the record let's go through it. 23 Section V, posthearing procedures, stipulated. 24

MS. BROWN: Yes, Commissioner.

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COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Section VI, prefiled testimony 1 and exhibits, stipulated. 2 MS. BROWN: Yes, Commissioner. 3 4 COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Section VII, order of 5 witnesses, stipulated. 6 MS. BROWN: Correct. 7 COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Section VIII, basic positions, 8 stipulated. 9 Section IX, issues and positions, stipulated. Section X, exhibit list, stipulated. 10 Section XI, stipulated. 11 Section XII, stipulated. 12 13 Section XIII, stipulated. 14 Section XIV, rulings, stipulated. Staff, are there 15 any other rulings that need to be included in this section? 16 MS. BROWN: Commissioner, I would just mention that 17 since the testimony and exhibits will be stipulated into the 18 record, the witnesses can be excused for the hearing, if no 19 other Commissioners on the panel have any questions for them. And I intend to, once we get the prehearing order finalized, I 20 21 will take it to them and ask the Commissioners if they have any questions, and then I'll inform the parties by the 2nd of 22 November whether they can be excused. 23 24 COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. And there is one other 25 ruling I'm going to make as it relates to opening statements.

Opening statements --

MS. BROWN: It's likely that we won't need them for this docket, but we would suggest ten minutes if we do. That's a standard.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Okay. Just in case. Are there any other matters to come before the prehearing officer at this time?

MR. WATSON: Yes. Commissioner Bradley, might I ask that in the event all of the witnesses are excused, that counsel in this docket also be excused from appearing?

MS. BROWN: We, we have no problem with that, except for, especially for out-of-town attorneys in order to save money for their clients. It's probably a good idea to have somebody here in case something comes up at the hearing.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: It's probably a good idea.

MR. WATSON: If there are going to be no witnesses and no questions, I'll probably feel safe staying at home, but would like leave from the prehearing officer to do so.

COMMISSIONER BRADLEY: Well, I think that it might be a good idea if, if you would be here just in case, just in case. But I heard what staff advised and I heard your request, but I think that it might be a good idea to be here just in case. I guess that's not a very, that's not a very clear ruling though, is it?
